19th May 2024 – Pentecost Sunday

Introduction to the Mass: Pentecost is the last great day of the Easter festival. On the fifteenth day after Passover, the Jewish people commemorated the giving of the Law of Sinai. It was a feast of pilgrimage, celebrating the offering of the first fruits of the wheat harvest. That is why so many people from all over the world gathered in Jerusalem. Christian Pentecost is a missionary feast that celebrates the Spirit that gives energy to the Church in proclaiming the Risen Christ.

First Reading (Acts 2:1-11) Many Jews came of pilgrimage to Jerusalem to celebrate the feast of Pentecost. It is to them that the Gospel is proclaimed in every language.

Second Reading (Gal 5:16-25) Paul instructs his converts and us, on how to live by following the Spirit.

Gospel (Jn 15:26-27; 16:12-15) During his final meal with his disciples, Jesus comforted them by promising to send them the gift of the Holy Spirit. That promise is fulfilled at Pentecost.
