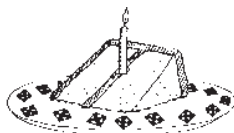

### Calling all members, Join a Sit N Stitch group! - Lori Miller

One of the benefits of membership in CAMEO is getting to know your quilting sisters. A great way to do this is to join or start a small Sit N Stitch group. These smaller groups meet outside of regular Guild Meetings on a weekly or monthly basis in a community hall or in each other's homes to sew, swap, and learn about quilting.

Some folks actually quilt or work on small handwork project when they meet. Other groups work on projects during the month and then get together to swap project boxes, eat and visit. You can make great friends and learn so much from each other in a more intimate or informal setting at a sit n stitch.

Here are a few ideas of the Sit and Stitch groups that you can form:

Round Robin/ Row by Row - a popular type among a group of friends. A center block or row of a quilt is started by each member, then sent to the next quilter who adds to it, then it moves to the next person and so on. When the Swap is complete each quilter has back the original piece with the additions of everyone else in the group.

Block - An exchange among a group of quilters of blocks with some set ground rules as to theme, color, design, etc.

UFO An abbreviation meaning UnFinished Projects. As in "How many UFO's do you have in your sewing room?" Each member brings her own UFO's to work on and get advice and help from the others.

## **Quilts of Valor Foundation**

### **Stitching Sisters**

Terri Bertalan and Sue Baker have started a local chapter of the Quilts of Valor Foundation. The mission of the Quilts of Valor Foundation is to cover ALL combat servicemembers and veterans touched by war with comforting and healing Quilts of Valor. This organization makes quilt tops and presentation cases (like a pillow case) for soldiers near and far, past or present. At the 1905 wedding of Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt, President Teddy Roosevelt gave away the bride. They are looking for volunteers to help the group by cutting material, donating supplies, or sewing up quilt tops.

They meet the 2nd Saturday of every month from 12:00 to 7:00 PM in an open house forum at the Clawson City Hall Community Room at 425 N Main St in Clawson.

They provide cutting supplies, rulers, and irons. You bring your sewing machine, material and thread to make a quilt top or presentation case. These are normally made in twin size quilts and done in red, white and blue materials. They have patterns available. If you are interested, come join them on the next 2nd

### **Local Quilter Works With Enchanted Makeovers to Improve Lives of Girls**

Linda Thielfoldt, award-winning quilter, machine quilting teacher and past presenter at CAMEO was recognized in *Quilters Newsletter Magazine* (August/September 2012) for her work with Enchanted Makeovers, a nonprofit organization dedicated to enhancing the lives of women and children in shelters by coordinating events, programs and shelter makeovers.

Alternatives for Girls in Detroit, a shelter that helps homeless and high-risk girls and young women, was the recipient of a makeover from Enchanted Makeovers. The facility had one of its bedrooms redecorated as a sewing room equipped with two new Baby Lock Grace sewing machines. Linda is teaching the girls to sew and she worked with other local quilters to make 30 beautiful bed quilts for the makeover.

## **Copyright and Permission - Dorothy Strefling**

It was brought home to me recently how important it is to get permission to use someone's copyrighted pattern. Maggie Smith and I entered 2 quilts in the ASQ Grand Rapids show. (No, we didn't win anything, but it was still exciting to see the quilts and hear the nice comments of the show guests). One of the requirements to enter our quilts in the show was that permission had to be obtained from the pattern designer for each quilt. It was very simple to send an e-mail to the information on the pattern and I had no trouble getting approval to enter my quilt based on their design. The pattern designers were excited that one of their patterns was used to make a show quilt. In the future, I plan to put the pattern designer's name on the label of my quilts. It's only fair that they also get credit. If you've ever tried to design your own quilt, you know what I mean. It's a lot of work!

Also I want to give former CAMEO Member, Jean Forrester, a big thank you for again allowing CAMEO to use her copyrighted Rose on our show bookmarks. She worked very hard on the design of our Show Raffle Quilt in 2011 and the center Rose was stunning. Although she is too busy at present to rejoin, she always has a soft spot for her CAMEO friends!

