

Program News - Sharon Cratsenburg





Resources for Quilters - Linda Watkins

There is a Free iPad app called BlockFab-HD. It provides a library of blocks and lets the user select the finished size and how many blocks you want to make. It then tells the user how much fabric is needed and cutting instructions. Very cool.

The second resource is called Block of the Day. Find it at blockoftheday@quiltpro.com and once registered you get a block in your email every day. The blocks vary from pieced or paper piecing block. Sometimes it is a quilting motif. Again this is free.

Quilt Show Update - Linda Watkins, Core Committee

Reminder: Thursday March 21st is the deadline for entering quilts in the show. Registration forms are in your newsletters to copy (or download and print), or you can get them at the March meeting.

Silent Auction mini-quilts require a different form and it is in your newsletter.

March 21, the night of the March Guild Meeting is the last day to submit registration forms for your quilt entries. The quilt DOES NOT have to be finished before then, but the form is needed by 8 different committees to get their pre-show jobs done. Please read both sides of the form. Be sure to include either the exact width if known or an approximate width it will be when finished. It will be appreciated if you don't wait until the last date to submit your registrations.

Don't forget, you will need to have two photos of each quilt. These do not need to be included with the quilt registration form if you don't have them at that time. But if you do have them please include them with your registration form. A label is to be located in the bottom left corner of each quilt.

Dear CAMEO's,



The library should be one of the busiest locales in the guild. Unless you have experienced the thrill of seeing it in its entirety, you have not yet appreciated it to the fullest.



To register non-quilted items, please complete the form below and return it to Joline Bowdich, committee chair, at the next guild meeting or forward the information to her via mail, email, or phone. She stated that quilt registrations are due March 21st reminding people that the quilt does not have to be completed by this date to be entered into the show. Linda stated that there were 50 members and guests were present at the meeting with 2 new members joining at the meeting making a total of 80 members.

Miniature/Small Quilt Silent Auction -

"It's spring again, and birds on the wing again, start to sing again, your mini-quilts are due!" (apologies to Cole Porter)

Well, here we are, it's March and the Silent Auction committee is looking forward to being wowed by your mini/small quilt. We have already received a number of amazing quilts and are so thankful to our generous CAMEO members who have donated or have promised to donate a quilt.

You can bring your quilt to the March 21 meeting and give it, along with your completed form (included in this newsletter) to Rosemary Spatafora. (Or make special arrangements with Rosemary.) We will then photograph your quilt and the photo will be included on the Silent Auction bid form that will accompany your quilt at the Quilt Show.

There will be an option for people to "Buy It Now" on the bid form. So if you see a quilt that you really want, and you don't want to wait until Saturday after 3 p.m. - you can just inform the Silent Auction staff that you would like to purchase the quilt for 120% of the stated value. (So if a quilt's value is \$50 and you "Buy It Now" you could purchase it for \$60 and take it immediately.)

Margaret Smith will contact winning bid holders who are not present on Saturday afternoon when the auction closes at 3 p.m. All winning bidders who are present at the time will be able to purchase and take their quilts with them.

We will accept cash and checks for Silent Auction purchases - no credit cards.

National Quilting Day

The National Quilting Association began sponsoring National Quilting Day with a resolution passed by members attending the 22nd Annual Show in Lincoln, Nebraska, in June 1991. The third Saturday in March (March 16 this year) is officially designated as National Quilting Day, but quilters are flexible and we love a celebration — especially when fabric is involved! So over the years, observance of National Quilting Day has unofficially been expanded to the whole month of March.

CAMEO's National Quilting Day celebration will be held on April 20 this year because of our guild retreat in March.

Here are some ways that quilters celebrate National Quilting Day:

- They make it a service day and work on a quilt for their favorite cause — national projects such as ABC Quilts, Project Linus, or one of the great ones for the troops.
- Some organize an exhibit for their local library or historical society and exhibit quilts, tools, books, etc.
- Some donate quilts to a local shelter for battered/abused women with children — a log cabin 'home' for those without a real home.
- Some make quilts for VA Hospitals — lap quilts for invalids.
- Some organize a quilt history day or a quilt documentation project.
- If a military facility is nearby, some contact the social services there to see where to give quilts or how to send to soldiers or their families.
- Some contact local churches to see if someone in congregation needs a little home love.
- Some check with a local hospital about giving to first baby born on National Quilt Day, 2011.
- Some donate quilts to nursing homes for those who don't have much, or are newly without their own home may be a good place to donate quilts.
- Some work on a quilt with a school, 4-H, or scout group, or spend the day passing along their love of quilting to their children, grandchildren, nieces, nephews, or neighbors.
- Some contact a local senior citizens group or facility and organize a show and tell of their quilts. Or sponsor a sewing day to make lap quilts for seniors.
- Some organize a stitch-in, banquet, workshop, lecture, retreat, bus trip or even a shop hop.
- And you can always celebrate on your own! Visit your favorite quilt shops, pass your love of quilting on to a child or friend, or spend a few hours sewing or reading your favorite quilt book.

