

Kale & Brussels Sprout Salad

- Rosemary Spatafora

3 cups Brussels sprouts

1 large bunch Tuscan kale, center stems discarded

1 small clove garlic

1 small shallot

1 cup finely grated pecorino

1/2 cup extra-virgin olive oil

1/2 cup toasted pine nuts (I use walnuts)

2 tablespoons Dijon mustard

3 lemons, zested and juiced

Salt & freshly ground black pepper

In a food processor fitted with a slicing blade, shred the Brussels sprouts. Next, shred the kale. Add the garlic and shallot and shred. (Alternatively, shred and mince the vegetables with a knife.) Set aside.

In a large bowl, whisk together the pecorino, olive oil, nuts, mustard, lemon zest and juice and salt and pepper to taste. Add in the shredded vegetables and toss well to combine. Let the salad sit for 10 minutes before serving to allow the dressing to permeate the greens.

RETREAT AND TRANQUILI-TEA

I spent a weekend in June on the best Retreat. Barbie Brooks from Backstreet Quilt Shop hosts retreats at the Holiday Inn Express in Bad Axe. This was the 3rd and best yet!

I got the idea to plan a Retreat for CAMEO. I discussed it with her and we made tentative plans. This would be a Retreat with a slight twist: RETREAT & TRANQUILI-TEA.

A three day event with check in at 12n on Friday, October 31 and checkout of at 3pm Sunday, November 2, 2014. Bad Axe is less than 100 miles and a 2.0 hour drive North on Van Dyke M-53 from Clawson.

The sewing room accommodates 16 people maximum and she would require 12 people minimum. Amenities include: 1st floor double room with 2 queen beds, with Friday dinner, Sat breakfast, lunch, & dinner, Sun breakfast & lunch.

Highlights--Saturday: lunch at a Victorian Tea Room, and dinner: a traditional Thanksgiving dinner.

She would offer a three hour class on Sat morning (optional) with kit or your own fabric. The class is a basic table runner then embellished or appliquéd by hand or machine with a holiday theme (quilters choice).

Cost \$200 includes the class, 6 meals, 2 nights lodging. I volunteer to chair the event and coordinate arrangements with Barbie Brooks.

CAMEO Quilters Guild General Meeting Minutes - June 19, 2014 - Carol Fetsco, Recording Secretary

The meeting took place at the Clawson United Methodist Church, 205 N. Main, Clawson, MI 48017 Call to order at 7:02 P.M.

President Sharon Cratsenburg welcomed everyone, led the members in the Pledge of allegiance, then read CAMEO's Mission Statement. She announced that we would have our potluck dinner first, followed by the business meeting. Member Barbara Lusk gave the blessing.

At 8:10 P.M. the president called the business meeting to order. She reminded everyone that Associate Members may not vote tonight and she thanked all who brought food for the dinner.

Minutes: Approved, so will be signed, dated, and placed on file.

The president thanked the Executive Board members, the committee chairmen and all the members who worked on the various CAMEO committees. She reminded re-enrolling members to get their membership forms in early as committee assignments are done on a first come, first serve basis.

Extra "Swatch Buddies" from the May Retreat were distributed by a random drawing of members who were in attendance at the retreat.

Lori Miller, Facilitator Vice President: thanked all members who attended workshops, programs and helped her through the year. Sharon Cratsenburg for Carol Herzberg, Scheduler Vice President, who was absent: Displayed a poster depicting the program in place for next year and went through it month by month.

Lynda Draudt, Membership Vice President: Announced that there were 74 Active and 10 Associate Members this year and 54 members were present tonight. Lynda requested members to save their member directories because starting next year much of it will be sent via e-mail; only folder and the pages that do not need reprinting are to be kept. All pages needing updating will be available by e-mail to be printed off and inserted in your current member folder. New members and those who do not have an e-mail address will be able to get printed pages at General Meetings. The member directory consists of many pages and the printing of it is getting more and more expensive. In order to keep costs down the Executive Board decided to try to e-mail as much of it as possible for a one year trial period. If it does not work well, then we can come back to printing copies of it. Lynda added a thank you to the members of the Membership Committee who worked for her all year.

Linda Watkins, Treasurer: YTD since 6/13/14 \$12,002; expenses \$14,769.19.

There were no questions so the financial report was accepted, it will be signed, dated, and placed on file.

Carol Gilbert, Challenge Committee Chairman: announced the Challenge Quilt contest prizes. Rosemary Spatafora won Second Place and Kathy Wilson won First Place.

Sharon Cratsenburg introduced the members of the Audit Committee who volunteered do the audit once the books are closed following the June statement. The three members are Barb Eaken, Sarah Leight, and Linda Pankratz. Joline Bowdich moved to approve the three members of the Audit Committee, second by Barb Lusk. The vote was unanimous in favor of approval, so the motion carried, and the members of the 2013-2014 Audit Committee are Barb Eaken, Sarah Leight, and Linda Pankratz.

Lucy Lesperance, Nominations and Elections Committee Chairman: Introduced her committee members,

Linda Pankratz and Barb Eaken. She announced that since the nominations were not closed at the May General Meeting, nominations from the floor would be taken tonight. Loreen Garrison accepted the nomination for Facilitator Vice President. There were no nominations for any other office, and the nominations were closed. The ballots were distributed only to Active Members. Once the ballots were collected, they went to the counters, Lucy, Vanetta Sterling and Waneda Mathis.

