



Oatmeal Cake - Cindy May

It's an old family favorite, and wonderful this time of year. Good warm or cold, ala mode or plain. Taste tested and approved by your Core Quilt Show Committee at a recent meeting. Hope you'll enjoy it too sometime this fall.

Oatmeal Cake

Pour 1 ½ Cups boiling water over 1 Cup of dry old-fashioned oatmeal. Set aside to cool.

Cream:

1 Cup brown sugar

1 Cup white sugar

½ Cup shortening

Add: 2 eggs

Sift and Add:

1 ½ Cups flour

1 teas. baking soda

¼ teas. cinnamon

½ teas. salt

Add:

Cooled oatmeal

1 teas. Vanilla

Bake in a greased and floured 12x8" pan 35-40 min at 350 degrees

Topping

Melt 2 Tablespoons of butter in pan.

Add

½ Cup brown sugar

1/4 Cup cream or pet milk

1 Cup chopped nuts

1 Cup shredded coconut

½ teas vanilla

Spread over hot cake immediately from oven and broil till bubbly.

Serve warm or cooled.

Note: I usually double the whole recipe and bake in a larger pan

CAMEO Quilters Guild - September 18, 2014 General Meeting Minutes - Submitted by Carol Fetsco

Call to order at 7:01 P.M.

President Sharon Cratsenburg led the Pledge of Allegiance and then read CAMEO's Mission Statement.

Sharon welcomed everyone back to CAMEO's twenty-first year; introduced the 2014-2015 officers; gave information about Willie Pfeiffer's Oct. 4 workshop day, reminding members to sign up for it tonight; gave information about MI Quilt Network's Miracle Quilts Workshop including seeing Sandy Peiss for more information and/or signup. Sharon reminded members who may have questions or comments dealing with the guild to e-mail her and she will respond.

Minutes of the June 19, 2014 General Meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter, they will be signed, dated, and placed on file.

Financial Report, Janeen Sharpe, Treasurer – Reminded members that the proposed 2014-2015 guild budget was e-mailed along with last year's actual budget to review before the October meeting when the proposed budget will be up for a vote of approval. She then took questions from the floor.

Janeen reported that the income to be \$2,042.00 and expenses over the same time totaled \$309.00.

The Financial Report was accepted, it will be signed, dated, and placed on file.

Sharon announced that the Program would begin and introduced Loreen Garrison, Facilitator V.P.

who described how the "Ice Breaker" mixer event would take place. It would be followed by the Hospitality Break before the meeting would resume.

Business meeting resumed at 7:50 P.M. when Sharon C. outlined her goals for this guild year which included CAMEO hosting a great quilt show at the end of the guild year. She reminded everyone to read the newsletter and to pick up the new CAMEO business cards from the front table before leaving tonight.

Officer Reports:

Facilitator Loreen Garrison announced the winners of the "Ice Breaker" tonight from among those who met and talked to more than three other members; the winners were Terry Hair, Rosemary Spatafora, and Janet Nelson; listed some upcoming guild events. First, she introduced member Janet Steele who described her upcoming workshop on October 18 when she will show how to make the "Big Bag", to demonstrate how much the bag can hold, Janet showed some of the quilts that she had stored inside her sample bag. Loreen announced that the sign up for workshop starts tonight and the supply list is posted near the back of the room where the show raffle quilt is located.

Next, Loreen announced that Ami Sims will be our November speaker and that her workshop, "Twisted Sister", will be on November 22, cost is \$45.00 to members plus pattern; sign up begins tonight.

Program V.P. Report: Theresa Nielsen, Schedular V.P. explained that her work involves contracting guest speakers for the 2015-2016 guild year and noted that on each chair there was a paper to be used to write suggestions for speaker ideas that members would like to see and to give them to Theresa before leaving tonight.

Membership V.P. Cindy May announced that there were 66 members, 43 members were present tonight, including two new members, and seven guests. She wished a Happy Birthday to all members with September birthdays.

Committee Reports:

Sarah Leight, Audit Commmittee chairman, announced that the audit of last year's financial records was conducted over the summer with Linda Pankratz. Sarah read the Audit Reprort. Copies of the report were turned in a required. Sharon C. asked for and Linda Watkins moved to "accept the Audit Report as presented by Sarah Leight". Second by Sheryl Gaynor. Sharon asked if there was a discussion; hearing none, she called for a vote. The Motion carried; the report was accepted as presented.

