A WALK ALONG THE MIDDLE PRONG OF THE LITTLE RIVER

The following is an enjoyable description of a great walk/ hike/ stroll along the Middle Prong of the Little River in the Smokey Mountains. The trail head is at the end of the road passed Tremont Institute. It is about 4 miles from the trailhead to Indian Flat Falls.

It offers a different opportunity for exploration of this area and can be as long or as short as you want it to be.

Interesting History lurks in abundance along this lovely woodland path. By starting on the metal bridge at the trailhead, and look just upstream, part of a water-powered dynamo that supplied electricity to a hotel that operated nearby in the 1920s and '30s is still visible. The book "Dorie: Woman of the mountains" provides a colorful account of what it was like in the logging town that once tried to survive here.

The entire trail lies along an old railroad bed that was used for hauling thousands of logs out of the mountains. The name itself is slightly misleading as it lies entirely along Lynn Camp Prong, which, together with Thunderhead Prong, forms the Middle Prong of the Little River further downstream. The ridge separating the two tributaries is named for Anne Davis, who helped inspire the park movement along with her husband Willis.

Roughly a quarter-mile past picturesque Lynn Camp Prong Cascades is a beautiful place to rest on the log and enjoy the flowing water of the beautiful Cascades. Even if you just walk up to here and enjoy a snack or lunch and enjoy the Cascades it is very enjoyable. A railroad trestle once stretched across the river here providing access to timber along Marks Creek. A section

of American chestnut log, which helped support the trestle, can be spotted in the stream bank. A splash dam once stood in this area.

About two miles from the trailhead is a Rusting Cadillac off the main path found by following an easily visible spur trail that leads off to right of the main trail. Other historic sites along here include tiered mountainside bunkhouses that once housed 172 men. A stone chimney, smashed by a wind-thrown tree reveals the location of the former dining hall. Another small brick chimney, also part of the CCC camp, stands on the opposite side of the trail.

The trail eventually crosses Indian Flats Prong on the flatbed bridge and winds steeply uphill. Look carefully on your right for the remains of a railroad trestle constructed from American chestnut. After the second switchback, a narrow rocky spur trail leads to hidden Indian Flats Falls. A perfect place for lunch. This is one of my favorite hikes in the Smokies.