Willie Pfeiffer: Announced her "Fall Retreat and Eat" would be held on October 4 from 8 A.M. to 9 P.M.

Former attendees would get the information via e-mail and those who never attended could pick up an information sheet at the front table tonight. The cost will be \$45, bring a project or do the class project.

Spaces are limited and available on a first come, first serve basis.

Karla Sutton, Liaison to Silent Action from the Show Core Committee: Announced that a signup sheet for entering a mini quilt in the Silent Auction is at the front table for those interested in making a mini quilt for the show next June. Also, there will be a "Chinese Auction" during the show days; members and/or groups of members and committees are encouraged to donate a container/basket containing items along a theme. Maggie Smith showed an example of such a donation, a basket filled with chocolate treats along with some fat quarters. The containers/baskets can be on any theme, they don't have to be just quilt related.

Sharon Cratsenburg: Explained the yearly donations from the Executive Board; this year the Board moved to donate \$100.00 each to the Lions Bear Camp where we've held our retreats and to Clawson United Methodist Church where we meet. The donations will be sent before June 30th.

Sharon announced the final Executive Board Meeting and Officer Transition Meeting will take place on Thursday, June 26 at 6:30 P.M. at Sharon's house in Romeo. All outgoing and incoming Board members will receive an e-mail about it. Agenda items for the June 26 meeting are due by June 22 to Sharon.

Chuck Blanchard, Chairman of the President's Quilt committee and the committee members presented Sharon a quilt to thank her for being president this year.

A potluck dinner was held prior to the business meeting. Call to order: 8:15 P.M.

Sharon C. distributed copies of the agenda, 2014-2015 Executive Board Officers Contact Chart, 2014-2015 Guild Programs, and she announced that outgoing officers are to make arrangements to provide officer manual and officer items to corresponding incoming officer as soon as possible if not done so already; Carol H. to Theresa N., Lori M. to Loreen G., Lynda D. to Cindy M., Linda W. to Janeen S., Janeen S. to Jean S., Theresa N., Jean S., and Jackie S. to Lynda D., Janet S., and Linda W. Any incoming officer who does not receive an officer's manual should contact Sharon C. by July 15.

Board meeting dates for next guild year are to be chosen by board members and written on the blank chart; copies will be available to each.

Sharon asked about the keys to the Post Office box as they need to be transferred to the new Corresponding Secretary, Sharon Johnsonbaugh. That has been done, but Linda W. will check the items from Susan Van Eck to see if there is another key there.

Carol F. provided Janeen S. with a copy of the June 19 General Meeting which included the list of newly elected officers so that the signature changes may be made at the credit union. Janeen indicated that the information had to be on CAMEO letterhead and that she will take care of it.

Sharon shared the May Retreat survey results with members present. Next year the retreat will be held on May 1.2, and 3. Jackie S. will send info on Echo Grove to Sharon for guild files in case another retreat venue is ever needed.

Sharon read a letter from member Sandy Peiss who wants to host a quilt retreat in Bad Axe October 31- November 2. The consensus was that as it would not be a guild sponsored event, Sandy can go ahead and contact members to seek attendees. Sharon will send out a member wide e-mail with the information and Sandy can follow up on it as she chooses.

Sharon announced that she, Janeen S. and Jean S. will be getting together to work on the budget for 2014-2015.

Regarding Property: a new Property Chairman will be needed; no one has volunteered for the position as of today.

Regarding the newsletter: Rosemary Spatafora said she will continue on as editor and there will be a summer issue.

Regarding Publicity: Melissa Smith indicated that she will continue with it.

Sharon will provide a Committee Budget Allocation form to each committee chairman once the budget is done and approved so that each committee will know what it has to work with.

Carol Herzberg, Programing V.P.: read from the Programs Chart distributed by Sharon.

She corrected the dates in May listed for the Retreat to May 1, 2, and 3, as well as the date for the May General Meeting to May 14 and the Saturday Open Sew to May 16.

Lynda D., Membership V.P.: there are 47 members enrolled to date. Lynda announced that Waneda Mathis does not want to be chairman of Archives and Sarah Leight does not want to be chairman of Property; other members will be needed to fill these positions. Sharon B., Corresponding Secretary: announced that she has already given the manual and officer items to Sharon Johnsonbaugh. Linda W., Treasurer: Deferred to Janeen Sharpe to give the report. Janeen distributed seven pages covering the review of the budget. The most telling was the sharp increase in the income over the previous year and Janeen explained that it was due to the strong program set up by Lori Miller for the 2013-2014 guild year. Janeen went on to say that the Board needs to decide if we should continue to set up strong programs to generate increased income. Janeen added that all bills are not in and all checks have not yet been cashed but that expects that it will be done by June 30.

Theresa N., Member at Large: Clawson Fourth of July Parade will start at 9:00 A.M. from the staging area in the shopping center at 14 Mile Rd. and Crooks. It will move East to Main, North to Elmwood and East. The parade unit application is in. Karla Sutton, Kathy Menkowski, Melissa Smith, Jean Schlegelmann, Thersa Nielsen, Sandy Peiss, plus maybe Jackie Speer and Sharon Cratsenburg will be there. There is candy available with possibly more needed, Kathy M.'s little buckets will be reused this year to hold the candy. More guild members are needed to participate and some additional small quilts could be used.
