


30TH ANNIVERSARY CHALLENGE QUILT

Due before the guild quilt show in April 2025. For our next quilt show, it would be nice to have a display of quilts that depict "Thirty." It could be 30 blocks or 30 fabrics or a representation of the number 30 (just some suggestions). You may have your own idea?

Let's keep it a MAXIMUM of 30 inches by 30 inches (just to reinforce the theme). One traditional color for a 30 year anniversary is green, which is also CAMEO's logo color! Try to include green as one of your main colors, if at all possible.

We had our first sewing session on Saturday, September 21st. It was a wonderful day with about 18 people attending. We completed 18 Honor Flight quilt tops and several kits were taken home. We still have more kits to be taken. If we can have all the kits completed by January, I will work to get them quilted. If you can quilt them yourself that would be great and appreciated. If you need fabric for binding, let me know and I will cut some for you.

At the last meeting, it was voted to donate to HAVEN - a home for women and children escapina abuse. For many years, our guild makes gift bags and fills them with personal items. Examples are hairbrush, combs, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, body wash, hats, scarfs, gloves, puzzles, books, coloring books, crayons, toys like match box cars, etc. The bags are to be filled for use by a Woman, Infant, Small Girl, or Small Boy and labeled as such. We will have the kits to make the bags available at the October meeting and they need to be filled and returned at the November meeting.

Metro Hoops Workshop in November

Do you want to learn how to conquer curves? Then join us November 23rd for "Metro Hoops", a pattern by Sew Kind of Wonderful. For this workshop you will need to purchase the pattern and the Quick Curve Ruler both by Sew Kind of Wonderful ahead of time. The supplies will not be sold at the workshop. Norma also asks that you do some pre-work before class which is outlined in the supplies list (sewing some 2-1/2" strips together). Please join us the workshop is going to be fun!

Metro Hoops Supply List

Fabric Requirements for complate quilt:

- 1-JellyRoll or (24) 2-1/2" WOF Strips (Assorted Print Fabric)
- 2-1/2 yards of background fabric (white)
- 2-1/2 yards of background fabric (tan)
 (Please note that you can switch up the background colors or use one color instead of two)
- 1 yard fabric for setting triangles (I used pink on mine because of jelly roll color)

Jelly Roll - Pre-Cutting Prior to Class

Cut 24 of your 2-1/2 Strips in half, so you now have 48 Strips about 22" Long

Jelly Roll - Pre-Sewing Prior to Class

Make 12 Strip Sets by Sewing Together Four (4) 2-1/2" Strips. Press seams in one direction. See Photo Below



Other Pre-Cutting Prior to Class

Background Fabric (from each color, i.e. White and Tan)

Cut 40 – 7-1/2" x 7-1/2" Squares

Setting Triangles Fabric – Cut 80 – 4" x 4" squares

Supplies:

- Metro Hoops Pattern (order from website)
- Quck Curve Ruler (order from website)
- Sew 8 Square-Up Ruler

Order from Sew Kind of Wonderful at https://sewkindofwonderful.blogspot.com/

- Marking Pen
- Best Press/Starch
- Two Bobbbins Pre-Wound
- General sewing supplies ie Sewing Machine, Cutting Mat, Rotary Cutter, Thread, Straight Pins, Etc.
- Definition of a Quilt Retreat Weekend sweatshop with cookies and cursing

CAMEO QUILTERS GUILD September 19, 2024 Guild Meeting

Clawson United Methodist Church

President Barb Lusk called the meeting to order at 7:02pm. The meeting was also broadcast virtually by ZOOM with one member viewing.

New member Terri Thompson and guest LaVonne Olgilvie introduced themselves.

The June 24, 2024 Guild meeting and Board meeting minutes were approved and placed on file.

Treasurer's Report given by Janeen Sharpe

VP Membership Sharon Cratsenburg reported that 32 members (one member was new) and one guest attended the meet ing.

Charity Co-Chair Linda Wallace invited members to attend the Charity Sew-In for Michigan Honor Flight on Saturday. Set-up begins at 8am; sewing of the provided kits runs from 9am-3pm. Linda hopes to exceed last year's total of 40 quilts. Lunch will be provided by Linda but donations are welcome. Bring your own drink.

2024-2025 Charity beneficiaries:

- 1. Orchard Children's Services
- 2. Clawson United Methodist Church Layette Program (April)
- 3. Royal Oak House Assisted Living (formerly American House)
- 4. HAVEN bags guild voted to continue this practice for the holidays

LaVonne Olgilvie spoke about CAMEO's donations to Royal Oak House Assisted Living. 27 people are in the general popula tion; 30 are in memory care. LaVonne believes that lap quilts sized 40" to 50" square would be a good size.

Hopitality break 7:35pm. Meeting resumed at 7:45pm.

