First, I want to thank everyone for all their well-wishes, cards, offers of help and concerns. It is very much appreciated. I underwent surgery at Beaumont on Monday, March 25th. All went well and now I'm home on STRICT NO WEIGHT BEARING (no walking, no driving, etc.) for a minimum of 8 weeks. After that period of time, I will undergo a second surgery to have the hardware removed. And then I will begin the physical therapy part of my recovery and rehabilitation.

After thinking it over, consulting with my doctors and my husband, and weighing all the obligations and commitment as President of CAMEO Quilters Guild, I felt the best decision for me and for the Guild would be for me to resign. So with all of that being said, I have submitted my resignation to the Executive Board, effective immediately. My focus is and has to be on my health. I had hoped to return in May but the more I have learned about what I will need to do with regard to recovery and rehabilitation, it just isn't possible for me to fulfill my obligation to CAMEO

I want to thank you all for this opportunity to serve as your President over the past months, but considering my current situation, the best decision for me is to step down as President of CAMEO.





Lemony Raisin Bars

Recipe from Betty Rizzo

- 2 cups Sun Maid Raisins (*see Betty's note below*)
- 1 (14 oz.) can Eagle Brand Sweetened Condensed Milk (NOT evaporated milk)
- 1 Tablespoon lemon juice
- 1 Tablespoon grated lemon rind
- 1 cup butter or margarine, softened
- 1 1/3 cups firmly packed brown sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 1/2 cups oats
- 1 cup chopped Diamond walnuts

1. Heat oven to 375. In saucepan, combine raisins, sweetened condensed milk, lemon juice and lemon rind. Cook and stir over medium heat just until bubbly. Cool slightly.
2. In bowl, combine butter, brown sugar and vanilla; beat well. Add flour, baking soda and salt; mix well. Stir in oats and walnuts.
3. Reserve 2 cups of oat mixture for topping. Press remaining mixture into 13 x 9 inch greased pan. Spread raisin mixture to within 1/2 inch of edges. Sprinkle with reserved oat mixture; press lightly.
4. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until golden brown. Cool. Makes 48 bars.

Betty's note: I substituted 1 cup raisins and 1 cup blueberry cranraisins for the 2 cups raisins.

Linda Watkins talked about the quilt show explaining that the quilts need to have a label on the quilt. The label should be on the lower left hand side, but if the label is already installed that it would not be a problem.

Dorothy Streffling asked for members to sign up to work at the show. Please see Dorothy to sign up. Dorothy stated that we have over 1600 raffle tickets sold and that we need to try to increase the sales as this is how we fund the guilds activities.

Jolene chairperson for special displays at the quilt show asked that form be filled out for special displays.

Carol talked about the retreat.

Tina Rink spoke about when CAMEO is celebrating National Quilting Day, April 20th. The time is from 9:00am till 4:00pm. She needs a head count as lunch is provided by the guild and she needs to let the church know so they can set up the tables for our sewing enjoyment. If you have not done so, please let Tina know that you are planning on attending.

Carla asked that nomination and elections form be filled out and turned into her.

Show and tell began at 8:40pm.

Meeting adjourned at 9:00pm.

CAMEO Board Meeting - April 3, 2013

QUILT SHOW NEWS-March 28, 2013 (contact Dorothy Streffling or Sandy Peiss with questions)

Dear CAMEO Sisters, Just 6 weeks now until our show (closer to 4 when you get this newsletter)

Below is some information you need.

1. Show Info: Thursday, May 9 is set up day. Show days are Friday, May 10 (10a-6p) and Saturday, May 11 (10a-4p). We can get into the building at 7:30 a.m. and must be out at 6 p.m.
2. On Set up Day snacks, lunch and beverages will be provided courtesy of Neil Streffling, P.C.
3. Special Thanks to family and friends. We want to be sure to thank all of the spouses and non-members who help us with the show. There will be a clipboard passed around for you to indicate anyone who is helping either behind the scenes or at the show. They will be acknowledged in our catalog and newsletter. You can send Shannon names by e-mail as well.
4. At our April 18 meeting you will have another opportunity to sign up for "Best Wishes" for \$2.00 to help defray catalog costs. If you signed up earlier but did not turn in your money, please do so at the April meeting. If you won't be at the April meeting and want to donate, please let Shannon Boardman know by phone or e-mail.
5. We are hard at work filling staffing positions for the set up and 2 show days. You may have already received a call. We will be circulating the sign up sheets for the remaining time slots at the April 18 meeting. Please sign up for at least 1 job (more if possible). Brief descriptions of all jobs were mailed or e-mailed to you earlier.

6. Registration and Receiving Notes (pls contact Linda Watkins w/questions)

The quilt show is almost here, so here is what you need to know when dropping off and picking up your quilts. Don't forget you will need to have two pictures of each piece you have entered. Each entry needs a label with your name and the name of the quilt sewn on the back of quilt. Tote bag or sweatshirt entries should have a paper label pinned inside. Experienced quilt show entrants suggest if you have more than one entry, use a laundry basket or rolling suitcase to bring in your quilts. There will be a storage area if you want to leave these at the show. Make sure these are labeled with your name. If you need assistance bringing in your quilts please let us know. We will be happy to help you. When you pick up your quilts, remember to bring the pick-up form with the picture attached. If someone other than yourself is picking up your quilt please let the committee know when you drop off the quilt.

Drop Off

1. We will begin accepting quilts Thursday May 9th at 9:00 A.M. Please use the door on the east side of the Madison Place Conference Center when entering. There will be signs outside the building.
2. When you enter sign in and pick up a number. While waiting you are invited to help with set up, or wait in chairs provided.
3. When your number is called, you will receive your paperwork and take that and your quilt(s) to an empty table. At this point a committee member will fill in paper work, attach your pictures to the forms, and do a quick measurement and inspection of your quilt.
4. Hanging personnel will take the quilts as they are checked in.
5. You will leave the Receiving area with your pick up form with a picture attached.
5. If you have time, please stay and help with show set up.

Pick-Up

1. Quilt pick up will begin after 4:00 P.M. on Saturday May 11th. You will need your quilt pick up form(s) with the photo attached.
2. If you left a laundry basket or suitcase in the storage area, pick it up.
3. Find your quilt(s) on the alphabetically labeled tables.
4. Bring your quilt to the check out tables for a committee member to check out.
7. Special Guild Displays - if you have other items to drop off on May 9 (quilt racks, etc) there will be a designated area/check in point for those items as well.
8. Hanging Sleeve Help: Ladies, don't forget, Dorothy Streffling will have muslin and her sewing machine at the April meeting if you want any assistance with making or attaching hanging sleeves. She is also available Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons/evenings at her home if you need help. Just call or e-mail her.
