The books traversed through Native American life, Pakistani traditions, history, and current bigotry, shame, confusion and desire.

For me, each story was a glimpse into history and the weight of a family's ancestors' experiences impacting their children, our children, today.

I encourage you to read a new genre. Look at the world through a new lens.

Libraries have so much to offer. They are a grand institution that give so much. Take advantage of all the books, computer access, and programs at your local library. Explore something new to help you GROW this summer.