Willie Pfeiffer, Charity committee chairman announced that, while the committee has not yet met, she is reviewing the paperwork and the system to make it easier for everyone to do charity work this year, hopefully to get more participation and she will take it up with the committee members at the first meeting. Also, Willie described some of the changes that will take place beginning this year, more will be announced next month and in the newsletters. Willie asked that if a member has any Charity kits at home, the kits should be completed and returned ASAP to clear the list of outstanding kits. She suggested at least finishing the tops and sewing an 1/8th inch seam around the perimeter to stabilize it before turning it in. At the first meeting of the Charity Committee, a list of the five charities that will be supported by CAMEO this year will be agreed on and presented to the members for approval at the October General Meeting. Willie asked that any e-mails sent to her have CAMEO in the subject line to ensure that they will be opened.

Linda Watkins, Quilt Show Coordinator: on the show raffle quilt - is on display at the back of the room, introduced the members of the Raffle Quilt Construction Committee, added that raffle license has been obtained, the tickets printed, and they will be available to the members next month to begin selling. The raffle quilt and tickets will travel to Birch Run for the quilt expo there on September 26-27. On the show Boutique - Start making items or at least thinking about what to make to donate.

Sharon Johnsonbaugh in for Karla Sutton on show Silent Auction – the dimensions of items to be donated are no smaller than 12" and no larger than 24"; permission from designer is necessary if made from a pattern other than those in the public domain. Also, Sharon J. in for Karla S. on show Basket Auction – the auction will be call the Tisket-a-Tasket Basket Auction and members are reminded that they can enter baskets as individuals or in groups. Plans are in the works for a monthly theme to help make guild baskets for the auction, more to come on that. Member Laurie Johnson announced that she will sponsor a yarn basket for the auction and anyone can contribute.

In-house guild activities for this year:

Challenge: Sharon Cratsenburg asked members interested to put together their "Row by Row Experience" patterns and submit for

judging in December; more in the newsletter.

Fabric Swap: sign up to become involved in a Fabric Swap run by Janet Steele, bring in 2 different 8" squares of quality fabric on a theme set each month; more info in newsletter.

Round Robin: Tina Rink announced that any member interested is to provide a square or rectangle block as the start of a Round Robin wallhanging, place it in a paper bag, and bring it to the October meeting, Each month the participants will get a different bag to add a border to what is in the bag; more info in newsletter.

Challenge: Sharon Johnsonbaugh asked members to give her a list of their UFOs at the October meeting and then begin to complete them to bring in at the appointed date; more info in the newsletter.

Show and Tell, Slip of the Keyboard winner was Sybil Derderian, door prize winners, and announcements followed. Adjournment: 9:21.

On sending Program info to other guilds: a prepared 2014=2015 Program list was given to Loreen by Linda W. so that she e-mail it to other guilds along with our workshop schedule and workshop registration form.

On Whistle Stop: ideas welcome for our February program, there is one volunteer now and Janet Steele offered to do one; Loreen needs to secure 2 more.

On submitting payment checks to Treasurer: requested confirmation on when to do so. Janeen replied t that the check and income form should be turned in as soon as Loreen has recorded the payments.

Theresa N., Schedular VP

On survey results: suggestions from surveys described; a Featherweight maintenance speaker was added to the list; Theresa will begin to organize the contacting along the lines of the survey results.

Cindy M., Membership VP

On current membership at 68 including 8 Associate members. Newest members' names were given to committee liaisons where applicable.

On Associate Membership issue: Discussion followed re "Article II, Section 1C, Membership of the Guild shall not exceed one hundred Active Members and ten Associate Members" CAMEO will abide by the law as written, the numbers are caps, there is no reference to percentage in any of that wording.

On the issue of accepting Associate members: Discussion followed re Standing Rule 2, "To become an Associate Member, an Active member must send a written request to the Membership Vice-President prior to the May General Meeting". While that rule in the Bylaws was not adhered to in the last few years by mistake, CAMEO will return to abiding by it as of this meeting. Any reference to Associate status will be removed from the enrollment form as it is not an option open to anyone who wants to join. As reenrollment time nears in the Spring, members will be reminded of how to seek Associate status if that is their choice. Current Associate Members may continue with that status, if so desired, until such time that a return to Active status is desired. It is recommended that all members read Standing Rule #2 of the Bylaws in its entirety.

Carol F., Recording Secretary

On assignment to purchase a coffee urn for the guild to replace the one damaged in the church flood, checked three local stores and got

prices; checked Amazon and got a lower price, ordered from Amazon, cost was \$39.98 inc. S&H, it will be available starting with the Oct. General Meeting.

