FFK Journey Information for 2022

Des Moines, Iowa will be visiting us during the Dogwood Arts Festival, April 20-25,2022. Save the dates for our welcome dinner on April 20 at Cherokee Bluff Condominiums, and our farewell dinner at Calhoun's on April 24. The cost for the Calhoun's dinner is \$36. We need 30 participants to break even, so consider inviting a non-member friend! This will be a good way to promote our club, and for prospective members to learn about Friendship Force Knoxville.

Our first outbound visit of the year will be Journey #22637 to Lower Columbia, which encompasses the Columbia River Valley of Oregon and Washington states. Additional information on this journey #22637 was



sent to members in early February. Ambassadors are picked up by the host club at the Portland, Oregon airport. **The dates for this journey are July 6-11, 2022;** the cost, including fees to FFI totals \$425. Among the activities offered are a Steamboat ride down the Columbia River Gorge, a trip to Mount St. Helens, a trip to the Oregon coast, and a visit to Columbia Valley wineries.

Memories: FFK Journey to Ukraine



Friendship Force Knoxville has connected over the years with many communities around the world, including several in Ukraine. FFK hosted an inbound exchange/journey in September 2002 from Lugansk, Ukraine. In 2009, FFK members visited Kyiv and Lviv, Ukraine in an outbound exchange/journey. All of these communities are now in the midst of strife and worldwide news.

The 2002 inbound exchange was from what is now known as Luhansk (in Russian, Lugansk), a city in eastern Ukraine, in the now-disputed Donbas region. Knoxville's then Mayor Victor Ashe welcomed the six ambassadors from Lugansk who were hosted in the homes of four FFK members – John Brown, Guenter & Lotte Heinrich, Byrl & Fritzie Logan, and Tom & Eleanor Bush. Activities included a club picnic, a visit to Dollywood, a mayor's reception, a dinner at Club LeConte, and a farewell dinner at the home of Fuad & Layla Mishu. [Note: Luhansk is currently the capital of the Luhansk People's Republic, a separate state established in 2014 by pro-Russian separatists.]

In 2009, five members of FFK, Joanne & Al Schuetz, Phyllis & Eli Driver, and Nancy Schowalter, participated in an outbound journey to Kyiv and Lviv with a group of 24 ambassadors from around the U.S., England, and Canada. Joanne was coordinator of this journey. They all have fond memories of this special trip and the families with whom they stayed in Kyiv. Phyllis and Eli have stayed in touch (continued on next page) periodically with the young family who hosted them and who have since moved to Australia. Nancy has primarily kept up with Kylinka, who was 12 when she stayed with the Kurocha family. Her last contact with Kylinka was about two weeks ago, at which time her plan was to get to France. Joanne reports that the organizer of the Kyiv exchange has moved to Canada, and friends of the Schuetzs in Lviv have had to leave their homes. The FFK ambassadors' time in Kyiv included visits to important public museums, memorials, squares with historic statues, a monastery founded in the 11th century, and cultural experiences such as a fantastic folk music and dancing event, a school visit where children performed, a BBQ at a dacha in the countryside and other opportunities to try interesting food. They also spent several days in Lviv and had a tour of its downtown built in the 13th century, enjoying this beautiful very Ukrainian city. Although Lviv is not a member of FFI, Joanne arranged this personal visit through her friends in New York City.

Our hearts are with the friends made with both exchanges. We hope they and their families are safe. Betsy Tonkin, VP Membership
