Many of our members will be continuing friendships made from our club's journey to Des Moines in August of 2019; others will be creating new ones. Many thanks to Mike McDonough, his committee members, and to all those who are helping with the welcome dinner, small dinners, and the numerous daily activities.

Our first outgoing visit of the year will be Journey #22637 to Lower Columbia. Barbara Elder is the Ambassador Coordinator for this July 6-11 journey. AUSTRALIA IS OPEN TO VISITORS!! Plans are underway for our first International Journey since 2018. (Journey #22408) Our club will be visiting Australia from October 19-November 2, 2022. Australia currently requires a passport within no less than 6 months before expiration, a visitor's visa, and all visitors to be fully vaccinated. Masks are required by Australia on all incoming international flights. The US is currently requiring a negative covid 19 test prior to return to the USA.

Our host clubs of Gold Coast and North Moreton are in Queensland. Here is some additional information on the two host clubs:

Gold Coast

The Shoreline of Gold Coast stretches for 37 miles along the Pacific Ocean, featuring some of the best surfing beaches in Australia. With names like Surfers Paradise, Broadbeach, Palm Beach and Mermaid Beach, visions of glistening white sands, rolling surf and gently swaying palms spring to mind – and that's exactly how it is.

The Gold Coast is recognized as the Holiday Capital of Australia. Last year, approximately four million visitors came to spend some time there. And why wouldn't they? When you consider the sub-tropical climate, with an average of 7.5 hours of sunshine every day of the year, and a temperature ranging from 75 F to 82 F in October and November.


North Moreton

Beautiful beaches, scenic mountains, lakes, rainforest walks, boutique wineries, kangaroos on the doorstep. North Moreton is just north of Brisbane, the capital of Queensland, Australia. As you head north for the Sunshine Coast, you pass through our North Moreton district. It encompasses the regions of Caboolture, Redcliffe, Pine Rivers and Bribie Island, now known as The Moreton Bay Region. It is an area rich in culture and history. Redcliffe was the first settlement in Queensland and was once a penal colony. Enjoy a barbeque on the shores of Pumicestone Passage as the sun sinks down behind the Glasshouse Mountains.

Watch the kangaroos as they hop along the beach. Marvel at the calls of the whip birds as we walk through the rainforest. Get close to a koala at the fabulous Australia Zoo, the creation of legendary Crocodile Man, Steve Irwin. Walk with us along some of the most beautiful beaches in the world. A warm sub-tropical climate offers comfortable living throughout the year.

Ambassadors will enjoy the chance to walk through the rainforest near the Glasshouse Mountains or walk on the beaches of Bribie Island. They can cruise up Pumicestone Passage or along the Brisbane River or enjoy a barbeque at sunset as the kangaroos hop nearby or visit Steve Irwin's Australia Zoo.

Member Profile: Phyllis & Ely Driver

Phyllis and Ely Driver joined Friendship Force Knoxville in 2007 after they both retired. Phyllis taught accounting for 30 years at Carson Newman University. Ely was with TVA, the director of the Engineering Lab in Norris, and, after retirement, also taught at Pellissippi State Community College.



Ron and Jean Mayer introduced the Drivers to FFK, but they were both interested in cultural exchange and world travel long before that, in no small part due to their participation in 14 Rotary Club international conventions and hosting of guests through the Rotary Club from many other countries. They have traveled to 55 countries and all the States in the US. Among their most interesting experiences abroad were team teaching the basics of business in ZhengZhou, China in 1994, lecturing in Azerbaijan, visiting Angkor Wat, Cambodia, riding an elephant in Thailand, and experiencing the most powerful waterfalls in the world - Iguazu Falls (on the border between Brazil and Argentina) – in a boat under the falls and hiking down beside the falls in flip-flops!

Since joining FFK, Phyllis and Ely have participated in outbound journeys to Ukraine, Poland and Charlotte, NC. They have hosted Open World delegates - educators and doctors from Russia and teachers and students from Indonesia. They share a wide range of interests beyond travel including the opera, classical music, theater and reading.
