

HANDCRAFTED FAIR REPORT

Six of our members participated in Troy Historic Village's Handcrafted: Trades and Crafts Fair. Thank you for volunteering!

Cheryl Cawley, Terry Poduska, Louise Glazier, Rosemary Spatafora, Jean Schlegelmann and Jean's friend Claudia, (from the Troy Community Center Quilting Group) volunteered to demonstrate. English Paper Piecing, hand quilting and hand binding of Honor Flight quilts were demonstrated. Display items included a completed hexagon quilt, a baby quilt, an example of our Christmas gift bags for Haven, as well as examples of both hand and machine quilting. Also available were our CAMEO 2025-2026 meeting/event calendar and a sheet for visitors to sign up for more information on Membership, Spring Retreat, Workshops and children's sewing/quilting classes. We were located indoors, in Caswell House, and there was electricity available had we wanted to bring a sewing machine. We had a number of visitors throughout the day and three people provided their email.

Other crafters included a "Quilt Rescuer" who had several examples of works in progress she had collected from antique stores, and research she had done on feedsack fabrics. Another artisan brought examples of wool spinning, weaving (& looms) and quilts she had finished on her own longarm machine. A calligraphy artist who teaches calligraphy, makes cards and teaches Tai Chi attended, as well as a crochet artist, a custom boot maker, a wooden bucket maker and several wood workers also participated. It was a beautiful and mild day with plenty of visitors. We hope to take part in this event in the future and hope several more people heard about the existence of our quilt guild.

CHANDLIER BLOCK 2025 CAMEO EXCHANGE BLOCK

8 ½" Unfinished. Make a total of 35. Due at the December Meeting. Coordinated by Chris Schulte

2.5" x 2.5"

This diagram is not actual size

7 different Spring Colors, a fat quarter of each. Should read one color in batiks, mottled, or very small print that doesn't call attention to itself.

The background is white on white. Please, **NO** off-white. Can use the same white for all blocks but not necessary. Will need approx. 1-1/4 yards.

Make 5 blocks in each colorway. (7 colors \times 5 each = 35 blocks).

Color patches: cut one 4 1/2" square and two 2 ½" squares.

White: cut two 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles and two 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles.

You should have 7 stacks of 5 blocks each. 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished Pin together 1 block from each colorway, to end up with 5 pinned groups of 7 different color blocks and your name.

Bring your bag of blocks to the December meeting or turn your bag in to Chris Schulte at an earlier meeting.

Quilt Show: Sharon Cratsenburg asked if we wanted another show in a two-year cycle? Consensus is that our show was crowded and we need to limit the size and number of quilts next time.

37 people are currently enrolled in the guild including 3 new members: Debby Johnson, Becky Stange and Mary Pelitier. Two guests included Marlene Klebba and Linda Campbell. Both found CAMEO by "googling" the internet.

Fall 2025 Retreat: 18 people have signed up; we need 25 to hold the event. (No checks have been deposited.) Alternate solution would be to use Birmingham First United Methodist Church as a "day retreat" option. Chris Schulte is an employee and can get us a discounted price. \$100 per day plus a janitor's fee of \$100, totalling \$300. There was great interest from the membership; Chris will lock in the dates. Cost per person would depend upon the number of people attending.

Spring 2026 Retreat: Bear Lake April 9-12. Fall 2026 Retreat: Bear Lake Sept. 24-27.

Treasurer's Report: Martha Nordquist reported on CAMEO's accounts.

Audit Report: Carole Gilbert, Darlene Baer and Donna Griffin performed the yearly Audit. They found the books to be "true and accurate". Carole stated it was helpful to have the former Treasurer present to answer questions.

Charity Committee: Linda Wallace listed and described the charities that CAMEO supports:

HAVEN - for domestic abuse victims. Collected in November for Christmas. Sewn gift bags filled with toiletries and small items; each labelled for women, toddlers, girls or boys.

LAYETTE PROGRAM - Clawson United Methodist Church. April collection of newborn items. Church distributes boxes for Mother's Day.

OAKLAND CHILDREN'S SERVICES - foster care; pillowcases and quilts ditributed through the year. ROYAL OAK ASSISTED LIVING - Senior facility. With the help of LaVonne Ogilvy who distributes quilts to the residents throughout the year.

MICHIGAN HONOR FLIGHT - Veteran's themed quilts, 36" x 36". Charity has about 25 kits cut; Linda showed examples of layouts. Finished quilt due back to Charity in April.

Linda Wallace asked if there would be interest in **Sunday Zoom Sew-Alongs**. Guild members were interested, so Cheryl Cawley will email a link to membership to start that again. **Linda Wallace announced this is her last year chairing the Charity Committee.**
