
Membership Chairperson

CAMEO Charity Committee News -



Caron Mosey Hand Quilting Workshop – Register Now!

Hand quilting is Caron's specialty. While many quilters are shying away from hand quilting, it is making a comeback! If you have never hand quilted before, this is your opportunity! As a group, we will put a quilt in an "old school" frame and practice quilting together. Becoming proficient takes practice. In no time, the "rocking stitch" will become automatic! Learn how to choose the right quilting designs to enhance your pattern, select the right batting for your project; learn how to properly mark your quilt top, and how to baste your quilt without ruining your knees.

Our main goal for this workshop is to get you QUILTING BY HAND (it is not to complete a project in class)!

Resources for Quilters - *Linda Watkins*

There is a Free iPad app called BlockFab-HD. It provides a library of blocks and lets the user select the finished size and how many blocks you want to make. It then tells the user how much fabric is needed and cutting instructions. Very cool.

The second resource is called Block of the Day. Find it at blockoftheday@quiltpro.com and once registered you get a block in your email every day. The blocks vary from pieced or paper piecing block. Sometimes it is a quilting motif. Again this is free.


Miniature/Small Quilt Silent Auction -

CAMEO General Meeting - April 18, 2011

Linda Draudt began the meeting at 7:03pm and announced that the executive board appointed Sharon Cratensburg to fill the vacancy of President.

Sharon asked for corrections to the minutes for the general and board meeting as printed in the newsletter. The minutes were accepted as printed.

Dorothy Streffling will be passing around a good wishes clip board and volunteer sign up sheets for the quilt show.

Sharon announced our speaker, Carole Carroll. Carole began her lecture and trunk show about Miracle Quilts. Carole finished her trunk show at 8:08pm.

Sharon resumed the meeting at 8:30pm.

Linda Draudt announced that 59 members present at the meeting. And that we had a total of 10 new members for the year. She also announced that member application will be printed in the May newsletter and that committees will be filled by first come-first served method.

Carla, chairperson for nomination and elections, announced that she is requesting people to volunteer people for board positions.

Sharon announced that the May workshop is on May 18th and the title of the workshop is Mystery of the Star. You'll create stars with not waste.

Susan gave the treasurer report.

Tina Rink announced that we will celebrate National Quilt Day on April 20th and taco bar lunch will be provided.

Theresa Nielson announced that the red, white, and blue block challenge will continue.

Chuck and Sharon announced that the 1/2 square triangle exchange will continue through the summer.

Linda Wallace thanked everyone for the Layette Program and that all of the Quilts of Valor quilts should be turned in at the May's meeting whether they are finished or not. Unfinished items will be turned into the local chapter to complete the items. Also, just a reminder, to be eligible for a chance to win a quilt top quilted by Barb Lusk you must do a charity project.

Carol Gilbert announced that 31 people attended the retreat and that next year's retreat dates have been set for May 2nd, 3rd, and 4th.

Dorothy announced that there will be approximately 200 quilts. Also she requested that if you know if one of your quilts will not be finished to let her know. Dorothy announced that we need volunteers to fill time slots for working the quilt show. She announced that on May 9th the rack set up will begin at 7:30am and Quilts check in times is 9am till 4pm. Dorothy announced that workers should show up 30 minutes before their schedule time. On Saturday we need to be out of the hall by 6pm or we pay a penalty, please be there between 4pm - 5pm to pick up your quilts.

If you are unable to drop off your quilts on Thursday before 4pm make arrangements with another member. Chuck, who lives blocks away from the hall, has volunteered to take your quilts in for you.

Dorothy announced that there will be a DVD of the quilt show and if you would like to pre-order the DVD send Ruth McCormick an email. The cost of the DVD is \$15 and \$2 goes to the guild.

Show and Tell began at 9:10pm.

Meeting adjourned at 9:35pm.

CAMEO Board Meeting - April 25, 2013 - submitted by *Lucy Lesperance, acting secretary for Chuck Blanchard*

Meeting called to order by President Sharon Cratsenburg at 7:13.

All accounted for except Janeen Sharpe, Debbie Ager and Chuck Blanchard (gone to Paducah).

Minutes from Board Meeting of April 4, 2013 approved and accepted.

President Cratsenburg presented the follow for discussion:

A request was asked just this week to purchase lapel pins to sell at the quilt show. The cost for 100 pins is approximately \$550 with most of the cost (\$150) for shipping. The board discussed and felt since we still have pins from a previous time and at this late notice before the quilt show they should not be ordered. This should be something brought up at the beginning of planning for the show or have it as a guild fund raiser next year. Quilt show pins, will not be ordered but remaining ones can be sold by the Boutique at the show.

A member requested the use of the CAMEO embroidery logo. Sharon wasn't sure if this could be used for personal use or only by CAMEO. From this a discussion came about using it as a possible fundraiser for the guild. CAMEO embroidery logo needs to be found and to be used by the Guild for fundraisers, possibly a new name tag design.

Audit positions need to be appointed or volunteers come forward in May. Audit needs to be done in June, and positions should have been appointed in February. This appointment was missed being done in Jan and will be taken care of at the May meeting.

Boutique Preview went well, sold \$192.00 worth of items. Items not sold at the Quilt Show will be brought to the May meeting for your second chance.

Hospitality Committee concerns regarding the committees and workshops not replenishing items that they used at events other than general meetings. It was decided that the users other than those at the general quilt meetings should be accountable to the Hospitality Committee for the items used; and that the Chairman of Hospitality make it easier by itemizing the contents of the Hospitality bins and communicating with the various other users to achieve this result. Also, to submit purchase invoices to the treasurer for reimbursement. The budget will be increased for hospitality.

Committee Chairperson should be chosen by a vote of the total committee if more than one member requests to be chair.

May speaker will be Joan DeRue on May 16th on fabrics and color, reproduction fabrics. A sample was not submitted to her preventing the Program Facilitator to show her work to encourage members to sign up for the workshop. Consequently, not enough signed up for a workshop so it has been canceled.

Therefore, the workshop date of May 18th will be an open sew day for the guild members finishing up all those UFOs or whatever: and the amount of \$5.00 for the use of the room is requested.

VP Scheduler, Lori Miller, presented the partial itinerary for the speakers and workshops for next year, and will be presented to the Guild when completed. New ideas were discussed, look for a surprise in September. Signups for workshops will be offered with more lead time.

VP membership, Linda D-r-a-u-d-t, spoke to making changes in the Application To Join form. Please read it thoroughly. First come, first served for the committees, and some numbers of committee members were changed.

Corresponding secretary Lucy Lesperance suggested Hearts and Hugs and Corresponding Secretary positions be united. Not accepted.

Susan Van Eck, Treasurer, reports that this report is the same as last report, so no report.

Janeen Sharpe, Assistant Treasurer, absently informed the Board that 28 T-shirts were sold, possibility of ordering more if requested.

Member-at-Large, Theresa Nielsen, submitted concerns from members as such:

- 1, Hold quilt show every three years.
- 2, No boutique.
- 3, If there is a show, members vote yes or no for boutique.
- 4, Complaints about the "Best Wishes" ad in the catalogue and the cost.
- 5, Request for survey to be taken for what members want in workshops.
- 6, Sharon suggested getting a Survey from the whole guild with feedback regarding the show after the show.

Next board meeting at Lucy Lesperance's lair.

Meeting adjourned at 9:33.
