

FROZEN BLUEBERRY DESSERT

- 1 Cup sifted flour
- 1/4 C brown sugar
- 1/2 C butter or margarine
- pinch salt

Blend above ingredients with pastry blender. Stir in 1/2


C chopped pecans or walnuts. Crumble in 9" square pan. Bake 15-20 minutes at 350*. Stir on and off to dry out. Save 1/2 C for topping. Press remaining in pan.

- Filling:
- 8 oz. cream cheese
 - 1/2 C sugar
 - 1 C whipped cream
 - Blueberry pie filling

Beat together cream cheese and sugar. Fold in whipped cream. Spread over crumb mixture. Spread 1 C blueberry pie filling over cream mixture and top with remaining crumb mixture. Freeze.

Double recipe if using 9x13 pan.
To serve, place pan in sink of hot water for 1/2 minute or so.

MICHIGAN STATE UNIVERSITY FIELD TRIP

On Saturday, June 2nd, about 15 of us, including two sisters of CAMEO members, gathered at the Michigan State University Museum for an after hours, behind the scenes look at (of course) the quilt collection.

Beth Donaldson, quilter and author who works at the museum, did the presentation for us. She showed us ten large quilts, focusing on quilts made in and about Michigan, and Redwork embroidered quilts.

My personal favorite was a "mosaic" applique quilt, although the redwork embroideries and appliques of animals came a close second. There was also a quilt about the Detroit Tigers, designed and sewn by a Detroit fireman. Beth talked about the history of the individual quilts and related it to the history of Michigan. We also talked about quilts made by Native Americans.

Beth then showed us how the quilts in the collection are stored: wrapped around giant rollers so they will be supported and not get creases; the rollers were hung on racks in giant cupboards covered in a special breathable clear material in a temperature and humidity controlled room. We got to peek at many of the other quilts on their rollers, a tantalizing experience.

Most of us continued on to the Country Stitches quilt shop, which had lots of beautiful fabrics and a huge array of various brands of sewing machines.

CAMEO LIBRARY BOOK AUCTION

A vote was taken during the June Annual Meeting to dissolve the CAMEO Library. There is a Bylaw change to reflect this.

After the June, 2018 Annual Meeting, the Board has decided to dispense of the library books by having a silent auction. This has been done in the past to reduce the size of the library. We will have two auctions over the year, the first in September.

At the September meeting we will have half of the books set out around the room, with a card attached to each offering. Bidding will start at \$1 (author signed copies will start at \$5) and go up in dollar increments. You can bid as often as you want. Bidding will be closed before Show & Tell. The item will go to the person making the highest bid. The book can then be paid for, and you will take ownership at that time.

Another silent auction will be held for the remaining library inventory later in the year.

General Meeting - June 21, 2018
Clawson United Methodist Church

Meeting opened at 7:05 by Cindy May, President, with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Karla Sutton moved to accept last month's minutes. Lynda Draudt seconded. Sharon Cratsenburg asked to correct the minutes by changing "Susan Cratsenburg" to "Sharon Cratsenburg." Motion passed and the minutes were accepted.

Election ballots were distributed to all members and nominees for next year's board were introduced to the membership. Ballots were completed and turned in before dinner.

Officer and Committee Reports:

Pat Baldauf, Treasurer, reported the balances of financial accounts.

Carole Gilbert reported for Membership that 21 members handed in 2018-19 membership forms at this meeting. Nine forms were received in the mail.

Barb Lusk reported as liaison to the Audit Committee that the books will close on June 30, and the committee will meet with the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer by the end of July. Committee is: Jackie Considine, Cathy Mentkowski, Pat Pillot, and Rosemary Spatafora.

Cindy May (on behalf of Loreen Garrison, liaison to the Education Committee) informed members of a discussion at the May board meeting regarding the library. Currently there are 5 bins full of books taking up space in the storage closet, but they are seldom used. Tina Rink moved that the library be disbanded and the by-laws be changed by deleting "inventory of library/resource materials" in Article VII Standing and Special Committees 1.D.5.:

Article VII - Standing and Special Committees

Section 1. Standing Committees

- D. The Standing Committees shall be: Audit, Charity, Fund-Raising, Hospitality, Education, Membership, Communications, Nominations and Elections, Programs, and Property.
5. The Education Committee shall be responsible for inventory of all library/resource materials, sharing educational information and displays or sponsoring field trips.

