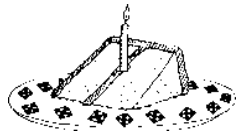

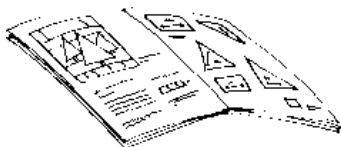

### **Quilting Retreat** - *Barbara Veselanak*

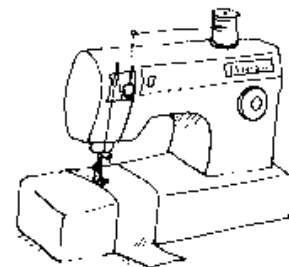

### **Supply List for the Earth, Wind and Water Table Runner and Great Ball of Fire Quilt Dan Burke Workshop - April 21, 2012**

Needed:

- A few Flat Head pins
- A few glass head pins
- 6 1/2" ruler
- "Add a Quarter Ruler" and "Add Enough" template
- Rotary cutter - 28 mm or 45 mm
- Small cutting mat to have next to your sewing station
- Small travel iron and pressing mat to have next to your sewing station
- Thread in medium gray or to match your fabrics. (I prefer an all cotton thread for piecing.)
- Sewing machine in good working order, your machine's book (in case of a problem. I'm not much of a mechanic) and a couple of filled bobbins and a new needle. I like a #70.
- Small Zip-lock bags to store your cut pieces in
- Pencil or pen and paper to take notes with
- Small pair of scissors

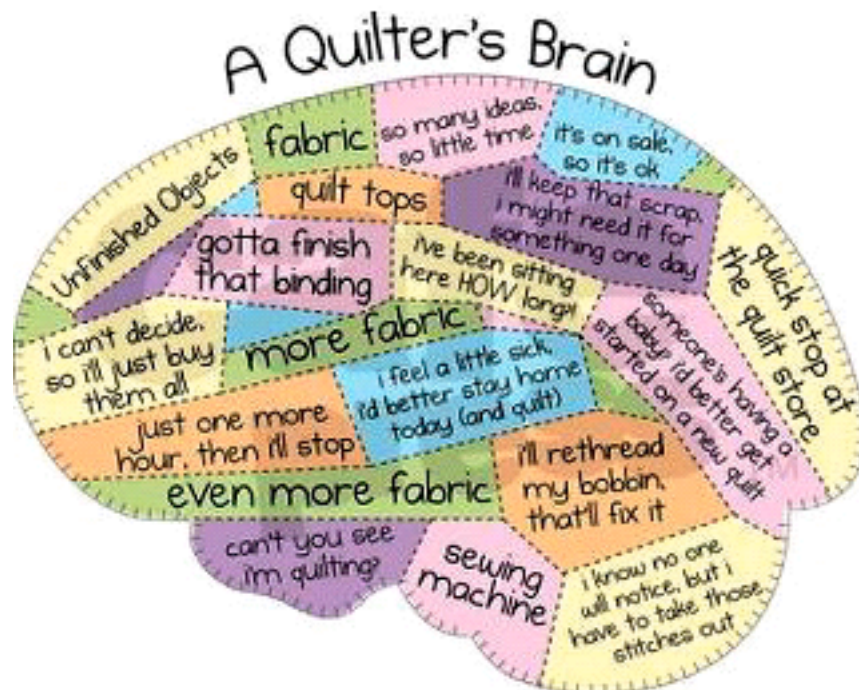

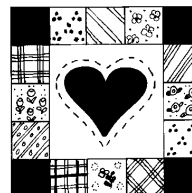

## Quilting Tip From Sew Elegant Quilt Shop

A great way to learn free motion quilting is to practice on a yard of fabric with a large scale all over print. Layer large scale print in a “quilt sandwich” with batting (cotton is the best) and a small busy print for backing fabric. Safety pin baste through the “sandwich”. Use either lightweight or invisible thread in the top of your machine and lightweight thread in the bobbin. Just stitch around the printed outlines of the designs until you have evenly distributed the quilting over the entire surface. Relax; no one will see every stitch. In this exercise, you are learning how to maneuver the quilt sandwich and stitching curved patterns! When finished, use your sample to make a large quilted bag to take your stuff to class in or give it to charity for a baby blanket. If you do plan on this being a baby quilt, then use only cotton fabric for both the top and bottom.



## “Quilt Art: International Expressions”

These aren't your grandmother's quilts.

Warm up with a vibrant twist on the traditional quilt at the Edsel & Eleanor Ford House presentation “Quilt Art: International Expressions,” Jan. 28-March 25. To complement the exhibit, Ford House will highlight local quilt artists and collectors with a variety of related talks, workshops and receptions. Among those is a “Tea & Textile” presentation on quilted clothing by Michelle Mitchell of Clinton Township from 1 to 3 p.m. Feb. 13. Fee is \$35, \$30 for members.

Four million babies will be born in the U.S. in 2012. Quilts also reflect a variety of themes, including modern social issues, landscapes, modern color and form and unique stitching techniques.

“Quilt Art” is open 11 a.m.-5 p.m. Tuesday–Sunday; admission is complimentary.

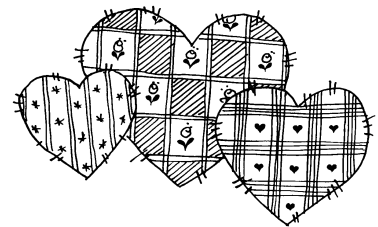
