



We have started a new year and this will be an exciting one. We look forward to great guest speakers and of participating in our quilt show. As we all will be helping with the quilt show, let's not forget charity. As members, each of us is required to help charity. This does not mean you have to complete an entire quilt. We have some members who only like to do the quilt top (like me) and others who will do the binding. Every little bit helps and is greatly appreciated. What I would like to ask is that you let us know if you like to do the quilting and / or the binding. Then through the year I would know who to ask for help. I feel guilty asking the same people all the time. I do not want anyone to feel obligated or burden. The more people who sign up for specific tasks the easier it is on all of us. I appreciate all the help charity received last year.

Last year was my first year on the charity committee. As charity chairperson, I am working at being more accurate in the record keeping. So this year I am going to assign one member of the charity committee to receive all completed projects (quilts, pillows, etc) and document. When you bring your completed project in please give it to her. So that you will know who she is for that night, there will be a sign in front of her. Also she will be sitting on the left side of the table where we will be displaying all the completed projects. At the table posted next to her will be a sheet of the suggested value of the quilts. Hopefully, this will be better than trying to remember what is printed in the newsletter each month.

I am asking that all members of the charity committee who did not attend the September charity meeting, please arrive at 6:15 for a meeting. I would like to discuss what you missed and what your responsibilities are.

Also I am asking that regular guild members do not bring their items to the charity table until 6:45. This gives charity time to set up the table and have all the paperwork ready.

As much as we appreciate donations of fabric, we are asking that you please go through all the donated fabric and please give us only the cotton. We can not use left over denim and other non cotton fabric. What ends up happening is that these fabrics get stored in a bin then they end up in someone's basement taking up unnecessary space.

Christmas bags and totes will be at the charity table for you to pick up, sew and fill. These are to be returned at the November meeting and will be delivered to the HAVEN House. The HAVEN House is a shelter for women and children who have been abused. This is one of four charities we are sponsoring this year. The other three are the Methodist Church for their layette program in April, Gilda's and Macomb Hospital for elderly care.

Thank you for all your support last year and looking forward to working with you this year.



CAMEO Program News - Jodie Schlicht



As we have seen, a quilt is never just a quilt. There is love, time, thoughtfulness, skill, and a purpose in every wonderful creation. Many made their quilts for someone special, whether it is family, friends, a special thank you, or even for someone you don't really know, as is evident by our many beautiful Charity quilts. Remember, you touch the lives of so many people in the gift of a quilt, and continue to do so well long after its' been made. So Ladies, make sure you record your stories, label your quilts, and let a new owner share the warmth of its love.

At the September meeting, we also had our "Ugly Fat Quarter Exchange". Members were asked to bring in two ugly fat quarters, and wear them on their shoulders. If anyone really liked your fabric, they could exchange it for one of their own. Once taken, members are asked to create a finished 12" block (12 _" square) using the two fabrics you selected plus one or two of your own, and bring it to the December Potluck for our "Ugly Block Contest". 

Be original! Anything goes! Have fun!


LEAFING THROUGH THE LIBRARY


\$20-\$60 pillow, depending on complexity of design and

Midland Man, 87, Sews for Body and Soul

Russell Grosteffon is a quilting dynamo who produced 65 quilts last year. He does it all, from designing the pattern to cutting and sewing and tying the finished quilt with pieces of yarn. This is even more amazing when you consider that he's 87. "When I started out last year, I was going to make one a week," he said. "I ended up with 65. I gave all 65 away." Grosteffon estimates he has made more than 1,000 quilts. Most of the blocked beauties are donated to organizations such as the Salvation Army and United Way of Midland County, or to local churches. People who've lost their homes in a fire often get one of his quilts. And some are given to church missionaries and will travel to the far corners of the Earth. "It makes me feel good," Grosteffon said about his handiwork keeping people warm all over the world.

Members of his family most likely have a Grosteffon-made quilt, somewhere in the house. Like 8-year-old great-granddaughter Kaitrianna Klich who has three on her bed. "All he does is make quilts," she said. "I have a bunch of them." Grosteffon's work is top-notch. "His corners are perfect," said his daughter, Susan Klich. "My dad can do everything," she said. "He's the greatest dad there is."

Grosteffon was a master plumber and owner of Russell Plumbing & Heating in Midland. He retired in 1995 when he had open heart surgery, but soon found himself tired of watching TV. "So my wife taught me to sew," he said. Bea Grosteffon made baby quilts that she donated to MidMichigan Medical Center-Midland. The first baby born at the hospital every month would get a quilt. "After she had her heart attack, I took over that, too." Grosteffon said.

When he's not cutting, sewing or tying quilts, Grosteffon visits Bea, who has been in a nursing home since February, or spends time with Daisy, a chubby Jack Russell terrier with a penchant for fortune cookies.

Or he's making pies, another skill he picked up from Bea. Raspberry, apple and cherry are his specialities, and they don't last long.

"When we have a potluck at church, instead of getting in the food line a lot of people will go over and get in the dessert line," Grosteffon said.

To Christy Thomson, community program coordinator for United Way, Grosteffon is known as "the quilt man." Grosteffon's quilts are given away at Christmas as part of the Sharing Tree program. Blankets are a big need, Thomson said, especially for people who have drafty homes and who can't afford high gas bills. "He's a really neat guy," Thomson said. "He doesn't want any recognition for what he does."

Reported that we will need a slide projector for one of our upcoming speakers.


WEB SITE MANAGEMENT:


