CHANDLIER BLOCK 2025 CAMEO EXCHANGE BLOCK

8 ½" Unfinished. Make a total of 35. Due at the December Meeting.

2.5" kigh x 6.5" wide
Straight Grain

This diagram is not actual size

7 different Spring Colors, a fat quarter of each. Should read one color in batiks, mottled, or very small print that doesn't call attention to itself.

The background is white on white. Please, **NO** off-white. Can use the same white for all blocks but not necessary. Will need approx. 1-1/4 yards.

Make 5 blocks in each colorway. (7 colors x 5 each = 35 blocks).

Color patches: cut one 4 1/2" square and two 2 ½" squares.

White: cut two 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles and two 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles.

You should have 7 stacks of 5 blocks each. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished Pin together 1 block from each colorway, to end up with 5 pinned groups of 7 different color blocks and your name.

Bring your bag of blocks to the December meeting or turn your bag in to Chris Schulte at an earlier meeting.

Attendees were: Martha Nordquist, Cheryl Cawley, Laurie Johnson, Sharon Cratsenburg, Jean Schlegelmann, Terry Poduska, Chris Schulte, Laura Ball Carey, Theresa Nielsonand Jeanne Flynn Donna Griffith and Terry Poduska were unable to attend.

Cheryl Cawley discussed survey results:

Most popular:

- 1. Outside speakers
- 2. Work shops
- 3. Open Sews Currently scheduled for March 2026, December and October 2025.

Topics suggested from the membership: (Many may be good for Whistle Stop. Cheryl volunteered to teach applique; Laurie volunteered to teach color theory)

- 1. Featherweight maintenance-possible speakers Cindy May and Chris Molina
- 2. Quilted Jacket construction
- 3. Scraps-uses, organizing
- 4. Piecing tips and tricks
- 5. Applique techniques
- 6. Template Use
- 7. Color coordination.

These topics could also be addressed at an Open Sew

Looking for free places to hold the Open Sews - Libraries? Troy Community Center? Royal Oak Senior Center?

Liason Assignments: Listed in the newsletter. Board member responsibilities include reaching out to the committee members.

Membership Sharon Cratsenburg: 3 new members this year, 10-13 the last 3 years. Total 40

Treasurer Martha Nordquist-Budget. Usually presented at October meeting. She is just back from vacation but will have copies to give to members at the Guild meeting

Laurie Johnson- We may need to increase speaker/workshop limit of \$750. Will need a vote at December's Guild meeting.

Quilt Show: Discussion by Sharon about quilt show dates in 2027 that might conflict with retreat in April. Further discussion about the Oakland County quilt show this past weekend and whether the church would be appropriate in price and space. 84 quilts were in the show, more on pews and on wall.

Question of whether to give different prizes based on size of quilts; question cost of racks. Ray charges \$456; question about how to expand vendors.

Sharon and Cheryl to reach out to Oakland County Quilt Guild to get ideas.

Storage at church needs to be rearranged to have more frequently used items in front. May need to discard things Who does the reorganizing? Is there too much Hospitality stuff?

Programs: Fandango workshop not well signed up for at this point

Last year there were conflicting dates for workshops. Workshops lead to UFOs

Are people tired of having the same presenter?

Complaints that Norma Stark does not share enough qults. Thoughts of reaching out to other guilds to keep costs lower for speakers & workshops.
