When you put your squares on the table, **lay them down in separate piles** only because it was a bit confusing last month. You could even put your name on a paper so we know who is who.





JOHN PUTNAM LECTURE – NOVEMBER 2018**Jan Recinos**


"Embrace the pucker!" says John Putnam, the CAMEO speaker in November. He's not one to listen to the quilt police, he says. In his career, John has made more than 300 quilts, which he defines as anything with a top, batting and a bottom. One of the interesting things he does is catalogue his projects. As soon as he pulls the fabrics and has a pattern in mind, he puts them in a bag and adds them to his list. Currently, he says he has almost 40 projects started. A lesson he has learned over his quilting career, is that it is less expensive to buy a kit than to buy the fabrics to make a quilt from a pattern. That being said, he believes his stash to have around 3000 fabrics. He knows because at one point he counted it!




Sew $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ dark(1) to $4\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ background(2) to $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ dark(3)



Sew $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ dark(1) to $4\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ backg(2) to $2\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ dark(3)



Sew 2) $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ backg to $2\frac{1}{2} \times 8\frac{1}{2}$ dark make 3



Sew $2\frac{1}{2} \times 2\frac{1}{2}$ dark to $2\frac{1}{2} \times 6\frac{1}{2}$ backg




Mystery Quilt Clue for November continued

Sew 2) 2 1/2 x 2 1/2 dark to 2 1/2 x 4 1/2 backg




Sew A to top of AA

Join J to O with 1 inch strip backg and O to Y with 1 in backg strip


Sew 1 in strip across bottom of joy

Sew 2 rows together

VP Facilitator Cheryl Cawley reminded us of Open Sew on Saturday, November 17 and of the pot-luck December 20.

Meeting was held at the home of Ann Bonnelli. President Sharon Cratsenburg called the meeting to order at 7:05pm. Present were Kathy Debien , Jan Recinos, Lynda Draudt, Ann Bonnelli, Kathy Wilson, Judy Murray, Darlene Baer, Karla Sutton, Jean Schlegelmann and Linda Watkins, Absent Pat Baldauf, Cheryl Cawley and Barbara Lusk.

There was a correction to the October minutes, Kathy Debien is Corresponding Secretary not Member-at-Large, as stated. October minutes, as corrected, were approved, signed, dated and placed on file.

President. Sharon Cratsenburg. In the absence of any volunteers to chair the 2020 Quilt Show, Sharon Cratsenburg and Linda Watkins have agreed to co-chair again. The possible dates were discussed and Sharon will check whether the hall is available May 14 & 15 2020.

Linda Watkins reviewed the loss of income from the last quilt show compared to the previous two. Attendance was down, the number of vendors were down and most notably, the raffle quilt was down more than \$1000. The raffle quilt needs to get started right away. Suggestions were discussed and a Thirties Sampler Quilt submitted by Karla Sutton and Jean Schlegelmann was selected. Linda will seek permission from the designer to use her design.

President. Sharon Cratsenburg had received a letter intimating that we needed to update/re-register our Cameo Trademark. The five-year term is almost up. However, there was some concern that it was not from an authorized company. Sharon will research it more.

Retreat There are 17 people signed up for the retreat, April 11-14, 2019 at Colombiere.

VP Membership. Lynda Draudt had intended to put names and addresses of new members in the Newsletter and then email a new directory out every few months but this cannot be done because the Newsletter goes onto the Web and people do not want that information out there. Linda will email an updated membership list whenever there are new members. Linda will organize a new members tea in the new year. The make-up of committees was discussed. How to get people on different committees and not the same people dominating the same committee every year, yet recognizing the value of having people that are familiar with how a particular committee works. No solutions were found but we are asked to continue thinking about this.

VP Scheduler. Jan Recinos reported on several speakers that she had contacted. The ideas and budgets were reviewed. People interested in the Henry Ford excursion should sign up, February 15 at 3pm. Discussed the possibility of having the tour earlier in the day.

Meeting adjourned 9pm.
