


And we have to welcome our newest member, Mary Jane Blackmer from Farmington Hills, MI. She is our 56th member for this year.

Research & Information

Considerations for selecting a longarm quilter

Once you have finished piecing a quilt, the decision has to be made, do you quilt it or have it quilted. If you are not quilting it yourself how do you select a quilter? Very few of us will be looking for hand quilters (too expensive) most of us will turn to the longarm quilter. We are fortunate to live in an area where there are many longarm quilters so it comes down to how much you like their work, how much they charge, how long it will take and how well the two of you communicate.

To begin your selection processes ask your friends, your fellow guild members, local quilt shops for their suggestions, recommendations and experiences with local longarm quilters. Look at as many examples of the quilter's work as you can, both from friends she has quilted for and the samples she will show you. Visit Quilt shows and see if she has quilted any of those exhibits.

Hopefully this previewing will give you a feel for the style of quilting you like and are looking for in your quilt. It helps to have seen how a densely quilted piece can give a firm hard flat quilt, somewhat heavy while a piece quilted with more open spaced will give a softer, fluffier look. Are you looking for the same pattern from edge to edge, a pantograph? Do you want different quilt patterns in different blocks or shapes within the block, custom quilting? Obviously this is more expensive. Your quilter will help you with all of this but it is helpful for you to have put some thought in to your expectations. Do not be timid about asking your prospective quilter about her experience. Did she buy her machine a month ago! Has she been quilting for customers for ten years, taken classes, been to conferences, won prizes? The decision who to use is yours, just be informed.

Facts you need to know before you leave your quilt top.

- 1) How do you price? What is included?
- 2) Is batting included, what kinds do you use?
- 3) May I provide the batting? How much larger should the batting be than the pieced top.
- 4) What thread do you use, is the cost included?
- 5) How long will it take?
- 6) What will this project cost?
- 7) How should I prepare the quilt top for you?

Usually you will be asked to present the quilt top well pressed, the backing at least 6-8" larger than the quilt top and kept separate from the top, the batting same size as backing.

Communication is extremely important, do not say to the quilter, "whatever you suggest will be fine" She may think a dense, heavy design will make a manly quilt when you were envisioning something light and airy because you had seen others she had done that way. If you want to defer to her experience at least listen to her describe the pattern/style/thread color she is proposing.

Second - Linda Watkins Discussion Vote: 7 yes, 0 no - motion carried.



Betsy's Beauty from Miracle Quilts
 Redesigned to use 2 1/2" strips, 8" Blocks
 (38" X 38" Approx.)



FABRIC

Border 1/2 yard Cut (4) 3 1/2" strips

Binding 1/3 yard Cut (4) 2 1/2" strips

Dark 5/8 yard Cut (8) 2 1/2" strips, (set aside (1) strip dark)

Light 5/8 yard Cut (8) 2 1/2" strips, (set aside (1) strip light)

This is an easy "Jelly Roll" friendly little quilt. Great for leftover stash strips 2 1/2"

Sew (7) strips each of dark and light together
 Press to the dark.



Cut (56) 4 1/2" pairs from these
 Sew (4) rows side to side of
 (8) pairs each as shown



Sew (2) sets end to end of (8) pairs each as shown starting with light on the top row.
 Sew (1) set of (8) pairs starting with dark on the top row.



Cut (8) 4 1/2" strips from the light & dark 2 1/2" strips you set aside.
 Sew (2) single strips as shown end to end.
 These are for the top and bottom.



You are now ready to lay out your design as shown on the pattern and sew the strip sets together.

Measure the quilt and border strips and sew all four to your quilt top.