Instructions for registering a quilt in the 2013 CAMEO Quilt Show

1. Thank you for entering your quilt in the 2013 CAMEO Quilt Show. **Fill in one registration form for each quilt item submitted.** Fill in the top half of the form. Do not fill in the Registration Number. This will be done later. Return this form on or before March 1, 2013 to the Receiving Committee Chairperson listed on the bottom of the form. Quilts entered in previous CAMEO Quilt Shows cannot be entered. You may also want to take the time to register this quilt with the Michigan State University Museum's Michigan Quilt Project. *You can download their application at this website: http://www.museum.msu.edu/glqc/programs_mqp_register.html*
2. Entries submitted by non-CAMEO Guild members must include a \$5.00 entry fee.
3. When you drop-off your quilt to the Receiving Committee, every quilt entered **must include two photos of the quilt** with the Registrant's Name and Quilt Title on the back of the photos. The Receiving Committee will write the registration number on the photo back. The second photo you will have to bring back when you are picking up your quilt along with your receipt.
4. Every quilt must have a label sewn on by the registrant to include Title of the quilt and Registrant's Name.
5. Wall hangings smaller than 42" square will be pinned for hanging.
6. Quilts larger than 42" square must have a four inch sleeve on the back for hanging,
7. Quilts will be hung by entry classification, such as bed size quilts, challenge quilts, wall hanging, etc. Please check only one category for each entry on the front of this form. One Registration Form is required for each quilt entered.
8. Print what you want to appear in the Program catalog for the quilt show. **Space is limited to 25 words or less**, so please be brief. The committee reserves the right to edit. Some ideas would be to include quilt pattern, type of material & batting used, how you came to make this particular quilt, any special significance of the work, if the quilt has been included in any juried shows, special stitching, inspiration, how long you have been quilting, the product of a class you took. If the quilt is an heirloom, tell how it got to you, if it is a family piece, list information about where it came from, who stitched it, the date the quilt was created, etc.
9. Leave the bottom half of the form blank, and any spaces for the registration number. The Receiving Committee will assign registration numbers. The bottom half of the form will be used when you drop off the quilt to the Receiving Committee at the Madison Place on Thursday, May 9, 2013 between 11:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.
10. The quilt show will end at 4:00 p.m. Saturday, May 11, 2013. At this time, the quilts will be taken down and returned to the Receiving Committee. Your quilt should be picked up from the Receiving Committee between 4:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m., on Saturday, May 11, 2013. **You will need to bring your receipt and the photo with the Registration information on the back with you to claim your quilt.** If you cannot pick up your quilt and are asking someone else to pick it up, please inform the Receiving Committee Chairpersons ahead of time. Only the Registrants will be able to pick up their quilts unless arrangements have been made in advance. See page 1 of registration form.

Quilt Categories and Terms (for hanging and voting purposes)

Categories

Bed Quilts – Designed to be used as a bed covering or throw. Crib quilts, lap quilts, quilts for youth beds, and other small bed quilts are included in this category.

Wall Hangings – Designed to be hung for decorative purposes.

Small Quilts – Includes fabric postcards.

Techniques

Pieced – Quilts more than 50 percent pieced by hand or machine.

Appliqué – Quilts more than 50 percent appliquéd.

Mixed – Any quilts that are a combination or piecing and appliqué and /or other techniques so that less than 50 percent of the quilt is pieced or appliquéd.

Other – Any quilts that do not fit into the pieced or appliquéd categories: such as whole cloth, crazy quilt, network, embroidered, stenciled, painted, etc.

Quilting

Hand – Must be entirely quilted by hand. No machine quilting permitted.

Machine – Quilted on a domestic machine, either hand or computer guided.

Mixed – Hand and machine techniques.
