Description of the Event

If you haven't heard of our Seven Singles Event, it's a marking competition where an overall winner is selected at the end.

This is a non-sanctioned, fun event for club members (and non-members). The intent of the competition is to measure the pure natural marking ability of all dogs entered as opposed to measuring their level of training relating to control or handling ability.

There are seven marks in total, but all dogs will participate in the first three to four marks. It is a great introduction to the bustle of an event for young dogs. All marks will be single marks but they may run back-to-back. Dogs will be evaluated based on their ability on how they mark and retrieve the bird. Birds will be used for all marks. **If you prefer to use bumpers, please bring your own; in that case, your dog may take part in up to four marks.**

Dogs will be evaluated following the third, fourth, fifth, and sixth marks to determine which participants will advance to the seventh and final mark.

First place (and associated bragging rights and trophy) will be awarded after the completion of the event.

Remember a chair, a hat, and sunscreen plus water for your dog. It's a great day for getting out with your dog and talking to other members. Please respect our grounds and leave it as clean as you found it by removing your garbage.
