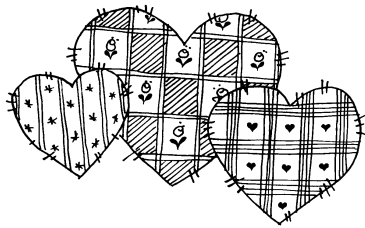

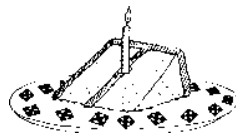

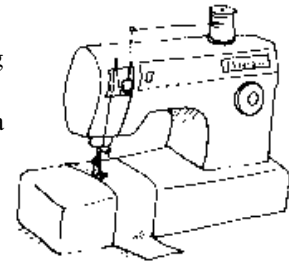


NATIONAL QUILTING DAY - *Carole Gilbert*

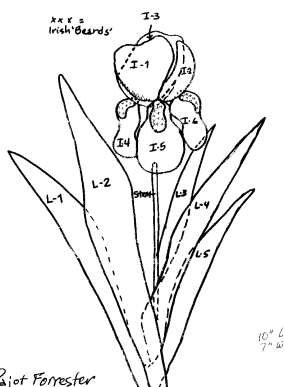

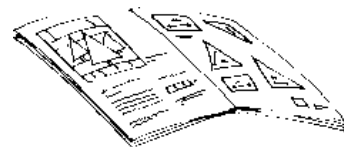

We need to know if you are planning on attending soon, so that we are sure that we have enough materials if you plan on constructing any of other Make 'n Take projects that we have, or plan on doing the mystery quilt.

If you plan on doing the mystery quilt with us, we need to know this by the *1st of March* so that we have enough patterns for everyone that will be given out at the March meeting. You will be given purchasing guidelines and also your cutting instructions. If you plan on getting your quilt top done on the weekend, it is advised that you cut your fabric before you arrive for the weekend. The cost of the mystery this year is only \$2.00. You do NOT need to be attending the retreat weekend to get the pattern, however, you will only be given the purchasing guidelines and cutting instructions before the retreat and the rest will come after we return.

Meeting Called to order at 7:09PM – Pledge of Allegiance

PRESIDENT – BARB LUSK - If you haven't signed in, yet, please do so. Please turn off or set to vibrate, your cell phone to be courteous to others during the meeting. Welcome! To Cameo Quilters Guild. Our name, Cameo (Come and Meet Each Other). We meet on the third Thursday of each month from September to June to "promote and preserve the art of quilting, patchwork, appliqué' and related fiber arts. We sponsor workshops, lectures, and displays to stimulate an interest in quilting, provide occasions for friends to meet, and to engage in the charitable efforts of the group. We are so glad you are here.

After Barb's introduction, she asks that anyone with suggestions or comments about the meeting tonight, or questions, concerns or suggestions about the guild in general, please see her after the meeting, call or email her or any board member.

MINUTES - The minutes of the December, 2010 General Meeting were approved as published in the January Newsletter. They will be signed, dated and placed on file.

TREASURER – JANEEN SHARPE - The financial report was given, accepted, and will be signed, dated and placed on file.

It was noted that it is good to know what moneys come in and go out.

OFFICER AND COMMITTEE REPORTS AND SPECIAL ORDERS/NEW BUSINESS

PRESIDENT - Barb thanked everyone for the kind thoughts, prayers, cards, phone calls and especially the heart and hug she received following the injury to my knee and eventual surgery.

- Remember to register for Pat Speth's workshop April 20.
- Refer to the January newsletter regarding the Retreat. Registration form and deposit can be turned in tonight.
- Be sure to get your quilt information down on the forms and to Jean Becher as soon as possible.

QUILT SHOW UPDATE: DOROTHY STREFFLING - There are only 16 weeks left before the show. With 71 members now and 100 for the last show, means we all need to work a little harder to make this show a success. Please block out these 3 days on your calendar! Set up day is Thursday, May 12 and the show days are Friday/Saturday May 13-14. Plan on spending as much time as possible at the venue. Staffing will do their best to provide jobs that are suitable to members needs. Please be open to working where ever you are needed.

• Also, the workshops with Beth Donaldson are on Wednesday, May 11 and will be held at Lutheran Church of the Master. The workshops are limited in class size and open to non-members, so sign up soon to ensure your spot. There will also be a lecture by Beth Donaldson on Friday night after the show closes. That lecture is also open to the public. Please mention all these activities to your friends.

• We've only sold 1,600 raffle tickets out of 5,000 through 12/31/10! If you have ticket stubs and money, please turn them into Lynda Draudt. It's important to sell the tickets. Every \$1 helps our guild. The Raffle Quilt committee worked for an entire year on this quilt and it would be a shame if we did not sell all the tickets!

• Even if you can't take the quilt around, you can still "sell" our show. Take a supply of bookmarks and ask if you can leave a few at the fabric shops and other businesses you frequent. Talk to your friends about the show. Don't be shy! We have a beautiful raffle quilt and will have a fantastic show with over 200 quilts, boutique, and vendors.

• Registration forms need to be turned in whether or not your quilt is done. Remember, you only need the name and approximate size of your quilt. 2 photos can be brought later. We will open the registration to outsiders in March, so get your forms in now to be sure there is a place for your quilts. Also, anything quilted needs a registration form, such as jackets or other wearable's, pillows, etc. Charity quilt displays also needs forms, and doesn't count as 1 of your 2 quilts for the show.

• The last day for scheduled boutique workshops was Jan. 13. Please continue making items on your own. Maybe you can work on a boutique item at National Quilting Day, January 22. The Boutique committee would like to have an idea of the items members are planning to donate/sell. There is a sign-up sheet circulating. Your items can be given to Renee Beihl. Samples of the Featherweight quilted cases that were made and the last sewing day were shown.

• Anyone who has any kind of item that can be used in the Quilt Show displays, such as antiques, furniture items, small benches, baskets, etc., contact Dorothy Streffling.

• We all need to pitch in to ensure the success of our show. This is our big money maker so the more raffle tickets, boutique items and admission tickets we sell, the higher our profit! This translates into more money to bring in the best speakers and enhance our other Guild programs, as well.

Instructions for registering a quilt in the 2011 CAMEO Quilt Show

1. Thank you for entering your quilt in the 2011 CAMEO Quilt Show. Fill in one registration form for each quilt item submitted. Fill in the top half of the form. Do not fill in the Registration Number. Return this form on or before March 30, 2011 to the Receiving Committee Chairperson listed on the bottom of the form. I am now accepting these forms and the earlier the better. Quilts entered in previous CAMEO Quilt Shows cannot be entered. You may also want to take the time to register this quilt with the Michigan State University Museum's Michigan Quilt Project. This is a project to save our stories and archive the history information of our Michigan quilts and Quilters. You can download their application at this website: http://www.museum.msu.edu/glqc/programs_mqp_register.html

2. When you drop-off your quilt to the Receiving Committee, every quilt entered must include 2 photos of the quilt with the Registrant's Name and Quilt Title on the back of the photos. The Receiving Committee will write the registration number on the photo back. The second photo you will have to bring back when you are picking up your quilt along with your quilt claim check.

3. Every quilt must have a sewn on fabric label to include Title of the quilt and Registrant's Name. This label must be embroidered, typed or printed with permanent ink pen on a piece of fabric and sewn onto the lower portion of the back of the quilt.

4. Wall hangings smaller than 42" square will be pinned for hanging.

5. Print what you want to appear in the Program catalog for the quilt show. Staple another piece of paper to this form if you need additional space. Some ideas would be to include quilt pattern, type of material & batting used, how you came to make this particular quilt, any special significance of the work, if the quilt has been included in any juried shows, special stitching, inspiration, how long you have been quilting, the product of a class you took. If your quilt is made from a pattern or is a copy of someone else's work, you must give credit to the original designer. If the quilt is an heirloom tell how it got to you, if it is a family piece, list information about where it came from, who stitched it, the date the quilt was created, etc. Program space is limited, so please be brief.

6. Leave the registration number and the bottom half of the form blank. The Receiving Committee will assign registration numbers and the bottom half of this form will be completed when you drop off the quilt at Madison Place on Thursday, May 12, 2011 between 11:00am and 6:00pm.

7. The quilt show will end at 4:00pm Saturday, May 14, 2011. At this time, the quilts will be taken down and returned to the Receiving Committee. Your quilt should be picked up from the Receiving Committee between 4:30pm and 5:30pm, on Saturday, May 14, 2011. You will need to bring your "Quilt Claim Check" and the photo with the registration information on the back with you to claim your quilt. If you cannot pick up your quilt and are asking someone else to pick it up, please inform the Receiving Committee Chairperson ahead of time. DRAFTING MADE EASY! Why do you need to learn drafting? You don't. There are so many great books and patterns available you don't need to master this technique. My simple approach will change your mind about drafting. You'll learn to draft any block, any size, graduate from simple blocks and concepts to blocks that are more challenging - even create a new block of your own. Learning to draft helps you assess the accuracy of patterns and blocks or alter patterns for size. I promise to teach you this without mentioning angles or math!

DESIGNING ON POINT Learn the secrets of designing quilts on point. Discover which blocks work best on point and how to draft them. My tricks make diagonally set blocks interchange with favorite blocks and open a whole new world of quilt design that's simple to understand. Topics covered: block size, rotary cutting vs templates (when to use each), settings (including alternating blocks, sashings, edge and corner triangles), borders and quilting patterns. Let my guidelines make the math easy!

SUPPLY LIST For Both Classes; Sharp pencil (I use a 7 mm mechanical pencil); good eraser (white Magic Rub), at least 3 sheets of graph paper, 17" x 22", 8 squares to the inch. I will have sheets to sell in class for 50¢ each if you can't find any; 3" x 18" Graph Ruler™. This is a thin clear ruler with red lines. It is not used for rotary cutting. It has an c" grid on it.

OPTIONAL: Protractor & Compass (I will demonstrate ways to use these tools, if time permits. Bring them if you have them. DON'T buy them if you don't own them already!) An unfinished project or group of blocks that you'd like advice on. See how drafting can help you move your projects along. A calculator for the Designing On Point Class, Ott-Lite would be helpful.
