

Outgoing and incoming Board members present: Cheryl Cawley, Theresa Nielsen, Laurie Johnson, Sharon Cratsenburg, Jeanne Flynn, Janeen Sharpe, Jean Schlegelmann, Martha Nordquist, Donna Griffith, Laura Ball Carey, Terry Paduska, Chris Schulte and Laurie Johnson. Absent: Barb Lusk, Sally Carl and Louise McCormick Glazier

Meeting called to order 7:05 pm by incoming president Cheryl Cawley. Spent time reviewing the positions of the executive board. Positions are elected and can be held for 2 years. The executive committee members may serve a total of 4 consecutive years in various board positions before needing to take a year off.

Outgoing Treasurer Report- Janeen Sharpe. Current account at "OUR Credit Union". Transactions can be made at many credit unions if that credit union is not a convenient location. PO Box price is increasing. Currently \$175/year. PO Box keys are to be kept by the corresponding secretary and the president. Treasurer keeps passwords to the credit union account. Must be kept UTD. End of the year treasurers's reports are outstanding as the accounts must be balanced by the end of the fiscal year and there are outstanding items.

New president, new treasurer and new assistant treasurer need to visit the credit union with a copy of the minutes listing the new Board members. Their names need to replace outgoing president, treasurer and assistant treasurer on CAMEO's account. Signatures on the minutes are needed, per Cheryl Cawley.

Go Daddy- Janeen Sharpe is website administrator. Currently \$346/3 years. May be negotiated for a better price. Domain name expires in 2028 and will be an added expense. Insurance is more expensive this year. Credit card expires September 2025. No on can spend more than \$750 without prior approval of the Board.

Quilt Show made approximately \$10,000

Board Meetings Held by zoom generally the Thursday after the general meeting. Janeen Sharpe currently maintains the zoom account, but Cheryl Cawley offered to manage the Board meetings. No time limit to meetings. Members at large are responsible for talking to members, especially new members and visitors. They should field complaints and bring member ideas to the board. Each Board member is also a liaison to different committees.

Our workshops need better advertising. Facebook. Start advertising months ahead. Most speakers need 30 day cancellation.
