Introduction to the Mass: 'Who do you say that I am?' Jesus asked Peter; and it is a question that has echoed down the centuries. Each age has to ask anew, 'Who is Jesus for us?' In the light of the fact that we in our time could face extinction as a result of our own greed, we, too, have to ask ourselves the questions of who Jesus is for us today and what this demands of us. We acknowledge our sinfulness and we trust in God's care.

First Reading (Acts 12:1-11) Peter thinks he is dreaming when he is led out of prison and realises what has happened only when he is a block away from the jail.

Second Reading (2 Tim 4:6-8.17-18) Trust in God brought the apostle safely through all persecution and difficulty.

Gospel (Mt 16:13-19) Peter's belief in Jesus makes him into a rocklike figure for the other disciples.
