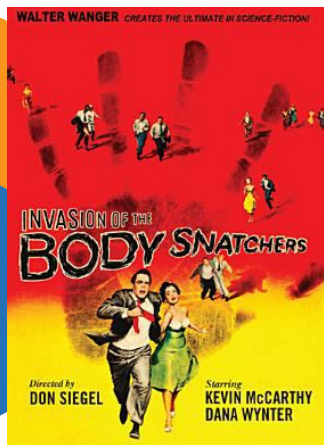


AFTERNOON AT THE MOVIES

The threat of an alien invasion was a popular theme of sci-films in the 50s and this 1956 film explores our fear of losing our identity and humanity in a complex world. The studio did not like the ending that director Don Siegel had planned and went with a more happy conclusion with an added prologue and epilogue that Siegel did not approve and was forced to shoot.



MUTINY ON THE BOUNTY

"Mutiny On The Bounty", made in 1935, is one of the greatest maritime adventure films of all time based on the real mutiny of the HMS Bounty in 1789. Clark Gable reluctantly shaved off his trademark mustache to play Fletcher Christian as he goes against the tyrannical Captain Bligh, played by Charles Laughton. The movie, at a cost of \$2 million dollars, was the most expensive project MGM had ever made at the time. It was shot in Tahiti, the South Pacific and on Catalina Island where a replica of the HMS Bounty was built and used for shooting.



MISTER ROBERTS

Out of all the movies released about World War II, "Mister Roberts" is unique because there is not one battle scene or weapon shot. The film takes place far from enemy lines, aboard a navy cargo ship in the Pacific during the waning months of the war. The story revolves around the Captain and Mister Roberts in a battle for the souls of the ship's crew. Jack Lemmon, in his screen debut, won an Oscar for Best Supporting Actor.
