



THE ART OF APPLIQUE

Whether you like machine applique, raw edge or needle turn, it takes some time to learn and decide on your favorite technique. I have tried raw edge and also machine applique. My preferred choice is needle turn. It takes a lot of patience, I mean some of those pieces are so small. I enjoy the process and the look when it's done. Oh, slow down there, did I say done. Oh no, far from it. When a block is done, and I have let my sore fingertips have a rest, then I can move on to the next block. I have watched so many tutorials and videos, I see the applique process in my sleep and with all those stories that I write, I tell you my mind is full.

But I digress. Last month at our January guild meeting, members and guests were treated to a wonderful lecture and display of applique techniques by our very own Cheryl Cawley. Cheryl's love of applique was beautiful as she shared a variety of quilt blocks along with her completed quilts. She also had a display of the tools she uses for applique along with videos from other applique experts. It was very clear to me, Cheryl loves applique. They say you can't teach an old dog new tricks, but I sure learned a few and I'm getting old. Thanks, Cheryl, for sharing your talents and love of applique with our members. I'm off now to work on the next block of my quilt, with a finished time still unknown.

AS SEEN ON YouTube

I've been enjoying videos on YouTube while I sew and thought I would share some favorites.

"The Last Homely* House" is presented by Kate Jackson, a quilter in Northern England. She does all sorts of crafts like spinning, knitting, and bookmaking but she quilts most often. Kate has a very low-key, humble approach and a dry sense of humor. Her motto is "Out of your head and into your hands" meaning to get busy when you have worries to lessen stress. It is very soothing to listen to her while she demonstrates a technique or narrates the video. New videos appear every two weeks on Sundays. She's been posting since the pandemic, so there are a lot of videos to binge watch. She also has a gardening channel, "The Last Homely Garden" which appears sporadically.

*"Homely" means "cozy" in Great Britain, so don't be put off by the title which comes from JRR Tolkein.

"From Small Things" is a newer channel presented by Sue, a traditional quilter in Pennsylvana. She uses rummage sale fabric and hand quilts everything. Last year she completed 15 quilts! Sue is soft spoken and this is another low-pressure video to inspire you to get things done and use your scraps (and nobody is selling you anything!).

General interest videos: It's crazy how the algorythmn works, but I get suggestions for some very diverse subjects. "Wired" has videos about different informational subjects; "Space Maker Method" teaches people how to downsize their belongings (in a non-judgmental way) and "Girl With The Dog" shows dog and cat grooming if you need some cuddly moments.

If you like to listen to podcasts, Julia Louis-Dryfuss hosts "Wiser Than Me", an interview program with older guests. If you crave some Hollywood celebrity, "Smartless" is hosted by Jason Bateman, Sean Hayes and Will Arnett. It's funny but the language gets a little rough.

It's all free and you should find something to listen to while you are sewing.

<u>Quilt Show:</u> All quilts submitted for the quilt show must have a 10" sleeve sewn to the top. See instructions on our website, where you can also download a quilt show quilt submission form.

Our donation guilt is offered for \$1.00 chances, as a donation not a raffle.

We currently have 3 vendors, need at least 4 more to cover cost of rental. See the individual sub-committees to sign up to donate baskets and mini quilts for sale. Let them know what type of basket you are making up, to avoid duplicates. Do not turn in baskets yet.

<u>Spring Retreat:</u> Registration forms are available, and due by beginning of March. <u>Program: Presentation</u> by our member Cheryl Cawley: Many ways to Applique.

1) Fusible raw edge applique (easiest) 2) interfacing turned-edge applique. 3) needle-turn 4) wool applique (also easy.) A pdf of the slide show will be emailed to members in the following days.
