



Program News – *Lori Miller*

Our program calendar is now full and we are scheduled for a great year of speakers and information. I am pleased to announce that I have added the final two speakers to next year's calendar.

In March, **Tim Latimer** from Lansing, Michigan will be presenting **Time Span Quilts: UFO to Heirloom**. In this lecture, he will show all of the stages of work on many antique quilt tops from start to finish including repairs, hand-quilting and finishing followed by a trunk show of the finished quilts. He hopes to inspire you to finish up historical UFO's from your family or the flea market. Tim is a certified florist and a floral design instructor at MSU and the Michigan Floral Association. He has a degree in horticulture and is an avid gardener and hand quilter. He is currently working on over 200 quilt tops to rescue and turn into heirloom quilts. His quilts have been shown at the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum and have been juried in AQS shows. www.timquilts.com

In May, Quiltmaker and Designer, **Carol Loessel** will present a lecture on **Recipes for Leftovers**. Carol will share all kinds of ideas for using up your stash—fabrics collected or bits and pieces leftover from past quilting projects. This show and tell of Carol's projects will inspire guild members to go home and sort their stash!

She will also present a workshop, **“Now Starring: Leftovers”**. This class will create a 52" x 78" quilt that showcases all of your scraps in the centers of Variable Star blocks. Techniques covered: Scrappy piecing, making flying geese units, on-point settings. You will need to purchase her book, *Start with Scraps*, for this class. Carol Loessel loves traditional quilts and her quilt designs reflect this. She began quilting in the early 1970s when all that was being taught were traditional methods for traditional quilts. Carol has accumulated quite a collection of scraps over all those years of quilting. She has three pattern series: **“Recipes for Leftovers,” “Thanks, Grandma,”** and **“Scrappy Too”**. As a former elementary school teacher, Carol loves inspiring others to be creative through workshops and lectures. Hand quilting is Caron's specialty. While many quilters are shying away from hand quilting, it is making a comeback! If you have never hand quilted before, this is your opportunity! As a group, we will put a quilt in an “old school” frame and practice quilting together. Becoming proficient takes practice. In no time, the “rocking stitch” will become automatic! Learn how to choose the right quilting designs to enhance your pattern, select the right batting for your project; learn how to properly mark your quilt top, and how to baste your quilt without ruining your knees.

Our main goal for this workshop is to get you QUILTING BY HAND (it is not to complete a project in class)!

There are so many other people to thank. A show of this quality cannot be put on with only a few people. All the members needed to contribute and almost everyone came through in spades. The quilts were beautiful and our members pitched in to make sure all the jobs were handled and make our guests feel welcome. All the committees worked so hard but I have a few that deserve a little extra attention. Please forgive me if I inadvertently leave out someone.

Sandy Peiss again did an outstanding job of signing up a wide variety of vendors and I heard many favorable comments about the vendors from our show visitors. Almond Bars - *Cindy May*

Beat:

½ C softened butter or margarine 1 C sugar

Add:

1 egg ½ teas almond extract

Mix in:

1 ¾ C all-purpose flour 2 teas baking powder ¼ teas salt

Divide dough into fourths. Form each into a 12" roll. Place two rolls 4-5 inches apart on an ungreased cookie sheet. Flatten each till 3" wide. Repeat with remaining two rolls on separate cookie sheet.

Brush with milk and sprinkle with sliced almonds. Bake in 325 degree oven for 12-14 minutes or till edges are lightly browned.

While still warm and on cookie sheet, cut them crosswise with a pizza cutter into 1" diagonal strips. Move onto cooling rack with spatula.

When cool, drizzle with almond icing.

Almond Icing

Mix:

1 C sifted powder sugar ¼ teas almond extract Milk (3-4 teas)

Stir to make icing of drizzling consistency.

(We love the almond flavoring, so I usually double that amount in both the cookie and the icing. That's what makes them so addictive! And I guarantee that you'll wish that you made more, so I usually double or triple the batch at mixing time. They also freeze well, if they last that long. Store in air-tight canister or plastic container. At Christmastime, I've also tinted the icing red or green).

CAMEO Board Meeting - May 23, 2013 - submitted by

Meeting called to order at 7:15, May 23, 2013.

Absent: Lynda Draudt, Chuck Blanchard and Peggy Wanat.

Present: Sharon Cratsenburg, Lori Miller, Susan Van Eck, Janeen Sharpe, Debbie Ager, Theresa Nielsen, Lucy Lesperance and special guest Donna Brokenshire.

Minutes from the Board meeting of April 25, 2013, were submitted and accepted as printed.

President Sharon Cratsenburg, the program facilitator at the time, relayed the difficulties and irregularities with the May speaker/presenter, which ended up with a cancellation for the May Guild meeting and workshop.

However, Barbara Brooks from Back Street Quilts in Bad Axe, MI ended up being our speaker and was very graciously received by everyone with her display of wool quilts and presentation of the story of wool production and use and store activities. Quilting In Space - Info from Ruth McCormick

Have you ever wondered what it would be like to quilt in outer space? Astronaut and quilter, Karen Nyberg, is finding out. On May 28 when Karen was launched to the International Space Station she brought along four fat quarters of fabric and some needles and thread. Because she is limited in what she can bring into space, Karen will have to be creative in finding more materials to quilt with. She plans to use fabric or patches from the discarded astronaut clothing already on board the space station - some of it quite colorful - a sort of galactic "rag bag" of readily available material.

To do quilting in zero gravity, she'll have to brace herself somewhere so she and her fabrics don't float around, find some good light, and keep her thread and thread clippings under strict control so they don't float into someone's face and eyes.

Precision stitching will surely be a challenge for her too, since she, the fabric, and the thread will want to float free, not sit steady and still. As she explained in a recent tweet, "It will be a great experiment controlling everything!" (*Ed.Note - And I thought stitching was hard riding in the car!*)
