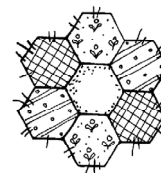
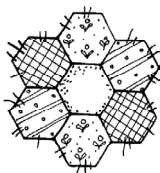

I hope everyone enjoyed September's Michigan Shop Hop. I would like to thank my husband for taking me all over Michigan this last year. We had some nice times together even when Gerty my Garmin led us to some dead ends. Lesson learned call the shops first to make sure they are still open. If you are in the area of any of the quilt shops, please stop in and let them know you are a CAMEO member.

October 20th meeting will have Maxine Johns do a lecture on the history of quilting. Also, Mike Klicek will be at the meeting to sell his mini quilt patterns. There are four to choose from and you can view them on CAMEO's website under Calendar. Each pattern costs \$8.00. The cost for the class is \$15.00 for members and \$20.00 for non-members. The registration form is also posted on our website (www.cameoquilters.org). We still have room. Get your form to me ASAP.

I will also need to know by our October meeting if anyone else is interested in taking Sherrie Jaqua's class called Bouquet Asymmetrical Block. The cost of the November 17 workshop is \$45.00 for members and \$55.00 for non-members. Pre-cut kits will be available in several color ways for a 72" square quilt center or a 63"x81" quilt center for \$85.00 each. If you wish to purchase your own fabric a supply list will be available. Also needed is the Tri-Rec Tool by EZ Quilting which makes cutting half rectangles easy and you will be using the Rec part of this two part tool and also needed is the Omnigrad 96L Ruler for cutting trapezoids from strips. Borders can be added for up to a king size quilt. Fabric for borders and binding may be purchased at the day of the workshop or you can purchase them elsewhere when your top is finished.

Please look on our website for the color samples for the precut kits. Once your registration fee is paid I can send you a material list if you wish to purchase your own fabric. We have been having fun placing the sample block she sent me. Sherrie's lecture on Color for our Thursday night guild meeting sounds very helpful for all.

December will be our potluck. I can't wait to see what is in store for us.

Kay Nickols will be at our guild on January 17 with a lecture called, "A Great Not One but Three Trunk show". We will have a workshop on January 19 called Wonderful On Fabric Quilts. The registration flyer will be posted soon on our website.

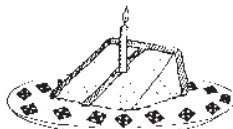

This year our guild will be sponsoring the Gift of Life program at Henry Ford Hospital and Quilts of Valor. These will be our ongoing charities. The other charities we voted on will have a designated month.

HAVEN House will be for the month of November, pillowcases and grieving envelopes will be on Charity day in February, and the Layette program at the Methodist Church will be in April.

Next month we will have more HAVEN House bags ready for you to pick up. There are a few that are already made and just need to be filled. The deadline for them to be returned is the November meeting.

The committee is preparing kits for the items listed above. However we could use your help. We would like donations of fabric (100% cotton).

We could use red, white and blue for the quilts of valor. Also kid's fabric to make pillowcases. For the pillowcases we need 3/4yd. (WoF) for the body, and 1/4yd. (WoF) for the cuff.

If you would like to make your own Quilts of Valor quilt, there are guidelines. The fabric must be cotton, must be machine quilted not tied, and regular backing not a bed sheet. The size of the quilt must be (width) 55" – 72"(length) 65" – 90". So the size should be any where from 55"X 65" to 72"X 90". The quilt is to be washed and put in a pillowcase. We have a wonderful lady in our guild who loves to make bags and I am sure she will not mind making pillowcases for these quilts. If you need to know more about Quilts of Valor, I will be happy to give you the name of our contact person. There is a group that meets at the Clawson Community Center on the 2nd Saturday of the month at 12:00 – 6:00. All are welcome.

New Business.

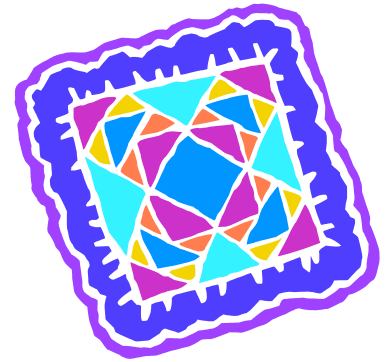
Barb Lusk who is holding the beginning quilting classes is asking for the guild to pay the \$25 fee at the church per class for a total of \$125.

