Introduction to the Mass

The Lord Jesus who taught the people of his home town in their synagogue, gathers us to be a people who will heed his prophetic voice and build our lives on his wisdom.

First Reading Ezek 2:2-5

Ezekiel was the first prophet called to speak God's word outside of the Holy Land. He delivers the message boldly, because the spirit of God has entered into him.

Second Reading 2 Cor 12:7-10

Paul describes how, immediately after a wonderful time when he seemed to be carried directly up to heaven, he felt humiliated and let down. God allows him to experience this 'thorn in the flesh' to keep him humble.

Gospel Mk 6:1-6

When Jesus returns to his home town, most of those who heard him were astonished. He was amazed, however by the incredulity with which others greeted him. And so he moved on from the synagogues: they were not fertile grounds for prophets — even for one as unique as himself