Sharon J., Corresponding Secretary

Now has a budget to purchase birthday and thank you cards.

On e-mail correspondence: any e-mail correspondence received by Corresponding Sec. should be forwarded to Sharon C.

On her liaison committee, Archives: A member has been assigned to Archives and Sharon will get in contact with her and she will ask Waneda to help with getting the new chairman up to speed.

On the issue of getting pictures developed for a yearly photo album: consensus was that rather than saving photos, they should be put directly onto the web site. Sharon will contact the new Archives chairman with that info.

On her liaison committee Audit: the most recent Audit Report suggested that a policy statement should exist for when the financial records need to be available for the Audit procedure. Consensus: the date is already stipulated in the Bylaws, Article IV Section 4G Subsection 6, ..."surrender the books and records to the Audit Committee at the end of the fiscal year, July 14"., the Audit Committee can begin its work anytime after that date. A check with the current Treasurer indicated that the June 30 statement from the credit union arrives before July 5 so there is plenty of time to reconcile the last month and turn over the books before July 15.

Janeen S., Treasurer

On budget: Janeen will send an article to the newsletter to remind members that a vote of approval will be taken at the Oct. General Meeting and that a copy of the proposed budget to review was e-mailed to all and hard copies were available at the September meeting and will be at the October meeting.

On Audit Report: Sharon reviewed the suggestions in the report and Janeen and Jean will begin to make necessary changes to all. On her research on local guilds and their financial record keeping: Janeen spoke with 3 other local guilds and found that in each case CAMEO's methods were superior to theirs and each asked for more info about how we do our financial records. Janeen feels that there are areas where CAMEO falls short and needs improvement; there will be more discussion in subsequent Board Meetings when more info is available.

On mileage reimbursement: The IRS mileage standard of 56 cents per mile will be followed for requests made by guest speakers; the charity standard of 13 cents per mile will be followed for CAMEO members doing Program/Facilitator work, notations of such should be added to the Program and Facilitator manuals.

Jean S., Assistant Treasurer

On her liaison committees: Door Prize is up and running; Fund Raising has started up and already has at least one idea; at this point something was brought up about the President's quilt but nothing was recorded.

Members at Large Reports on Liaison committees:

Lynda D. - Publicity – Will contact the newly assigned member; Research- Asked Janet Steele to help Laurie Johnson get started; Fanout just beginning to work on that; Hospitality – in President's remarks.

Janet S. – Sharon Johnsonbaugh is heading a challenge on UFOs, Tina Rink is doing Round Robin, Janet has started Fabric Swap and there are 24 signed up to do neutrals for October; Janet also sent in a newsletter article with the themes for the Fabric swap through May.

At this point it was clarified that all items sent for the newsletter are to be sent to newsletter@cameoquilters.org

Linda W. Web- checked with Janeen to see if anything was needed; Sit & Stitch - no one signed up for it so, being a Special Committee, it may not be a go this year; Quilt Show- Raffle Quilt done and will start "touring" for ticket sales at Birch Run for Quilters Expo September 26 and 27; Tickets printed and ready to go to members at October General Meeting; a show publicity postcard mock up was shown; invitation e-mails were sent out to vendors on Sept. 13 and already 10 of the 22 available vendor spaces have been reserved by 6 vendors but a caterer is still being sought.

New Business:

Member only advertising on CAMEO web site issue brought to Board: Janeen will check feasibility and will bring it up at the next meeting. Prorated dues issue: Carol advised that the guild is in violation of Article III Section 4 Subsection C. ... "Dues shall be payable on joining the Guild..." refers to the dues of \$40.00 agreed to by a vote of the members in 2003. There is nothing in the wording that suggests less can be paid at any time during the year. So no matter when the guild is joined, the agreed to amount is payable at that time. Persons interested in joining a guild later in the year could pay guest fees until enrollment time for the next year if they don't want to pay the \$40.00 dues. Consensus: Cindy M. is directed to charge \$40.00 for every new member who joins the guild and to add that notation in the Membership VP manual.



