
QUOTE OF THE MONTH




Membership Chairperson



We are in NEED of one yard cuts of children's fabric to make the pillowcases. If you have any fun type fabric that a child would like, would you please donate to us. To make a pillowcase you need 3/4yd. for the body, 1/4yd. for the cuff and 3-4" for the accent piece. We are also in need of fabric that we could use for the Quilts of Valor. Fabric that is red, white and blue.

On Charity Day, we will do demos in the morning on making the pillow cases, grieving envelops and backpacks that we fill for the Haven House. Haven House really likes the backpacks and we have a lot of the material to make them. So we thought that Charity Day would be a good time to make them. Maggie Smith will be on hand to show you how it is done.

Show Biz News from the Quilt Show Committee

If you intend to have your show entry quilt long armed and returned to you in time for CAMEO's May quilt show, you need to know that the deadline to get the top to either Barb, Ruth or Maggie is no later than March 6 in order to get back in time to add the sleeve, binding, and label. Check the newsletter for the business contact information for each. Don't despair. You still have the rest of January, all of February and the first week of March to get your entry done.

Why, oh why, do I have to submit my quilt registration form by March 1 when my quilt won't even be done by then?

Answer: The information you provide on the form is needed for:

1. Registration and Receiving to file the info, compile it for the Catalog Committee so it can start its work. prepare the display tags, organize the info for a smooth receiving and return of the quilts.
2. Catalog has to type up the catalog copy in time to meet the printer's deadline.
3. Layout has to used the approximate sizes to know how to locate the racks and plan how the quilts will be displayed.
4. Lobby to prepare the Viewer's Choice ballots with the appropriate categories for voting.
5. Publicity has to advertise the number of quilts in our show and get the flyers printed and distributed.
6. Signage has to know the categories of the quilts to be displayed to be able to prepare the signs in our venue.
7. Special Guild Displays has to know what is coming in so they can decide how and where to use it.
8. Silent Auction needs to know what is coming in so that the format for the auction can be organized.

Remember, the show doesn't happen overnight; a lot of prep work goes into it involving a lot of CAMEO members who depend on you to help them have time to get their work done before the show. You can submit more than one quilt, just fill a form for each. You can make copies of the pages in your online newsletter or you can pick up blanks at a guild meeting. Be sure to read the back of the form. By May 9 you need two photos of your entry, each entry must have a sleeve if larger than 42", and each entry must have a label. Silent Auction and Special Guild Display can use the same registration forms, just designate at the top where the form is to go.

Quilting Sisters Quilts at Port Huron Museum - Doris Crowl




