Quilt Show Lecture by BETH DONALDSON

A History of the American Quilt

Friday, May 13, 2011 at 7 p.m. - Admission \$5.00

Power Point Lecture and Trunk Show

This is a power point presentation using quilts from the MSU Museum's Great Lakes Quilt Center to illustrate the history of the American quilt. The history of American women, manufacturing, politics, scientific discoveries, migration, and the Great sDepression will all be discovered through the use of quilts.

The journey begins right after the revolutionary war, when fabrics were expensive, through the manufacturing boom of the earlyt 1800s, the development of the block style quilt (the truly American art from) in the 1840s, the Album quilts of 1840-50s, the Charm quilt, Crazy quilt, and Redwork fads that began in the 1880s, through the rise of the pastel quilt in the 1920s. The 1930s were the heyday of the published newspaper pattern, the 1940s saw patriotic quilts and the lull of the 1950s-1960s. The 1970s and the bicentennial was the beginning of the new (and biggest quilt revival). By viewing the quilts from the late 18th century to the present day, you'll notice trends in color, fabric, and style, that can help you date quilts in your own collection. Beth will bring quilts from her own collection and the audience is encouraged to bring old quilts for a show-and-tell at lecture's end.

Beth Donaldson has been a quilter since 1974; a quilting teacher since 1984; a show organizer since 1989; and a quilt historian since 1999. Her credits include authoring two quilt books, **Block By Block** (That Patchwork Place, 1995) and **Charm Quilts** (EZ by Wrights, 1997) and was a contributing pattern designer and writer for **Great Lakes, Great Quilts** (C&T Publishing, 2002). Her work has been featured in **Quilter's Newsletter Magazine, Quilting Today, Professional Quilter, Quilt Professional, and Traditional Quiltworks**. She was a local planning chair of the American Quilt Society Group's, 1999 Seminar and ran the Northern Michigan Getaway from 1991-1997. She has also judged quilt shows and contests. Currently she is involved (through the Great Lakes Quilt Center and the Alliance for American Quilts) with the development of the Quilt index, a comprehensive on-line research work that will provide access to information about North American quilted bed coverings at: <http://www.quiltindex.org/>. Her work as the Quilt Collections Assistant at the Great Lakes Quilt Center at the Michigan State University Museum included updating their website, organizing the on-going Michigan Quilt Project documentation effort, assisting with quilt exhibits and helping to manage the 700+ quilt collection. In 2008, Beth started a blog, *Beth Donaldson: Quilt Doctor* at <http://quiltdoctor.blogspot.com/> where you can find free patterns and advice on quilting.

DRAFTING MADE EASY! Why do you need to learn drafting? You don't. There are so many great books and patterns available you don't need to master this technique. My simple approach will change your mind about drafting. You'll learn to draft any block, any size, graduate from simple blocks and concepts to blocks that are more challenging - even create a new block of your own. Learning to draft helps you assess the accuracy of patterns and blocks or alter patterns for size. I promise to teach you this without mentioning angles or math!

DESIGNING ON POINT Learn the secrets of designing quilts on point. Discover which blocks work best on point and how to draft them. My tricks make diagonally set blocks interchange with favorite blocks and open a whole new world of quilt design that's simple to understand. Topics covered: block size, rotary cutting vs templates (when to use each), settings (including alternating blocks, sashings, edge and corner triangles), borders and quilting patterns. Let my guidelines make the math easy!

SUPPLY LIST For Both Classes; Sharp pencil (I use a 7 mm mechanical pencil); good eraser (white Magic Rub), at least 3 sheets of graph paper, 17" x 22", 8 squares to the inch. I will have sheets to sell in class for 50¢ each if you can't find any; 3" x 18" Graph Ruler™. This is a thin clear ruler with red lines. It is not used for rotary cutting. It has an c" grid on it.

OPTIONAL: Protractor & Compass (I will demonstrate ways to use these tools, if time permits. Bring them if you have them. DON'T buy them if you don't own them already!) An unfinished project or group of blocks that you'd like advice on. See how drafting can help you move your projects along. A calculator for the Designing On Point Class, Ott-Lite would be helpful.


