Sharon also described the copyright renewal process for our CAMEO logo. It would cost about \$1,000 to renew for another five years. This includes the legal costs and fees. She researched renewing the logo without legal help, but was advised that was problematic. After members discussed the pros and cons, the concensus was that if the copyright protection lapsed and another group appropriated the logo (which does not included the guild name), we could always design another logo. Dawn Mayers put forth a motion to let the copyright lapse; it was seconded by Loreen Garrison and Cheryl Cawley. A vote by the membership passed 30 in favor of lapsing with 1 against.

CAMEO November Board Meeting December 3, 2024

Zoom 7pm

President Barb Lusk led the meeting attended by all Board members.

Treasurer Janeen Sharpe reported the totals in the treasury after the Quilt Show expenses had been made. Raffle tickets and license ordered; hanger deposit made.

The December Pot Luck includes a gift exchange (\$10 limit) and game organized by Maggie Smith. Meeting will start at 6:30pm. Sharon Cratsenburg will contact the church about the table set-up.

January, February and March 2025 meetings will have demonstrations of various piecing techiniques.

Barb Lusk suggested that we use Zoom to have Sunday afternoon "sew-ins", maybe twice a month. She will ask the membership at the December meeting if anyone would participate.

VP Scheduler Theresa Nielsen has two ideas for next year. (1) A quilters' discussion panel and (2) Tye-Dye Quilts.

Janeen Sharpe had a question about the UFO Challenge. Charity quilts are counted in the each participant's total per Cheryl Cawley, in order to get more help with Charity.

Quilt Show - Sharon Cratsenburg: License obtained and 3,000 raffle tickets ordered. [We need to refer to it as a "donation" or "auction" quilt as the church does not condone gambling.]

The vendor letter needs to be rewritten.

Vendor pricing: Single: \$150 at 8' by 18'

Double: \$300 at 8' by 36'

One half spot available at 8' by 9' \$80

7 single spots would cover the cost of renting the church. Sharon is using Oakland's layout for vendor space. She is hoping for 9-10 vendors.

VP Facilitator Cheryl Cawley has cancelled the April 2025 workshop by Janet Steele (no contract was signed). It is too close to the Quilt Show and the Spring Retreat.

March is a Saturday Sewing day for National Quilting Day which we can use to finish quilts for the show.

Meeting adjourned at 8:01pm.
