Leaders from Uzbekistan Examine Rule of Law With FFK

Uzbekistan has become not just a name on a map, but a name which triggers the charm, intelligence and curiosity demonstrated by the 5 judicial delegates and the facilitator/interpreter from Tashkent, Uzbekistan! Friendship Force Knoxville and U.S. District Court Judges Thomas Varlan and Katherine Crytzer of the Eastern District of Tennessee jointly hosted the eight-day Open World program regarding best practices in judicial procedures, comparing systems in Uzbekistan with those in the United States. The Congressional Office for International Leadership, an agency of the U.S. Congress, funded and coordinated the program.

After their arrival on Friday, October 7, the delegates settled in with their individual hosts and had a small taste of local culture. The full program began on Saturday with a day in the Smokies, meeting with officials from the National Park Service, U.S. Department of the Interior, U. S Attorney's Office and the U. S. District Court regarding legal issues arising in the in the Park, followed by a picnic lunch and a hike on the Little River Trail. On Sunday, Friendship Force showed the delegation highlights of Knoxville with a river cruise, trip to the Sunsphere, and a visit to the Knoxville Museum of Art.





On Monday, the delegation began a full week of visiting state and federal courts, observing court proceedings, and meeting with various state and federal judges. They met with Knox County and federal prosecutors, public defenders and defense counsel and other attorneys, enforcement representatives and law professors. The delegates also attended classes at the University of Tennessee College of Law and the Lincoln Memorial University College of Law. Mayor Indya Kincannon bestowed honorary city citizenship on each member of the delegation when they met with her. Congressman Tim Burchett, Representative for the 2nd Congressional District in Tennessee, welcomed

them and shared his background and how he became active in politics. During all of these meetings, the delegates were assisted by an interpreter who provided simultaneous translation.

Two evening events were true highlights. The first was the informal dinner of dishes provided by Friendship Force members, which included a presentation by the delegation on the history and culture of Uzbekistan and a demonstration of Uzbek dancing. Then on the final night, the Uzbek delegation cooked a traditional Uzbek dinner for all their hosts and Judge Varlan at the home of Marsha and Art Mitchell.



Lead coordinator Betsy Tonkin shared organizational duties with Marsha Mitchell and Courtney Shea.