FABRIC EXCHANGE - By Janet Steele

The Fabric Exchange is in full swing! 24 CAMEO members took the plunge and signed up for what will be a fun experience for all! Our beginning theme is NEUTRALS. Here is the process:

- If you want to participate in a given theme, sign up. Before the end of guild meeting, the number of participants will be announced.
- You will cut (2) 8" blocks of different fabric for each participant. Using this first Exchange as an example, there are 24 participants for the "Neutrals" theme. Those who signed up will cut 24 SETS of 2 different 8" blocks in neutral fabrics.
- Bring your blocks to the October meeting in a 1-gallon Zip Lock bag. There will be a table set up and you will place a 2-block set on each of 24 stacks.
- You will find your name on the list and check "DROP OFF" by your name. At the end of the meeting, you will select a stack randomly of what will be 48 different 8" squares and check "PICK UP" on the same list.
- Before guild meeting is over, you will sign up for the following month's theme if you so choose, and the number of participants will be announced just before Show & Tell. That's all there is to it! You'll be like a kid on Halloween as you rifle through your exchange fabrics to see what you've gotten!!!
- 1. Use your interpretation in selecting fabric, but please stay within the theme.
- 2. Use only 100% cotton fabric of quilt-store quality.
- 3. Please be precise in your cutting; err on the side of caution.

These are the themes for the 2014-2015 season. The months represent when the theme fabric is exchanged. (You'll sign up the month before.) At our last guild meeting, we signed up in September, and will bring our fabric in October.

OCTOBER "Put it in Neutral!" (Neutral fabrics)
NOVEMBER "Stop Kidding Around!" (Children's fabric),
and/or "I've Got the Winter Blues!" (Blue fabric) [NOTE:
There will be two lists in October, one for each theme. These
will both be due at November's meeting and will cover November and December. We will have our Christmas Potluck in
December, so there will no exchange that evening.

DECEMBER (Christmas Potluck) **NO EXCHANGE**; but you will sign up for January's theme.

JANUARY "Repro Depot!" (Reproduction, 1930s, or Civil War fabrics) and/or "Love's in the Air!" (Red/white fabric.)

FEBRUARY "Batik Mystique!" (Any color Batik!)

MARCH "Dot, Dot, Not a Lot!" (Any fabric with dots, from pinhead size to bubbles!)

APRIL "Green With Envy!" (Green fabric)

MAY "Trash to Treasure!" (Here's your chance to share your less-than-desirable fabric with your friends! Remember, one person's trash is another person's treasure! [Note: It might be fun to incorporate fellow CAMEO members' fabric from this exchange into a summer project and Show & Tell your creative interpretation when we reconvene in September!]

Quilt Roll-Up Carrier

Supply List

30 - 2 ½" strips by width of fabric (jelly roll-friendly). (IF USING YARDAGE, you'll need a total of 2-1/8 yds. fabric to cut into 30 strips.)

* 1-1/3 yds. Coordinated fabric for lining. Cut a **32" X 48" rectangle**. (NOTE: Choose a fabric with a small print that will not show bobbin thread.)

- * 1-1/3 yds. Muslin. Cut a 32" X 48" rectangle
- * 1-1/2 yds. Batting. Cut a 36" X 50" rectangle
- * 505 Fabric Adhesive Spray

Machingers (Optional)

Thread: Large spool to match lining fabric, coordinated thread for topstitching, neutral thread

- 5 Magnetic Snaps 18mm (can be purchased at Haberman Fabrics in Royal Oak; \$1.19/ea.)
- 3 1/8 yds. Cording to match fabric (cut in half for two pieces 55" long)
- 4 Cord Caps to match cording. (Can be purchased at JoAnn Fabrics.)

Large safety pin or cord pull to pull cord through cord pocket.

NOTE: As an option, you can purchase 1 –1/3 yds. already quilted fabric in a variety of colors at JoAnn Fabrics. If you choose this option, you will NOT purchase the asterisked items, and will only need ¼ yd. batting for handles.

GENERAL SUPPLIES: Machine with power cord and pedal n good working order; walking foot, 6 X 24 ruler, pins, rotary cutter, mat

Exacto Knife (optional) There will be one on site.

Jewelry Mallet or small hammer (optional) There will be one on site.

PREP WORK

- 1. Set 6 strips aside for handle. Cut remaining 24 strips down to 36". Save pieces and bring to class. (NOTE: If you have purchased already-quilted fabric, this is all you need to do for prep work.)
- 2. Press lining fabric and muslin. You will make a "quilt sandwich" of lining, batting, and muslin, and quilt the entire piece of fabric. Generously spray BATTING (not the fabric!) with 505 Spray Adhesive. Center fabric atop lining, leaving an approximate 2" border of batting all around. The best way to do this is to roll up the fabric and unroll atop batting, smoothing down as you go. Turn over and repeat with muslin on other side.
- 3. Quilt entire piece,, making sure thread matches lining, and a neutral thread is used for the muslin side.