Linda Watkins seconded, and discussion followed about what to do with the books. Many suggestions were made: sell the books to members, put the books on "Fabulous Finds" table, sell the books at the next quilt show, give the books away as door prizes, pass out the books at next year's first meeting, etc. The motion to disband the library and change the by-laws was passed by a majority vote. There will be a survey at the September meeting to find out what the members want to do with the books.

Sandy Peiss presented the results of the election. Next year's board is:

Some members thought this unreasonable, and the cost of printing the Membership booklet was also discussed. It was decided that next year's board can change the decision to charge members for mailing the *Silhouette*.

For Scheduling, the April speaker will be Mickey Dupre.

The President's quilt was presented to Cindy May by Barb Lusk and Cathy Mentkowski.

Theresa Neilson passed out prizes and gifts from raffle tickets, and Carole Gilbert gave out the Last Chance prize. Show and Tell followed.

Meeting adjourned at 9:25.

CAMEO Board Meeting Minutes**June 28, 2018**

Meeting of combined boards was called to order at 7:30 pm by Cindy May at her home. Present were Cindy May, Sharon Cratsenburg, Loreen Garrison, Ann Bonnell, Karla Sutton, Pat Baldauf, Barbara Lusk, Cheryl Cawley, Kathy Wilson, Darlene Baer and Judy Murray

President Cindy reminded Board members who were liaisons to committees that all manuals must be turned in, she also distributed manuals to new incoming Board members

Pat Baldauf and outgoing Assistant Treasurer, Cheryl Cawley will meet on Monday for a pre-audit meeting. Cindy and Sharon will meet with them before July 15, and the books will be closed out by the end of July. Then the audit committee, Pat Pillot, Cathy Mentkowski, Rosemary Spatafora, Jackie Considine will meet.

Membership 37 renewals have been received already.

Loreen Garrison. Reported that Mickie Dupre can do two half day workshops if we want on Saturday, April 27th. The morning one is, "Hand Sewing" the Board chose "Whirligig" for the afternoon one, there will be a 30 day cancellation option for this one if there are not enough registrants.

Library. After the Membership voted to disband the Library at the June Meeting, Cindy located the records from two silent auctions of Library books that had been held in the past, one in 2007 when 27 books were sold and the other, date unknown, sold 54! The Board voted to sell off library in the same way, half at the September meeting and the rest probably in November. Bidding will begin at \$5 for autographed books and all others at \$1. Increments of \$1 for all books. Education Committee will handle sale.

Turnover to New Board. Some 2017-2018 board members left.

Incoming President Sharon Cratsenburg had 2018-2019 Board introduce themselves. A list of Board Meetings was circulated for Members to sign up to host. Meetings are usually the Thursday after the Guild meeting, the first meeting will be in August, date to be determined and November's will be Tuesday, November 20.

Membership books will be printed in usual way with updates electronically. Newsletter will be mailed only to those without email. There will be no additional cost. They will be mailed as soon as possible but it takes time for them to be taken to printers/copiers and then mailed, do not look for them within a day or two of them going out electronically.

Sharon will begin working on the Committees immediately, if you want your first choice get your Membership form in immediately. Each Committee Chair is asked to send a report for each month's Newsletter. The Member-at-Large is asked to check that this is being done by their Committees. The role of Members at Large as Liaison to Committees was outlined and any special requests for particular Committees should go to Sharon ASAP.

Retreat Dates not confirmed yet, looking at the beginning of May.

25th Anniversary Quilt Show 2020. Madison Place has been contacted to see availability but no dates chosen yet.

Hospitality Entrance on the side of the Church has worked out well and will continue. Sharon and Barb have keys to the Church. Barb Lusk will check whether we could use the Church's small coffee pot. She is hosting a quilt show fund raiser for the church October 5-6.

Treasurer Finances for this year's retreat have not been closed yet. Budgets not set yet. Barb, Pat and Sharon will get together to get names on bank account.

Board provides treats for September meeting

Meeting adjourned 9:10 pm.
