



Meeting Called to Order 7:11PM

ABSENT: Debbie Ager, Bev Olson

Minutes from Oct 20, 2010 Executive Board meeting were approved. They will be signed, dated and placed on file.

Janeen Sharpe: FINANCIAL REPORT: Balances are the same as reported at the General meeting. All obligations are up to date. Janeen reminded the board that we need to use the cash receipt forms when we turn in monies as well as using the cash expenditure forms when requesting reimbursement. We still have an outstanding check which was issued as a deposit for outside signs for the quilt show. Barb will follow up with Pat Pillot to trace what has happened with that check.

HOSPITALITY: doing a great job. The committee is well organized and very enthusiastic. Funds were issued to replenish needed supplies.

Betty Carpenter: MEMBERSHIP: steady at 71 regular and 2 associate members. We had 59 members present at the October general meeting and 15 guests. We will be sending invitations to our February meeting to prior members who did not renew. There will be no guest fee if they bring the invitation.

Jane Aula: PROGRAM SCHEDULING: For year 2011/2012: Terry White, Thread Painting for May '12, Judy Woodworth, Whole Cloth quilts for November '11 and we already booked Edyta Sitar for Jan '12. Jane will look into a second workshop with Edyta as other guilds have stated that they could have filled 2 classes. All fees for Judy and Edyta include materials, so will need to ensure that is well known. Board discussed workshop fees and concluded fees should be based upon class size of 17 to cover costs. Publicity will be greater with use of our new website and we will need to be diligent in contacting neighboring guilds with our program information.

AUDIT: nothing to report

RETREAT: Going well. Contract from Bear Lake Camp just received for signature. Date is last weekend in April.

Jodie Schlicht: PROGRAMS/WORKSHOPS – need to boost publicity. It was difficult to fill the workshop for Debra Danko. Signup sheets for Melissa Becker and Pat Speth will be moved to the back of our meeting room for better access during the break. Literature/class information can be displayed at the meeting. We will be getting information out now about next year's programs.

CHALLENGE: Carole Gilbert is handling without assistance.

Debbie Ager: Absent; however, the LIBRARY is doing very well. Sandy is publicizing in the newsletter and sends mass emails before the general meeting. As one of our goals to reduce redundancy within the business meeting, the only announcement during the general meeting would be changes to what was previously published. We understand the difficulty of transporting books to the meeting; however, our storage space at the church is unsecured and lacks space to house the library.

Susan VanEck: QUILT SHOW funds are coming in. \$1800 turned in for raffle tickets already. Most vendors have paid. FUND RAISING at our meeting turned in \$10 and the DOOR PRIZES had a \$29.02 profit.

FAT QUARTER BLOCKERY (Nickel Swap / Mystery Round Robin) – very popular. 33 are doing the nickel swap. Kathy Wilson: CHARITY: 3 bags of items delivered to Henry Ford Macomb Acute Care for the Elderly. Huge number of bags turned in for Haven. Committee is still working through paper work details.

NATIONAL QUILTING DAY (January this year) - popular Potato Bar will be back and we will have a donation basket.

Rae Monsere: PROPERTY: One of our quilt racks needs repair. Committee discussed purchase of 1 or 2 replacement racks. Barb will check out wholesale prices and report back.

Board discussed budget and approved increases for Charity Day, National Quilting Day and Correspondence. Hearts and Hugs should be submitting reimbursement requests for postage and cards. Hospitality committee budget increased to \$100. Janeen Sharpe shared the new CAMEO Brochure. Barb will tweak some of the information and send back to Janeen to be included in final copy.

WEB SITE: Huge success. Hooray for Connie! We will all continue to feed her good information to add to the site. There will be no December Executive Board meeting. Next Board meeting will be January 27th at Betty Carpenter's house.

Instructions for registering a quilt in the 2011 CAMEO Quilt Show

- 1. Thank you for entering your quilt in the 2011 CAMEO Quilt Show. Fill in one registration form for each quilt item submitted. Fill in the top half of the form. Do not fill in the Registration Number. Return this form on or before March 30, 2011 to the Receiving Committee Chairperson listed on the bottom of the form. I am now accepting these forms and the earlier the better. Quilts entered in previous CAMEO Quilt Shows cannot be entered. You may also want to take the time to register this quilt with the Michigan State University Museum's Michigan Quilt Project. This is a project to save our stories and archive the history information of our Michigan quilts and Quilters. You can download their application at this website: http://www.museum.msu.edu/glqc/programs\_mqp\_register.html
- 2. When you drop-off your quilt to the Receiving Committee, every quilt entered must include 2 photos of the quilt with the Registrant's Name and Quilt Title on the back of the photos. The Receiving Committee will write the registration number on the photo back. The second photo you will have to bring back when you are picking up you quilt along with your quilt claim check.
- 3. Every quilt must have a sewn on fabric label to include Title of the quilt and Registrant's Name. This label must be embroidered, typed or printed with permanent ink pen on a piece of fabric and sewn onto the lower portion of the back of the quilt.
- 4. Wall hangings smaller than 42" square will be pinned for hanging.
- 5. Print what you want to appear in the Program catalog for the quilt show. Staple another piece of paper to this form if you need additional space. Some ideas would be to include quilt pattern, type of material & batting used, how you came to make this particular quilt, any special significance of the work, if the quilt has been included in any juried shows, special stitching, inspiration, how long you have been quilting, the product of a class you took. If your quilt is made from a pattern or is a copy of someone else's work, you must give credit to the original designer. If the quilt is an heirloom tell how it got to you, if it is a family piece, list information about where it came from, who stitched it, the date the quilt was created, etc. Program space is limited, so please be brief.
- 6. Leave the registration number and the bottom half of the form blank. The Receiving Committee will assign registration numbers and the bottom half of this form will be completed when you drop off the quilt at Madison Place on Thursday, May 12, 2011 between 11:00am and 6:00pm.
- 7. The quilt show will end at 4:00pm Saturday, May 14, 2011. At this time, the quilts will be taken down and returned to the Receiving Committee. Your quilt should be picked up from the Receiving Committee between 4:30pm and 5:30pm, on Saturday, May 14, 2011. You will need to bring your "Quilt Claim Check" and the photo with the registration information on the back with you to claim your quilt. If you cannot pick up your quilt and are asking someone else to pick it up, please inform the Receiving Committee Chairperson ahead of time. Only the Registrants will be able to pick up their quilts unless arrangements have been made in advance.



SUPPLY LIST For Both Classes; Sharp pencil (I use a 7 mm mechanical pencil); good eraser (white Magic Rub), at least 3 sheets of graph paper, 17" x 22", 8 squares to the inch. I will have sheets to sell in class for 50¢ each if you can't find any; 3" x 18" Graph Ruler™. This is a thin clear ruler with red lines. It is not used for rotary cutting. It has an c" grid on it.  OPTIONAL: Protractor & Compass (I will demonstrate ways to use these tools, if time permits. Bring them if you have them. DON'T buy them if you don't own them already!) 
