7th April 2024 –2nd Sunday of Easter

Introduction to the Mass: Characteristic of the people who rejoice in the Lord's victory over death is that they gather regularly for 'the breaking of the loaf.' In this action we recognize the presence of the risen Christ and are invited to see that as we share a single loaf and cup, so we share in his new life. This new life has the promise of overcoming division, sin, and death: but are we really prepared to share with those around us. And if we are willing to accept forgiveness from the risen Lord, are we also ready to offer forgiveness?

First Reading (Acts 4:32 - 35) This is Luke's idealized picture of how the early believers lived. He put it before his audience to help them recognise that we can really grasp the significance of the resurrection only when we build a new style of community with each other.

Second Reading (1 Jn 5:1 4) Jesus Christ comes by water and blond, he overcomes death, he reveals the Father, and he sends the Spirit. This is a summary of the faith of the baptised person: one who enters by water into the life of Christ, who passes on his victory over death by a style of life that forgives and makes peace, and who comes to rest in the life of God.

Gospel (Jn 20:19 - 31) The risen Jesus came among his people gathered on Easter Sunday; then eight days later, *that is today*, he came *again* among them: each time he offered them peace, forgiveness, and the promise of new life.
