## **Friendship Force Knoxville**

Board Meeting October 24, 2018

#### **Present:**

Diana called the meeting to order at 11:35 a.m. Meeting location was the Egg and I in Bearden.

## Secretary's Report

Minutes of the September 12, 2018 meeting were approved.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Ray passed out the Treasurer's Report which included the Operating Account from January 1, 2018 through September 30, 2018, and the Cash Balance Account for 2018.

Bruce presented the Proposed Budget for 2019 which was approved by the Board. Also distributed was a Dues and Membership Renewal Form.

Several changes were made to the Policies and Procedures Manual including the following:

- Section 2 #2 Annual dues shall be \$40.00 per person.
- Section 2 #3 All new members will pay an additional \$15.00 for their name badge regardless of when they join.
- Section 3 The Exchange Committee will now be called the Journey Committee and numerous mentions of 'exchanges' were changed to 'journey' throughout the document.

These changes were approved by the Board.

#### **Journeys**

Ron reported that all is well with the upcoming Journey to La Serena, Chile.

Jayne provided details for the inbound Cape of Good Hope Journey. Each visiting ambassador will pay \$200.00 plus the FFI fee and transportation from North Carolina. To date eight home hosts have been secured. The Welcome Dinner will be held at TVUUC on June 24, 2019. The Farewell Dinner will be held at Calhoun's Restaurant in a reserved room. The cost for our members will be \$30.00 per person which will include dinner, entertainment, and tip. It was suggested that the itinerary be printed in the January or March Newsletter.

Diana reported that she has not been able to find a Journey Coordinator for the Napa/Sonoma Inbound Journey for 2019. If no one will agree to lead this journey it will be cancelled.

Gus and Annalisa Roehrig have agreed to be Journey Coordinators for the outbound trip to Des Moines, Iowa, in August 2019.

The Board agreed to respond to FFI with our journey requests for 2020. They are (1) Romania, (2) Australia/New Zealand, (3) Colombia.

#### **Programs**

Janis reported that the speaker for the October 30, 2018 meeting will be Ana Luisa who will discuss Chile.

The Holiday Party will be in December. Carolyn Dougall will present a program on the Orkney and Shetland Islands at the January 15, 2019 meeting.

#### **Activities**

Sandy reported on the Holiday Party which will be held on December 1, 2018 at 12:00 p.m. at TVUUC. She also suggested that we

contact BRIDGE Refuge Services to see how we might help during the holiday period.

#### **Communications**

A calendar for next year was drafted including the following meeting dates:
January 15th, February 19th, March 19th, April 16th, May 21st, September 17th, October 15th, November 19th, and the Holiday Party in December. Regular evening meetings will be held in January, March, and May, while other activities during the day will be planned for the other months. Several suggestions were made for programs including one on hosting, the Chinese Auction, and a report on the Chile journey.

There is still a need for a photographer, videographer, and Napa Valley Coordinator. Ray will prepare sign-up sheets for the general meeting.

Jeana Johnson and Jonathan Hash have agreed to serve as Historians. Jonathan is accumulating newspaper articles, letters, pictures, programs, and any other information about our club.

Joanne Schuetz requested that the board approve a donation to help fund a mission and her participation with the Presbyterian Women on a USA Mission to the Finger Lakes Region of New York State. The

board did not think the club should support any denominational activity since Friendship force is a non-religious organization.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 1:15 p.m.
