

Scrap Bag Challenge - Items Due at March Meeting!

We are excited to see what wonderful creations came from those \$1 Scrap Bags that people bought back at the November meeting. We hope that all of those scraps inspired many "one of a kind" quilted items and we're looking forward to a fun display at our March 17 meeting! Here are a few things that you need to know:

- Entries must be made from the scraps that were in the bags. One extra fabric may be added to the scraps. (Note: Quilt back and binding do not count as the one extra fabric so you can use whatever fabric you wish for that.)
- Minimum size of the entry is 18" x 18".
- Please plan to arrive a bit early for the March meeting to turn in your Challenge entry. Bring your entry in a paper or plastic bag so that no one can see it. Just hand us the bag. Please do not put a label on your entry. We want to keep this as anonymous as possible. We will put a number on each entry and people will vote for the number.
- If you are planning to submit an entry please email Rosemary Spatafora at <u>rspatafora@comcast.net</u> so we can get an idea of how many items we will be displaying.
- When you sign in for the March meeting you will receive your ballot. Voting will take place during the meeting before the end of Hospitality. There will be a box to drop your voted ballot.

Publicity for Quilt Show

After reading the Publicity folder handed to me at the Charity Day event in February, I found many excellent ideas about how to promote our show from the 2011, 2013, 2015 shows. Many of the previous ideas are still doable but many were well-planned over many months because they didn't happen in the shadow of a pandemic. So, here we are, the pandemic is over (we have to move forward), and now we need volunteers to distribute the publicity.

Can you distribute the CAMEO Quilt Show flyers to retreat sites, senior centers, senior living facilities, community centers, libraries and shops which carry handmade products? Flyers have been sent to Quilt Shops within 3 hours of us, but not these other organizations and shops.

We are compiling a list of each potential stop to take flyers to. It will be shared as a Google Spread-sheet with everyone. Please send an email to Jan Recinos, if you have a shop or stop to add.

On March 17, there will be flyers for you to distribute to the stops near you. We will circulate the list by email or you can sign up on the sheet at the meeting. We appreciate all your help.

We would also like to request that you publicize our show on your personal **Facebook** page and on the **Nextdoor** app for your neighborhood. If you have other suggestions, please let Publicity know.

Finally, we will prepare a press release to send to the local newspapers and online news sources to be disseminated by the March meeting. Ads have been placed in the Country Register and The Quilting Hub.

Preparing your quilt to hang in a quilt show

Check list for displaying your quilt: 1) Label your quilt on the back. Per Luann Kessi, your label should include: Your name and contact info, the date, name of the quilt and any quilt history & techniques used. Labels can be hand made using printable fabric or photo transfer fabric. This was demonstrated at our whistle stop in 2019. You can also use permanent fabric markers to hand-letter a label. Either way, be sure to follow setting instructions to ensure the inks do not wash out. Missouri Star Quilt company sells markers and has a series of hand-lettering video tutorials:

2) Make a hanging sleeve. Once you have bound your quilt – or even before (see note below) you will want to construct a sleeve for the quilt. Here is a link to sleeve instructions on our CAMEO guild web page:

You can make your sleeve removable if the quilt will later be used only on a flat surface and not displayed on a wall or at a future quilt show. Muslin makes an inexpensive alternate if you need to conserve fabric. Many quilters like to make the sleeve from the same fabric matching the backing. If the sleeve is hand -sewn to the quilt, it can be removed at a later date. Note: you can also incorporate the sleeve into the top binding, when you attach the binding, in which case it is not as removable. You will still need to blind stitch (hand sew) your sleeve lower edge to the back of the quilt to ensure it does not protrude over the top of the quilt. You want to create a "D" shape to your sleeve to allow space for the hanging rod. The blog inquiringquilter.com offers a well-illustrated tutorial on constructing and attaching a "D" sleeve.

