21st April 2024 – 4th Sunday of Easter

Introduction to the Mass: One of the gentle images that we find applied to God in the Old Testament is that the Lord is the shepherd of his people: 'The Lord is my shepherd there is nothing I shall want.' We Christians apply this title to Christ the Lord. He is the good Shepherd who knows his sheep and lays down his life for them. We may find this language of sheep and flocks and shepherds strange. But, beneath the imagery, the belief it points to is at the heart of our faith: God is gentle, concerned, caring and just.

First Reading (Acts 4:8-12) Luke wanted to capture the immediacy of the first Christian preaching. One of the ways that they sought to understand the identity of Jesus was to apply an image from the Psalms: `the stone rejected, has become the corner stone'. Jesus was rejected and put to death by humanity, but he has been raised and glorified by the Father.

Second Reading (1 Jn 3:1-2) We are loved by God, we are the children of God, we can dare to address God in familiar terms.

Gospel (Jn 10:11-18) In trials the shepherd must not abandon the flock, and if needs be he lays down his life for them. This is a key image in our understanding of Jesus and Christian love.
