# FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER YEAR A

**READINGS** 

**1st reading—Acts 2:14,36-41 ; Psalm 22; 2nd Reading—** 1 Peter 2:20-25 <u>GOSPEL—John 10:1-10</u>

Jesus said:

'I tell you most solemnly, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold through the gate, but gets in some other way is a thief and a brigand. The one who enters through the gate is the shepherd of the flock; the gatekeeper lets him in, the sheep hear his voice, one by one he calls his own sheep and leads them out. When he has brought out his flock, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow because they know his voice. They never follow a stranger but run away from him: they do not recognise the voice of strangers.'

Jesus told them this parable but they failed to understand what he meant by telling it to them.

So Jesus spoke to them again: 'I tell you most solemnly, I am the gate of the sheepfold. All others who have come are thieves and brigands; but the sheep took no notice of them. I am the gate. Anyone who enters through me will be safe: he will go freely in and out and be sure of finding pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full.'

#### I AM THE GATE OF THE SHEEPFOLD, I AM THE GOOD SHEPHERD..


Today is Good Shepherd Sunday when we think of Christ the Good Shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. If you have ever been a shepherd, you would understand from experience what Jesus means when he refers to himself as "Good Shepherd...The Gate of the sheepfold". I have spent a big chunk of my life being a shepherd. It is my favourite job. You get to know the animals by name, or rather you give them names, and over time they get to know their personal names in such a way that when you call a particular chicken by its name, another chicken doesn't turn up. The chickens know exactly who you want. Its terribly exciting to relate with these guys and you get to know their personalities—if I may call it that way. With such a relationship, you do everything to protect them—from unfriendly animals—when we can conveniently do so. However, our human survival instincts most times take over, and we can only protect them when we are not threatened ourselves. Unlike us Jesus gives his life for his sheep, for us. He has come so that we may have life and have it to the full. I think it's worthwhile asking what that last statement means. Did he come all the way from heaven to die on the cross so that I may have the latest car? So that I may have the best house? so that I may have great wealth in this world? What did Jesus' death really do for us? Many people are not really living. They only think they do. Many of us only exist instead of living. Having life to the full means living the life of God, being free to live a life of love, selfless life, an EVER-LASTING LIFE that continues in the next world. We need shepherds after the heart of Christ who are prepared to show us that way. That is why we pray for vocations today, for good vocations.