## **Instructions for registering a quilt in the 2013 CAMEO Quilt Show**

1. Thank you for entering your quilt in the 2013 CAMEO Quilt Show. **Fill in one registration form for each quilt item submitted.** Fill in the top half of the form. Do not fill in the Registration Number. This will be done later. Return this form on or before March 1, 2013 to the Receiving Committee Chairperson listed on the bottom of the form. Quilts entered in previous CAMEO Quilt Shows cannot be entered. You may also want to take the time to register this quilt with the Michigan State University Museum's Michigan Quilt Project. *You can download their application at this website: [http://www.museum.msu.edu/glqc/programs\\_mqp\\_register.html](http://www.museum.msu.edu/glqc/programs_mqp_register.html)*
2. Entries submitted by non-CAMEO Guild members must include a \$5.00 entry fee.
3. When you drop-off your quilt to the Receiving Committee, every quilt entered must include two photos of the quilt with the Registrant's Name and Quilt Title on the back of the photos. The Receiving Committee will write the registration number on the photo back. The second photo you will have to bring back when you are picking up your quilt along with your receipt.
4. Every quilt must have a label sewn on by the registrant to include Title of the quilt and Registrant's Name.
5. Wall hangings smaller than 42" square will be pinned for hanging.
6. Quilts larger than 42" square must have a four inch sleeve on the back for hanging,
7. Quilts will be hung by entry classification, such as bed size quilts, challenge quilts, wall hanging, etc. Please check only one category for each entry on the front of this form. One Registration Form is required for each quilt entered.
8. Print what you want to appear in the Program catalog for the quilt show. Space is limited to 25 words or less, so please be brief. The committee reserves the right to edit. Some ideas would be to include quilt pattern, type of material & batting used, how you came to make this particular quilt, any special significance of the work, if the quilt has been included in any juried shows, special stitching, inspiration, how long you have been quilting, the product of a class you took. If the quilt is an heirloom, tell how it got to you, if it is a family piece, list information about where it came from, who stitched it, the date the quilt was created, etc.
9. Leave the bottom half of the form blank, and any spaces for the registration number. The Receiving Committee will assign registration numbers. The bottom half of the form will be used when you drop off the quilt to the Receiving Committee at the Madison Place on Thursday, May 9, 2013 between 11:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
10. The quilt show will end at 4:00 p.m. Saturday, May 11, 2013. At this time, the quilts will be taken down and returned to the Receiving Committee. Your quilt should be picked up from the Receiving Committee between 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m., on Saturday, May 11, 2013. You will need to bring your receipt and the photo with the Registration information on the back with you to claim your quilt. If you cannot pick up your quilt and are asking someone else to pick it up, please inform the Receiving Committee Chairpersons ahead of time. Only the Registrants will be able to pick up their quilts unless arrangements have been made in advance. See page 1 of registration form.

### **Quilt Categories and Terms (for hanging and voting purposes)**

#### **Categories**

**Bed Quilts** – Designed to be used as a bed covering or throw. Crib quilts, lap quilts, quilts for youth beds, and other small bed quilts are included in this category.

**Wall Hangings** – Designed to be hung for decorative purposes.

**Small Quilts** – Includes fabric postcards.

#### **Techniques**

**Pieced** – Quilts more than 50 percent pieced by hand or machine.

**Appliqué** – Quilts more than 50 percent appliquéd.

**Mixed** – Any quilts that are a combination or piecing and appliqué and /or other techniques so that less than 50 percent of the quilt is pieced or appliquéd.

**Other** – Any quilts that do not fit into the pieced or appliquéd categories: such as whole cloth, crazy quilt, network, embroidered, stenciled, painted, etc.

#### **Quilting**

**Hand** – Must be entirely quilted by hand. No machine quilting permitted.

**Machine** – Quilted on a domestic machine, either hand or computer guided.

**Mixed** – Hand and machine techniques.
