



Called to order at 7:18 p.m. Meeting was held at the home of President Cindy May. In attendance were Pat Baldauf, Laurie Johnson, Loreen Garrison, Susan Larson, Kathy Wilson, Karla Sutton, Cindy May, and Sharon Cratsenburg. Absent were Linda Ibbs, Barb Lusk, and Cheryl Cawley.

The minutes from the June 2017 board meeting were approved.

Cindy May reported on guild business transacted during the summer:

The CAMEO post office box was renewed as was the CAMEO website.

The annual insurance was paid.

The guilt show state lottery report has been submitted to the state.

The rental contract for the church is complete but needs to be turned in by **Barb Lusk**. There were no increase in charges.

The audit report was satisfactory and received by Cindy May; it will go on the October meeting agenda.

CAMEO received a thank you from the Troy Historical Society for our participation in their exhibit in August. CAMEO also received a thank you from Peggy Grunow's daughter, Cherie, for honoring Peggy at our quilt show.

Cindy has received information and two free passes to the October 20-21 quilt show "Fly Me to the Moon" in Indianapolis. The tickets are available to any CAMEO member.

MEMBERSHIP:

Current membership stands at 49 members (total announced at General Meeting was incorrect). Cindy will call members from last year who have not joined.

Committee assignments were reviewed. Fundraising needs more people. Charity Day committee also needs two more people. Nominations and Elections is currently vacant, but must be filled by February's general meeting.

NATIONAL QUILTING DAY & CHARITY DAY: Cindy May offered to have the guild pay for a catered lunch for these events. Decision to be made by each committee.

PROPERTY: Linda Watkins is storing all quilt show property at her house.

HEARTS 'n HUGS: October's Open Sew will give members opportunity to sew blocks for Hearts and Hugs. Hearts and Hugs are at Cindy May's house and will be given to that committee in October.

LIBRARY: Proposed to ask Karen Hoskins, Library Committee for ideas on storage/usage of the library.

25 YEAR ANNIVERSARY / QUILT SHOW: Discussion on a 2019 quilt show took place; no definitive consensus was made. Some members want to start making the next quilt show's raffle quilt now to give more time to make, photograph, apply for license, and sell tickets for the quilt. The idea of making an Anniversary raffle quilt without having a quilt show was suggested.

PUBLICITY: The membership will be asked to help with formulating a list of local newspapers.

RETREAT: the idea to offer a different venue was proposed. Barbie Brooks of Back Street Quilt Shop in Bad Axe offers more of a bed and breakfast style retreat at Bay Shores Camp in Sebewaing. Currently, February 8-11 (Thursday-Sunday) still has openings at \$240 complete. Lodging is in private rooms with private baths, room occupancy 2-3 people. Cindy May will send out an email offering this to members.

MEMBERSHIP FEE: there was a discussion to prorate membership fee to \$25 for those who sign up after January.

BUDGET: Treasurer Pat Baldauf reported that she and **Assistant Treasurer Cheryl Cawley** have started on the budget. A copy will be sent to Cindy for any changes.

SCHEDULING: Scheduling VP Loreen Garrison reported that portrait quilting was the only request she received for next year's speakers. September, 2018 will have an open-sew meeting. Loreen may invite quilt shops in to demonstrate how to use new rulers or other new gadgets for February, 2019 Whistle Stop. Loreen is trying to get local quilters for speakers, like former CAMEO member Lori Miller.

PROGRAMS & WORKSHOPS: VP Facilitator Sharon Cratsenburg reported that costs for speakers keeps increasing, especially when adding transportation, lodging, food, shipping quilts, etc. The board decided to cancel Karen Coombs for April, 2018, because of expense. Troy quilter Linda Thiefoldt (former CAMEO member) will replace Karen Coombs. All other programs remain the same for 2017-18.

Corresponding Secretary Karla Sutton requested more address labels with the CAMEO logo be purchased. Several board members said they could use some. **Laurie Johnson** and **Cindy May** will work on producing these.

Meeting adjourned at 10:10.
