GRACE CHURCH HISTORY

Grace Church has an interesting history with the McCulloch family. In the winter of 1965, Robert McCulloch Sr., the founder of Lake Havasu City, called Bishop Joseph Harte to say that he wanted to give the Episcopal Church a parcel of land in the city on which to build a church. Grace Church was named after Grace McCulloch (Mrs. Robert McCulloch), who was one of the first members.

The first services of the fledgling church were held at the Site Six Marina. The next few years were characterized by changing schedules and locations, including the Catholic Church, the Jr. High School, and two different funeral homes. Between 1977–1981, a multi-purpose building (the present parish hall) was constructed and held its first service on June 25, 1978. In the next few years, the present church building was added and held its first service in November of 1986.



GRACE CHURCH HISTORY CONT'D

In the early 1990s, the members of the congregation passed a number of major landmarks: The mortgage was paid off, the Mission Church was accepted as a Parish, and the congregation grew, both spiritually and in number. The Nathan Littlejohn Memorial Garden and Columbarium was established in 1995.

In the 21st century, the Grace congregation, while growing smaller and more elderly, has continued to invest in enhancements to our facility by adding solar panels and a commercial kitchen, updating our playground and basketball court, and working diligently to maintain the property.

We have accomplished a lot; however, given our current situation, we can only afford a part-time priest at the present time.

WORSHIP

Grace Church currently offers varied worship services. Many are on Sunday mornings at 9:30, while others are held at 4:30 on Saturday afternoons, depending on the availability of supply priests. These eucharistic services are supplemented on occasion by Morning Prayer services.

During the winter season, when our attendance is at its peak, our services are augmented by organ, piano, and choir music. Throughout the year, we worship with joy and enthusiasm, including a hospitality hour after services, as well as Centering Prayer on Wednesdays and Bible Study and book groups throughout the week.

We also offer Outreach to build our community through many non-monetary avenues, including:


- Intercessory prayer

FINANCE & STEWARDSHIP

Grace Church's financial picture has brightened considerably since the days of the pandemic at the beginning of the decade. The average pledged amount has risen by 170 percent compared to 2021, and plate and regular giving have also increased by substantial amounts during this period. Pledge payments typically contribute about 75 percent to annual operating revenue, as shown in the accompanying chart.



We currently have a grant that enables us to expand our outreach efforts. We earn additional income by renting out part of our space to a small micro-school four days each week.

We also have an interest-bearing Memorial Garden Account as well as a small endowment, primarily for capital improvements. We expect to run a budget surplus this year for the first time in a long while which is a promising sign for the future of Grace Church. In addition, we are in the process of marketing our excess property for sale. The proceeds will be placed in an endowment; however, the earnings on the investment can be used to help us fund our future needs.
