

President's Corner:

Just as earth rotates and gives us seasons, Quilts have seasons too...

As summertime comes to an end and children go back to school, I start to look forward to putting away my summer fabric colors – pinks, turquoise blues, lavenders and bright yellows and bringing out my warmer toned Fall colors – golds, browns, plums, muted greens and deeper reds.

We express the seasons through the color of the fabric that we choose. Not to be confused by the numerous seasonal printed fabric (all of which I love especially Fall), I'm thinking of seasonal fabric color choices for your quilts. Are your fabric colors influenced by the changing seasons? Do you find yourself working with red and green, or blue and white at Christmas or Hanukkah time or orange and black at Halloween? Personally, I like orange, black, purple and lime green at Halloween.

Quilt shops also pay attention to the changing seasons and usually have a main display of seasonal printed fabric and coordinating colors. Their goal, for my shopping pleasure, gets me every time.

Fall/Winter is the time that we bring out our thicker quilts in anticipation of the cooler evenings. Isn't it wonderful and cozy to snuggle under one of those special quilts we made or were given to us by a friend or loved one? In Spring/Summer, the thinner quilts reemerge as the days get longer and the temperatures rise.

I find it wonderful that our quilts can have seasons too. The changing color choices add variety and interest to our work and gives us something to look forward to. I know for sure that somewhere around February, when the snow and cold weather have been hanging around for too long, I'll be looking for those pinks, turquoise blues, lavenders and bright yellows patiently waiting for me to come back to my stash and be found all over again.




Program News - *Linda Watkins, VP Facilitator*

Below is a list of the main essentials to bring to any workshop. Print out this list, cut it out, tape/paste it, or copy it by hand, onto a 3X5 card, post it near your machine. Maybe set up a workshop kit, box, bag, whatever, to contain this list as well as many of the essentials as you can spare. When it is workshop time, you'll have a checklist to be sure you collected everything you'll need for a workshop.

Workshop Essentials:

Machine, foot pedal, cords (don't laugh, it has happened, and to me, too),

Power cord

Extra machine needles

Bobbins, several and pre-wound with a neutral, unless a specific color is needed

Thread, a neutral unless a specific color is needed

Scissors, pins, rulers, cutting mat, rotary cutters, pencil/pen, note pad

Check the workshop requirements to add the specific items the speaker wants you to have.

Don't be a "Bronchitis Blanche"...

she's is the woman who sat next to me at a Sewing Expo workshop. The machines were new Pfaffs, all set and ready to go, all we had to bring were the specific items that were listed when we preregistered. The woman who sat next to me brought NOTHING! We did, but I regretted immediately since all she did was cough and sneeze the whole time. Don't rely on the kindness of strangers as Blanche did.

It is a great learning experience and can be the start of a beautiful quilted item. Plus you'll get acquainted with other CAMEO members. It is truly a Come And Meet Each Other day!





CAMEO Quilters Guild Executive Board Meeting August 27, 2015 - submitted by Rosemary Spatafora

Meeting was held at Linda Watkins home

Meeting called to order by President, Sharon Johnsonbaugh at 7:10 p.m.

Present: Sharon Johnsonbaugh, Linda Watkins, Carol Fetsco, Cindy May, Cheryl Cawley, Laurie Johnson, Rosemary Spatafora, Sybil Derderian, Jodie Schlicht, Kay Schepke, Karla Sutton

Sharon's goals for this year are to represent the guild and to increase membership.

By-laws - A copy was distributed to each member and all are asked to review them. Please change Article VI; Section 2; Item C to read \$750 instead of \$500. Updated By-laws will be included in the new Membership Manual. We will follow the By-laws this year.

Standing Committees vs Special Committees - The difference between the two committee types was reviewed and a list of both was handed out. Standing Committees are listed and explained in the guild By-laws (see Article VII).

Duties & responsibilities of each board position - Board members are asked to review the duties and responsibilities of their position to avoid micro-managing of guild committees.

News articles - Getting to Know CAMEO Board - Carol Fetsco has submitted this article for the September newsletter.

Liaison assignments - The Liaison assignments were reviewed, revised and clarified. Cindy May will revise the membership form to reflect the revisions. Board members are asked to contact members of their assigned committees to share committee member lists and to encourage them to begin to organize their activities.

Committee manuals will be distributed at the membership meetings.

Sharon asked that there be monthly reports from each committee.

2017 Quilt Show - Linda Watkins and Sharon Cratsenburg will chair the show. Raffle quilt will need to be planned and constructed during this year.

Pilot Program - Free Table - Lucy Lesperance would like to start a Free Table at guild meetings. CAMEO members can bring in any unwanted items (i.e. fabric, magazines, sewing tools, etc.) to place on the table for other members to take.

Linda Watkins moved to "add the Free Table as a Special Committee to be headed by Lucy Lesperance." Second by Laurie Johnson.

Vote taken - 11 in favor, 0 opposed - carried.

Jodie Schlicht moved that "the Quilting With Confidence Class be added as a Special Committee". Second by Sybil Derderian. 11 in favor; 0 opposed - carried.

Executive Board Meeting Dates and meeting locations are as follows: Sept. 24/Rosemary's; Oct. 22/Carol's; Nov. 24/Cindy's; Dec./no meeting; Jan. 28/Sybil's; Feb. 25/Karla's; March 24/Laurie's; April 28/Carol's; May 26/Cindy's; June 23/Linda's. All meetings will start at 7 p.m.

Speaker/workshop contract - Copy of the revised contract was distributed. Question about the guild's contract vs the speaker's personal contract as they may contradict each other. Carol will check with Sharon Cratsenburg on how this has been handled in the past.

Associate Membership - Cindy explained the process for becoming an associate member as outlined in the By-laws (see Standing Rules). The current membership form does not list Associated membership as an option as the deadline has passed. There are 2 Associate members for 2015/16.

Fund-raising Committee - Cheryl Cawley is the liaison. Suggestion for a fund-raising activity - Garage Sale/Silent Auction. Cheryl will remind the Fund-raising committee that all ideas must be approved by the Board before any expenses are made.

Research on CD - Laurie Johnson is doing research on CD rates at various banks and credit unions. Presented preliminary findings and will continue research.

Business Cards - Quantity given to Cindy May to place at Membership Table at the meetings.

Hospitality for September meeting - To be provided by Executive Board.

Executive Board Member Contact List - list distributed & reviewed. Laurie asked that the list be sent electronically to Board members.

Cindy will type up the Committee assignments and will send out to the Board by next week. She will send to the entire guild by Sept. meeting.

Rosemary will get Cindy the Lamphere Printing & Graphics contact info and her sample cover letter.

Board members are asked to send any attachments to emails in PDF form if possible.

Recording Secretary/Newsletter - Rosemary will include an Action Items list (for Board only) along with the Board meeting minutes. Directed to run 25 hard copies of the newsletter.

Corresponding Secretary - Sybil has been picking up mail at the P.O. box. Cheryl Cawley will pick up the mail when needed. Birthday cards have been going out.

Treasurer - Cheryl Cawley updated on the Audit. Hopes to have completed by Aug. 30.

Distributed the proposed budget. Members asked to review and bring any suggestions to next meeting. Budget to be voted on by guild membership in October. P.O. box bill will be paid.
