In Memory of Merry Silber, Quilt Treasure, 1911-2011

Merry Silber, artist, musician and quilt collector, died Friday, July 22 in West Bloomfield, Michigan. Merry was documented for Quilt Treasures, a project of the Alliance for American Quilts, the Michigan State University Museum, and MATRIX: Center for Humane Arts, Letters, and Social Sciences OnLine. Merry and her husband Albert worked closely with the MSU Museum and the Silber family donated many significant quilts to the MSUM.

Merry, who was introduced to quilts by her daughter Julie Silber in the 1970's, is credited for the first exhibition of Jewish quilts and had an impressive collection of blue and white quilts. She also worked with the late Sandra Mitchell to produce a series of groundbreaking exhibits at the Somerset Mall in Troy, Michigan.

Merry, along with other pioneers documented by the Quilt Treasures project like the late Cuesta Benberry, advanced the American Quilt Revival movement and with it helped to highlight the importance of quilts as historical documents about women's lives. Merry said "I collect quilts that tell me about the woman who made them."

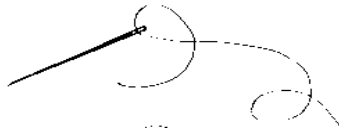

Amish Quilts in Flint

Amish Quilts are coming to the Flint Institute of Arts. The exhibition, "Quilting Traditions: The Art of the Amish From the collection of Marsha and Thomas French" will open on September 10th and continue through November 13th. A lecture will be given on September 9th by collector, Marsha French.

Amish women began making quilts around 1860. The patterns, colors and techniques have changed little since that time, and continue today. The solid colors, geometric patterns and intricate quilting have come to be recognized as outstanding characteristics of these quilts. The collection presented in this exhibition was assembled by Marsha and Tom French and includes over 60 quilts, many of which will be displayed at the Flint Institute of Arts. Examples from the mid-nineteenth century to the mid-twentieth century illustrate the history of Amish quilts and the importance this ongoing tradition.

Here is the Class Supply List provided by Judy Woodworth:

1. White or off white piece of fabric measuring at least 65" by 65".
2. Five blue water-soluble markers (Mark-B-Gone is best)
3. 2 Blue Pens
4. 1 Clover Easer
5. One 12" by 6" Ruler
6. 6" by 24" Ruler
7. Large 16" or 18 Ruler (Optional)

If you would like Judy to put together a supply kit for you, you may email Judy at jwquilts@yahoo.com to request a kit. She will be happy put it together for you and bring it to class. The cost for her kit is \$25.

Rulers: If you do not have the rulers listed above, I'm sure other class attendees would be happy to share so please don't opt out of the workshop if you do not have one or more of the above rulers listed.

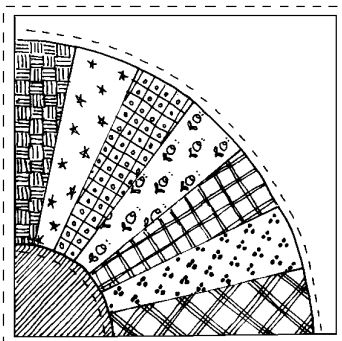