Description: Michael Klicek has been quilting for approximately eight years and making miniature quilts for approximately two years. His work can be described as a “melding of Jacqueline de Jonge and George Siciliano’s work.” All of his quilt designs are originals. There will be three patterns you can choose from. The patterns are: Aria One, rated easy (1*), Sonata, medium (2*s), and Circling Geese, rated hard (3*s). Each pattern will include complete instructions, a list of material requirements, and all paper piecing templates. These miniature quilts can be made from your fabric scraps or 3-4 fat quarters. She is owner of The Sunshine Quilt shop in Oscoda, Michigan. The block is called "Bouquet". It is a block that was popular in the Art Deco era. Think of the small nine patch block as a little nosegay of flowers with green triangles acting as leaves around the flowers and the green stem below. This block can be twisted and turned to make dozens of layouts.

Instructions for registering a quilt in the 2013 CAMEO Quilt Show

1. Thank you for entering your quilt in the 2013 CAMEO Quilt Show. **Fill in one registration form for each quilt item submitted.** Fill in the top half of the form. Do not fill in the Registration Number. This will be done later. Return this form on or before March 1, 2013 to the Receiving Committee Chairperson listed on the bottom of the form. Quilts entered in previous CAMEO Quilt Shows cannot be entered. You may also want to take the time to register this quilt with the Michigan State University Museum's Michigan Quilt Project. *You can download their application at this website: http://www.museum.msu.edu/glqc/programs_mqp_register.html*
2. Entries submitted by non-CAMEO Guild members must include a \$5.00 entry fee.
3. When you drop-off your quilt to the Receiving Committee, every quilt entered **must include two photos of the quilt** with the Registrant's Name and Quilt Title on the back of the photos. The Receiving Committee will write the registration number on the photo back. The second photo you will have to bring back when you are picking up your quilt along with your receipt.
4. Every quilt must have a label sewn on by the registrant to include Title of the quilt and Registrant's Name.
5. Wall hangings smaller than 42" square will be pinned for hanging.
6. Quilts larger than 42" square must have a four inch sleeve on the back for hanging,
7. Quilts will be hung by entry classification, such as bed size quilts, challenge quilts, wall hanging, etc. Please check only one category for each entry on the front of this form. One Registration Form is required for each quilt entered.
8. Print what you want to appear in the Program catalog for the quilt show. **Space is limited to 25 words or less**, so please be brief. The committee reserves the right to edit. Some ideas would be to include quilt pattern, type of material & batting used, how you came to make this particular quilt, any special significance of the work, if the quilt has been included in any juried shows, special stitching, inspiration, how long you have been quilting, the product of a class you took. If the quilt is an heirloom, tell how it got to you, if it is a family piece, list information about where it came from, who stitched it, the date the quilt was created, etc.
9. Leave the bottom half of the form blank, and any spaces for the registration number. The Receiving Committee will assign registration numbers. The bottom half of the form will be used when you drop off the quilt to the Receiving Committee at the Madison Place on Thursday, May 9, 2013 between 11:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
10. The quilt show will end at 4:00 p.m. Saturday, May 11, 2013. At this time, the quilts will be taken down and returned to the Receiving Committee. Your quilt should be picked up from the Receiving Committee between 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m., on Saturday, May 11, 2013. **You will need to bring your receipt and the photo with the Registration information on the back with you to claim your quilt.** If you cannot pick up your quilt and are asking someone else to pick it up, please inform the Receiving Committee Chairpersons ahead of time. Only the Registrants will be able to pick up their quilts unless arrangements have been made in advance. See page 1 of registration form.

Quilt Categories and Terms (for hanging and voting purposes)

Categories

Bed Quilts – Designed to be used as a bed covering or throw. Crib quilts, lap quilts, quilts for youth beds, and other small bed quilts are included in this category.

Wall Hangings – Designed to be hung for decorative purposes.

Small Quilts – Includes fabric postcards.

Techniques

Pieced – Quilts more than 50 percent pieced by hand or machine.

Appliqué – Quilts more than 50 percent appliquéd.

Mixed – Any quilts that are a combination or piecing and appliquéd and /or other techniques so that less than 50 percent of the quilt is pieced or appliquéd.

Other – Any quilts that do not fit into the pieced or appliquéd categories: such as whole cloth, crazy quilt, network, embroidered, stenciled, painted, etc.

Quilting

Hand – Must be entirely quilted by hand. No machine quilting permitted.

Machine – Quilted on a domestic machine, either hand or computer guided.

Mixed – Hand and machine techniques.