Fall Retreat: VP Membership Sharon Cratsenburg reported that as of this evening, 22 people are attending. Sharon is unable to attend the retreat, so Carole Gilbert will coordinate for Sharon.

Quilt Show: **VP Membership Sharon Cratsenburg** asked for help organizing our show in April 2025. (Show set-up April 3; show runs April 4 & 5.)

Raffle Quilt: Ordered 3,000 tickets (down from 4,0000 previous show)

Basket Auction: Needs Coordinator

Mini-Quilts will not be held as a "Silent Auction", but purchased out right at listed price. Needs Coordinator.

Fabric Table: Janeen Sharpe will coordinate

Vendors: Need Coordinator

Doorprizes: Need Coordinator Noroom for Food vendor this time. Theresa Nielsen suggested a food truck? Carmen Sluter asked that a group tour of the venue (Troy United Methodist Church) be held for guild members.

Royal Oak Library Display: Rosemary Spatafora will coordinate and accept small quilts this evening for the display to be held in October 2024.

Underground Railroad Show "N Tell Eight members showed their completed Underground Railroad quilts.

VP Facilitator Cheryl Cawley demonstrated making a "Block Book" to keep quilt blocks organized. Hand outs were provided. (See next page)

CAMEO QUILTERS GUILD BOARD MEETING September 26, 2024 ZOOM

Present Barb Lusk began the meeting at 7:16pm. A second post office key has been found and it is being kept in the Treasurer's box with Janeen Sharpe. Barb felt the September Tea party was very welcoming for returning members. The Saturday sewing day for Michigan Honor Flight was a success. The church closet has been organized, thanks to Jean Schlegelmann and Louise McCormick-Glazier. Rosemary Spatafora has enough small quilts for the Royal Oak Library display in October.

30th **Anniversary Challenge: Theresa Nielsen** - Theresa will run an article again in the October Silhouette to help members understand what is involved. Maximum size is 30" x 30" representing the number "30" in some way, using some green color.

Retreat: VP Membership Sharon Cratsenburg reported that the Fall Retreat is on - 22 people have registered. Cabins and menu have been chosen. Sharon is unable to attend so Carole Gilbert and Jackie Speer will coordinate for Sharon. Adjusted fees were given to those not staying overnight. There were no upcharges; the only extra money is from non-members (3) who paid \$10 extra each person.

Volunteers are needed to take equipment to Bear Lake from the church (ironing boards are already at the site). They can do so after the October Guild meeting. These should be people who are attending on Thursday.

Breakfast will be served at 9am and dinner at 5pm.

Sharon Cratsenburg also reported:

Membership: Committee assignments for the guild are being organized for the Roster. A new email list will be assembled. Currently, 38 members have joined the Guild. Sharon said Jackie Speer has agreed to handle Slip of the Keyboard again.

Quilt Show: Sharon has contacted Ray from Western Wayne Quilt Guild and ordered the quilt racks. \$425 total which includes at \$25 fee for the ticket tumbler. A 25% deposit is required. Sharon received Barb's permission to sign the contract. Treasurer Janeen Sharpe will send the check.

Raffle Quilt: need to get size measurement from Barb Lusk for the license to be ordered through the state. A photo will be taken to insert into the ticket envelopes. Jean Schlegelmann has photos of the quilt top (before quilting). Maggie Smith is handling Raffle Ticket sales.

Baskets: Darlene Baer and Judy Murray to handle this.

Hanging: Theresa Neilsen will handle the quilt hanging.

Vendors: The Pink Flamingo has asked to be a vendor (online quilt shop). Jean Schlegelmann was asked to solicit vendors (Jean did not confirm). Laurie Johnson volunteered to help Jean. Venue needs to be measured first to see how many tables will fit. Sharon wants all the vendors lined up by the December Guild meeting.

Ad: Laurie Johnson will contact Leslie at The Country Register for timetable and size.

Recording Secretary Louise McCormick-Glazier: Troy Historic Village will add CAMEO to its list for future programs. They need to contact us in a timely manner as we do not have summer meetings.

Louise will send her budget requirement to the Treasurer as it has been reduced. Jean Schlegelmann has donated 60 assorted cards to the guild. Louise currently has 20 postage stamps but we will need to order another roll.

October 2024 Workshop: Print Supply list for Norma Stark's workshop in the newsletter again. She will NOT be selling pattern and ruler at the workshop. That needs to be removed from the registration form by Laurie Johnson and re-uploaded on the website. Decorative Stitch will order for you or you can go to SewKindOfWonderful.com

Treasurer: Janeen Sharpe - Forms for 990N were filed with the State of Michigan. Because of Retreat payments, our total in the bank is now \$12,820.50. Janeen and Assistant Treasurer Jean Schlegelmann will work on the budget. Insurance company has been paid. Insurance Certificate is needed for the Retreat.

Meeting adjourned at 8:19pm.