3) Remove all hair/fur/stray threads using a tape roller. Optional: 4) Press or steam out the wrinkles (only if your batting is cotton or wool – don't iron a quilt with polyester batting) 5) Roll your quilt on a pool noodle to keep it flat while transporting it. 6) Turn in your registration form by April 1, 2022. Form is available on our website-forms tab. Deadline to complete your quilt is April 20, 2022. Best of Luck with your entry!

<u>Charity Quilt Day; Linda Wallace:</u> Will be held this coming Saturday, 2-19-2022. Time is 9 am – 3 pm. Bring your sewing machine. Work on charity projects that you provide or Linda will have work for you, including pillowcase kits, baby quilts, and layers to pin together for quilting. 12-13 people are signed up, Barb Lusk will work from home on her longarm quilt machine. Lunch will be a simple sub sandwich. Carole will make coffee; people can bring own drinks or have hot tea.

<u>Quilt Show; Sharon Cratsenberg:</u> 5 vendors have booked double booths; 4 vendors have booked a single booth. Proceeds will be about \$1975.00. Our hall rental is \$3000. Will we bring in enough in booth rental, tickets etc. to cover our costs? Question was posed: can we postpone? Answer: No, the raffle MUST be done that day. Moving on: we need someone to volunteer to help with the Mini Quilt Silent Auction.

Meeting was called to order by President Carole Gilbert at 7:00 pm via Zoom. Discussion of do we want to make any changes to the Hospitality committee procedures to streamline or consider eliminating? It is a time-honored tradition, which we would like to continue. Note that we are encouraging pre-wrapped foods. We could consider eliminating coffee or encourage members to bring their own beverages. We will provide a pitcher of water, hot water and tea/instant coffee. Any one who brings foods for hospitality are supposed to take back their own dishes during clean up time. Each committee who sets up an area has to clean-up afterwards, including charity, door prize and fabulous finds. Remember to pick up your Fabulous Finds if they are not taken by the end of the evening.

V. P. Scheduling Loreen Garrison: March program – Jean Schlegelmann will handle the Member Trunk show, Rosemary Spatafora and Barb Lusk the Scrap Bag Challenge. Members showing their quilts are Lynda. Loreen, Jean, Barb and Carole. January 2023 program: Lynn Carson Harris Lecture and Workshop. upcoming: Pan Rapanos from Park Bench Quilt Shop will do a lecture/trunk show program, and Sara Gallegos (Nationally-known quilt show owner) of Decorative Stitch will present a trunk show for \$250.00; this was approved by the board for October 20, 2022. The contract forms have been re-done and a clean, blank copy was approved by the board to be available on the website.

Quilt Show; Sharon Cratsenburg: 60 vendors have been approached for the quilts show; 17 replied negatively, many others are still 'maybes. Thinking about the number of quilts needed to be entered, much depends on the size of the quilts. Get your registration forms to Laurie Johnson as soon as possible, or at least email that you will enter a quilt. Cindy May is calculating the number of quilts necessary and a plan for display. Considering whether we need to create a printed catalog or list quilts on-line. Each quilt can have 5 X 7 tag on the quilt for viewers choice. Placards can be displayed for Ad Sponsors. Sponsors can also be acknowledged on-line. These options will be discussed by the Quilt Show Committee. Copies of the Country Register will be available.

<u>Retreat</u>; <u>Sharon Cratsenberg</u>: The Retreat at Bear Lake is scheduled for April 7-10th (Thursday – Sunday, with Thursday night an additional \$15.00. We currently have 14 people confirmed attending. Date your check for March 12, in case we need to return uncashed. Consider attending Carol Hershberg's retreat (see your email from Carol.) Creative Passions in June. We have prizes for retreat attendees including thread and gift cards.

<u>National Quilting Day, March 19th Carole Gilbert</u>. \$50 lunch budget. Meet for simple sewing day. 13 people came to Charity Day on February 19th, plus Barb Lusk, working from home. We got a lot accomplished, thank you to everyone.
