Talking to her, I realized the end of the year makes me (and probably a lot of us) very nostalgic. There will come a **Christmas Day** that she will not be here... not here for any of the times I need to talk to her.

I made deviled eggs for our **Christmas Eve** dinner. Every time I make her recipe, I call her. Not that I can't remember on my own, I just love to hear her say "You don't remember?" "Nope, I always say!" 😊 She chuckles as she asks how many eggs, and we continue. A tradition. This year my daughter was helping me cook **Christmas Eve** dinner for the first time - we now have three generations keeping the tradition. I am blessed, and sad. When I told my siblings, my sister said, "I'm glad because I'm not sure how many moments like that are in the future." I am very lucky. I don't live close to my Mom geographically, but I am extremely close to her and all my siblings. Because she has been with us for so long and still lives alone and is as sharp as any of us, I have had a lot of time to get used to the idea of her not being around. The end of the year has made that real again...

Please, please, please stay connected to all your friends and loved ones. Because we just don't know, and we may not be as blessed to have 96+ years with the ones we love. Let that be your New Year's resolution.

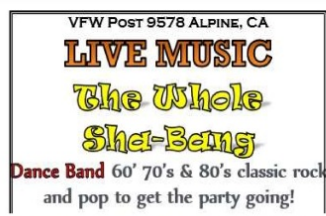

History of the VFW

The **Veterans of Foreign Wars** organization resulted from the amalgamation of several societies formed immediately following the **Spanish-American War**. In 1899, small groups of veterans returning from campaigns in Cuba and the Philippine Islands, founded local societies built on a spirit of comradeship known only to those who side by side faced the dangers of that war. Similar experiences and a common language drew them together.

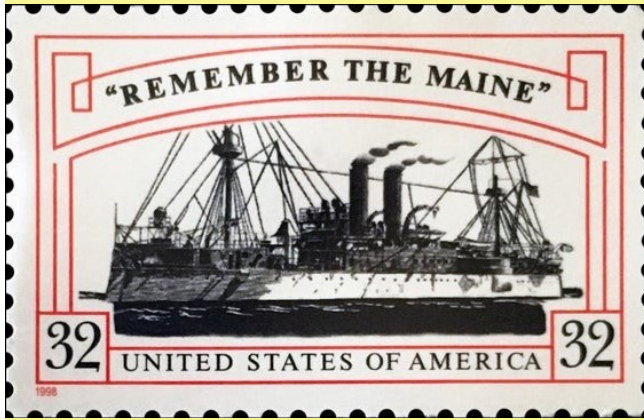

Our history

San Diego, California
 Beginning in the summer of 2016, the 8 East Band broke into the San Diego music scene by providing live classic rock and blues entertainment for enthusiastic crowds at various local venues. Due to the playing experience of its band members, the 8 East Band was prepared and playing for crowds within the first month of organizing. The 8 East Band has been consistently in demand.

The American Veterans of Foreign Service (predecessor to the **Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States**) was established in Columbus, Ohio, September 29, 1899, by Spanish-American War veteran **James C. Putnam**. **The Colorado Society, Army of the Philippines**, was organized on December 12, 1899 in Denver, Colorado. Shortly thereafter, a society known as the **Foreign Service Veterans** was started in Pennsylvania. These three veterans' organizations grew up side by side, increasing in scope and membership, until August 1913 when, at an encampment held at Denver, they merged their interests and identities in a national organization now known as the **VFW**.

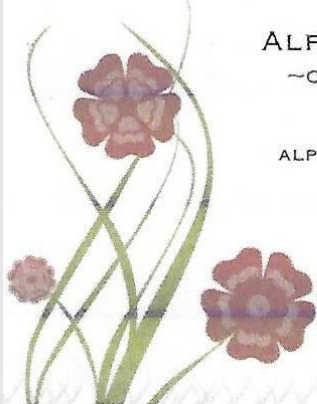
