Supply List for the Earth, Wind and Water Table Runner and Great Ball of Fire Quilt Dan Burke Workshop - April 21, 2012

Needed:

- A few Flat Head pins
- A few glass head pins
- 6 1/2" ruler
- "Add a Quarter Ruler" and "Add Enough" template
- Rotary cutter - 28 mm or 45 mm
- Small cutting mat to have next to your sewing station
- Small travel iron and pressing mat to have next to your sewing station
- Thread in medium gray or to match your fabrics. (I prefer an all cotton thread for piecing.)
- Sewing machine in good working order, your machine's book (in case of a problem. I'm not much of a mechanic) and a couple of filled bobbins and a new needle. I like a #70.
- Small Zip-lock bags to store your cut pieces in
- Pencil or pen and paper to take notes with
- Small pair of scissors

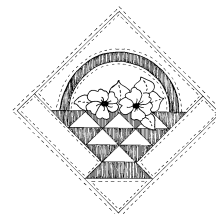

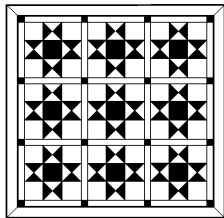

Murphy's Laws for Quilters

1. On any given day the number of employees in a quilt shop is inversely proportional to the number of customers needing quick attention.
2. Every quilt will take twice as long as you expect.
3. There are only 2 kinds of masking tape: that which won't stay on and that which won't come off.
4. In cutting an intricate multi-piece block, your ruler will slip on the last side of the last patch.
5. When there is no time to do something right, there will always be time to do it over.
6. The value of any piece of fabric is directly proportional to the speed and ease with which you will ruin it.
7. In any mail-order shipment the item you need the most will be back-ordered.
8. The pattern in a special fabric will never repeat when or where you want it to.
9. Accidental destruction of a fabric will only occur to an expensive imported cotton, never to muslin bought at 50% off.
10. Fabric dyes will never run until the quilt has been completed.
11. A block with flawlessly straight sides, precision corners and perfect color placement will always be the wrong size.
12. A quilt that has to be completed for a birthday in two months will take two years to finish. And its corollary: A quilt that has no due date will take only two months to complete..
13. When you finally have your sewing space in the empty bedroom exactly the way you want it your son will move back home.
14. You will find the perfect fabric for your quilt only after it has been discontinued by the manufacturer
15. The busier you are on any given day the greater the number of quilting inspirations you will want to try.
16. Your quilting thread will break at the needle only when the last stitch has been taken in the line .

17. If a novice quilter decides to watch you use your rotary cutter, you will always ruin the fabric and cut yourself.
18. Your bobbin thread will only run out in the middle of a long line of stitching.
19. That perfect striped fabric you want to use in your sashing has been printed off-grain.
20. The top must be completed and basted to the backing before you notice the one block that has a mistake in it.
21. The quilt-marking pencil that you tested on every fabric before you marked your quilt top won't disappear after you have completed the quilt.
22. You finally get a great idea for your Guild's challenge one week before the quilts are due.
23. No matter how much fabric you have bought, you are not going to have enough for the quilt you want to make.

Sharon is currently looking for a lady to demonstrate purses. Also, she is working on getting a lady to demonstrate aprons.

Jane stated that Dan Burke is coming in April and that only 4 people are signed up for the workshop and that we need at least 10. She also stated that everyone had fun at the trivial pursuit game night. Barb and Ruth will be demonstrating painting quilts with stencils. And challenge quilts should be turned in at the April meeting.

Deb - correspondence is up to date. Sandy is handling the library and publicity is contacting stores.

Susan stated that door prizes made \$75.10 profit as everything was donated. Fundraising sold \$15 worth of pins and note cards. Sandie is using 2 packs of notes cards for the vendor thank you. And that we spent \$363 for the quilt show.

CAMEO General Meeting - March 15, 2012

Meeting called to order at 7:05 PM.

- Barb asked guests to stand and be welcome to the meeting.
- Minutes from February's meeting meeting were accepted as printed in the March Newsletter.
- Janeen gave the financial report.

Michelle Strausberg, guest speaker, spoke about her quilting experiences. And she opened a quilt shop called Fabric Affair in Troy on John R & 18 Mile. The website is <http://www.myfabricaffair.com>. They have a "Ladies Night" which starts at 5pm and goes to 1am. Cost is \$40 and includes dinner and beverages. Come as you are or in your jammies.

- Barb announced Oakland County Quilt Guild Quilt Show on April 13th and 14th.
- Jane announced that Dan Burke will be at our April meeting. Please sign up for his class. The cost for members has been reduced. See Jane for more details.
- April is the month for Mothers Layet program. Baby items are needed to donate for the church. This is encouraged as the church gives us a good rate for the meeting and classes. These are the items for charity that need to be done per our charter.

Dorothy gave her membership report with one guest present, Michelle from Fabric Affair, and 55 members.

Dorothy requested that members sign up now for the quilt show committees other wise you will be assigned a committee you don't want to be on.

Dorothy announced that 15 members submitted names for the 2013 quilt show. The CORE committee loved all the suggestion and Rosemary Spatafora's entry of "Everything's Coming Up Quilts" was our initial choice. However, after discussing publicity and artwork already available from the last show, we realized we could be more economically utilize the publicity from the last show if we kept the Quilts in Bloom II, submitted by Sandy Peiss. Sandy declined the prize and said it should go to Rosemary.

As a revenue booster for our 2013 show, we are adding a Silent Auction at the 2013 show. Mini-quilts should be no smaller than 12 inch square and no larger than 24 inch square.

Round robin has come to an end, please turn in.

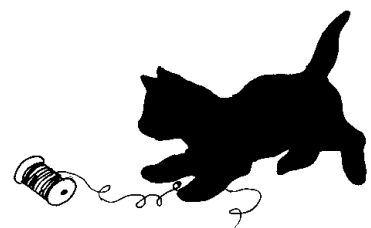

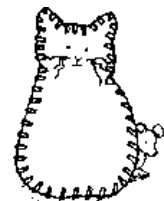
