The Committee donated approximately \$25,000 to the new library (**SEE**: Foundation Presents Checks on page 3). The City of Costa Mesa is actively soliciting donations to fund a number of additional needs for the new library.

The Friends are in talks with the City to determine what the City needs for the new library and their priorities for more donations in the future. Several Board members would like to donate outdoor musical instruments. However, the City is hesitant to change the current construction contract, but may consider adding this feature in the future after construction is complete.

On a separate note, nominations for the Board President and Vice President of Membership will be conducted just prior to the next author event that is on April 8th. The attached flyer contains all the information about this event.



We have some exciting new programs for children and teens. In addition to our ongoing Toddler Storytime, scheduled every Tuesday at 10:30 a.m., also we present a Bilingual Storytime in

both Spanish and English every Thursday at 10:30 a.m. Our new Children's Librarian, Jessi Gutierrez, is introducing S.T.E.A.M. (science, technology, engineering, art, and mathematics) every fourth Wednesday of the month at 3:30 p.m. Children from the ages of 5 to 10 years old will make S.T.E.A.M. related projects that will allow their creativity to flourish. Registration is required. Additionally, teens will have fun and make new friends being involved in two new programs: One is called Teen Game Night scheduled every second Wednesday of the month beginning at 3:30 p.m.; the other is Teen Color Night that occurs every third Wednesday at the same time. Materials for both programs will be provided.

For our adults, we have the Book Club that will meet the first Monday of every month at 5:30 p.m. with lively discussions and refreshing cups of tea. Next, we have The Tuesday Evening Film Club at 4:45 p.m. showing award winning films. Stay tuned for upcoming Chess Time on Mondays at 10:30 a.m., Cryptocurrency Meet-ups beginning in April on Wednesdays at 5:30 p.m., an Adult Coloring Club to be scheduled, and a lecture or two from a master gardener.

Foundation Presents Checks

The Costa Mesa Library Foundation was formed for the sole purpose of raising awareness and money for new library services in Costa Mesa. It has been a long struggle, but our goal was met in July, 2017 when ground was broken for the new Donald Dungan Library that is located on Park Avenue between 19th Street and Newport Boulevard. We call it our "Next Chapter" in confirming that Costa Mesa is truly a City of the Arts.

Since the Foundation has met its goal, it has been disbanded. The money that was raised has been transferred to The Friends of the Costa Mesa Libraries and put in a separate account to be used only for the new library. It was the Foundation Committee's privilege to present to the City of Costa Mesa three checks at their March 6, 2018 Council meeting. These checks will fully fund three areas inside the new library that include:

- \$15,000 for the Teen Library Technology bar (Mary Ellen)
- \$6,000 for the Children's Library Early Childhood Play and Learn Island (Charlene)
- \$5,000 for the interactive Media Display (Barbara)

We thank the Council for their support. Special

thanks are extended to Tammy LeTourneau and her hardworking staff for their efforts to keep construction on time and on budget. We look forward to Spring 2019


