



Happy Fall everyone. It certainly started out on a high note. I hope everyone enjoyed the CAMEO Scavenger Hunt. A big thanks to Ann Bonelli for being the only person whose name started with an "A" for being there. Did you pick up our \$10 workshop voucher? This voucher is a thank you from the Guild for all the hard work everyone did on the Quilt Show. It can be used to take \$10 off any one workshop in the 2015 – 2016 guild year. If you did not get your voucher in September, be sure to pick it up at the membership table in October.

I hope everyone is looking forward to our October meeting. Have you ever wondered how fabric is designed? This is your opportunity to find out. Monique Dillard will join us and present her lecture "How to Design Fabric and Books – How is That Done". She will walk us through the steps of fabric design from the idea to the finished product. Monique will also be bringing her new line of fabrics so we can get a sneak peak. On Saturday she will teach her Black Pearl Quilt. This Lap size quilt finishes to 54" by 68". This quilt only takes 6 fabrics, a dark solid, four medium value prints that coordinate with the solid, and a cream or white for background. While Monique's quilt is in black, you can use any color. There is pre-workshop cutting to do so don't wait too long to sign up. Cost of the workshop is \$40 for members and \$8 for the pattern available from Monique at the workshop.

November is the month for all our Hexie lovers. Mary Clark will join us on Thursday night with her lecture, "From My Past to Present". Then on Saturday, she will teach her workshop entitled Hexies – A New Way. Mary has a unique method for making hexies. She does not use the traditional hexie papers. She also has a different way of sewing them together. Mary promises this workshop will make all of us "Hexie" lovers. Mary will supply the hexies to the students. This is a great workshop to use up some of your scraps. Workshop is \$15 for members.


Sittin' and Stitchin' - Cindy May

Michigan State Museum Quilt Exhibit Quilts of Southwest China

Sept. 27, 2015 – April 30 2016

In southwest China traditional bed coverings and other household items have often been, like American quilts, made of small pieces of fabric that are patched and appliquéd together to form artistic, functional textiles.

A bi-national consortium of American and Chinese museums, led by the MSU Museum and the Yunnan Nationalities Museum (Kunming), has fostered an effort to document this textile tradition and, at the same time, advance an understanding of the intangible and tangible cultural heritage of China.

A ground-breaking exhibition on this art will have its world debut at the Michigan State University Museum after which it will tour nationally.

What's a CAMEO member to do, ...?

You can... Come to the October meeting to get your member directory. Besides contact info for each member, there is CAMEO information within. If you can't make it to the meeting, designate a member to pick up your directory for you

You can... Come to the October General Meeting and hear about Monique Dillard's quilting journey; while there turn in your Workshop Registration form from the September newsletter to Facilitator Linda Watkins. Monique's "Black Pearl" sounds intriguing. (I saw it and it looks great in black/white, but it would look great in any two color option and it doesn't have to be the whole quilt; you can learn the block and make as many or as few as you want, a candle mat, a table or bed runner, a table cover, a lap quilt or a bed quilt.)

You can... Be sure to show up to work on the committee you are on; the rest of us depend on you. CAMEO has two kinds of committees: Standing and Special. The Standing Committees are required to function to keep the guild operating smoothly. The Special Committees are extras and if not enough members sign up for them, they may be dropped. You can... Look through your stash for unfinished Charity kits signed out in a previous year. Please work on them to completion or return them as is so that the Charity Committee can account for them.


You can... do a lot!

Research & Information

Creating Hawaiian-Inspired Quilts - *Nancy Bekofske*

Judith Sandstrom has adapted traditional Hawaiian appliqué to paper-cut designs manageable for quilters of all skill levels. The motifs are 'pure American' including butterflies, tulips, daffodils and bluebirds, Christmas Cactus, and Christmas themes. She offers a new technique for pattern transfer with step-by-step photographs. Innovations include incorporating more than one color in the appliqué and using several different design elements to make the appliqué. Patterns make wall to twin bed sized quilts. Several of the bed size patterns include pieced blocks. Sandstrom begins with an overview of traditional quilt making in Hawaii and photographs of the contemporary Hawaiian quilts that are her inspiration.

From Heart to Hand: African American Quilts from the Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts

From Heart to Hand surveys twentieth-century African American quilt artists from America's Southern States, restoring their identities and drawing in examples that range from abstract compositions to figurative works of cultural icons like Jackie Robinson. The exhibition of 30 quilts is divided into three thematic areas: Tradition: Patterns from the Past, Improvisation: Practical Inventions, and An Unconventional Canvas: The Quilts of Yvonne Wells. Quilting has been a part of American culture for centuries. This exhibition is organized by the Montgomery Museum of Fine Arts, Montgomery, Alabama.

Research & Information

The Half Square Triangle – Ann Bonelli

Quilters are always seeking to learn new things or new techniques or 'improvements' of established methods...and always to do them faster. Chain piecing everything? Take the very basic half square triangle which is used in so many traditional blocks, the square, hour glass, pinwheel, flying geese, stripes, herringbone, chevron, etc.

Here are a number of ways to make a 2 ½ " half square triangle. Two contrasting fabrics are used in each method..

One HST

If you are using up scraps, or every square must be different or you want to use your AccuQuilt; this is your method to consider.

- Cut 2 right angle triangles, each side 3 – 3 3/8" long (depending on your degree of accuracy). Layer, placing right sides together and sew ¼ seam along the diagonal. Open. Lightly press. Trim.

* June Tailor has a 'Perfect Half Square and Quarter Square Triangles Ruler'

Two HST

Cut 2 fabrics, each 3-3/8" square. Layer fabrics, right sides together, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Sew ¼" on each side of line. Cut on drawn diagonal line. Open, Lightly press, trim.

* TRIANGLE TIGER TAPE Instead of drawing the diagonal line use this reusable tape. It is ½ " wide and comes in a 30 yard roll. Sew along both outer edges of tape, remove tape and cut diagonally between stitching.

Three HST

Purchase Thangles paper templates. For 2½" half square triangles, cut strips of 2 fabrics, each 3" wide. Layer strips right sides together and pin Thangles to strips, keeping long edges aligned. Stitch on dotted lines. You can chain sew several strips. Cut on solid lines. Open, Lightly press. Remove paper.

Four HST

Cut 2 fabrics, each 4¼" square. Layer fabrics, right sides together. Stitch ¼" all the way around the perimeter of square, pivoting at each corner. Cut diagonally from corner to corner, keep the halves together and cut again on the other diagonal from corner to corner. Open, Lightly press. Edges are on the bias.

Eight HST

Cut 2 fabrics, each 5¾" square. Layer fabrics, right sides together. Draw two diagonal lines from corner to corner. Stitch ¼ " on either side of both drawn lines. Carefully cut apart without moving the stitched fabric square. Cut 1-Vertical cut through the center of drawn lines. Cut 2-Horizontal cut through the center of drawn lines, Cut 3 & 4- on drawn diagonal lines from corner to corner,

700 HST!!

TRIANGLES ON A ROLL. Comes in rolls of 700 and varying width depending on size of HST. For 2½" HST they come four across and as long as you want to make them. Cut 2 fabrics to width of roll, layer fabric and pin grid paper on top. Sew on all dashed lines, rotary cut on solid lines. Open, Lightly press. Remove paper.
