

HAM ROLL-UPS

submitted by Carole Gilbert 1 can cream of celery soup

- 1 c. sour cream
- 1 or 2 T. Dijon mustard
- 1 c. UNCOOKED Minute Rice
- 1 10 pkg frozen broccoli or spinach, thawed and drained
- 1 c. small curd cottage cheese 2 eags
- ½ c. finely chopped onion (I use dehydrated or onion powder)
- 1/4 c. flour
- 18-20 slices sliced deli ham (not too thick or thin)
- 34 c. Pepperidge Farm stuffing or bread crumbs
- 1/4 c. melted butter

Mix soup/sour cream/mustard. Reserve half for later. Add rice, veggie, cottage cheese, onion, flour to half the soup mixture. Mix well.

Place about 2 T of mixture on ham slice and roll into a log. Place seam down in greased baking dish. Repeat until all meat has been used. Pour remaining sauce over the rolls. Combine stuffing mix (or bread crumbs) with melted butter and sprinkle over the top. Cover.

Bake 350 for 45 minutes. Remove cover last 10 minutes.

This freezes well before baking. Can also use sliced turkey.

January 23, 2020

Meeting was held at Clawson United Methodist Church, with Linda Griffin hosting. President Sharon Cratsenburg called the meeting to order at 7:15 pm. Present were: Darlene Baer, Pat Baldauf, Ann Bonnelli, Jackie Considine, Kathy Debien, Linda Griffin, Laurie Johnson, Judy Murray, Jan Recinos and Jean Schlegelmann.

President Sharon Cratsenburg November Board Meeting Minutes were approved.

Quilt Show Sharon Cratsenburg

Ken McCormick, for previous Quilt Shows, has made a video of the show and all the quilts on display. He is willing to do this for this twenty-fifth anniversary Quilt Show. Each video would cost \$24. Is there enough people interested in purchasing this video?

Sharon sent out 36 letters to prospective vendors, we have 17 vendor spots available. A deposit is needed to secure your place.

Next priority, after paying the deposit and signing the contract for Madison Place, is to sell ads for the program book.

Miracle Quilts are going to be featured throughout the show in addition, Linda Wallace would like to have a special presentation on Saturday.

VP Facilitator Jan Recinos. Our last speaker, Nancy Kloster was very well received. She is teaching classes locally for the next few months, Jan has her schedule. Plans for February's Whistle Stop are proceeding. Jan discussed whether we could have vendors/quilt shops for the Whistle Stop demonstrations. We can and have had them at previous Whistle Stops, there is no costs involved; we do not pay them to do a demo and they do not pay Cameo for the table. They sell their items if they wish. Some suggestions for this coming program was scissor sharpening, quilt sleeves, special rulers such as the Flying Geese Ruler.

VP Programs Jean Schlegelmann. Penny Sempert is scheduled for October, Deb Hyde for lecture in November and workshop the following March. Ideas Jean is working on a member trunk show in January, Whistle Stop February, a Research Team in March and a Laura Heine style lecture/workshop for April; problem there, is that the person she was hoping to get is not doing programs outside her immediate area anymore. Please send ideas and suggestions to Jean.

Treasurer Jackie Considine presented the Treasurers Report.

VP Membership Laurie Johnson. We need new members! Would a survey from current members finding out what they want from the Guild help recruit new members? Maybe we need to shadow new members more closely to be sure they feel included and that the Guild is meeting their expectations. Should we introduce new guests and ask where they heard of us? Should the Membership dues be increased? Guest fees have been reduced to \$5. It would be good to have "Quilting With Confidence" for 2021 organized so we could advertise it at the Quilt Show.

Member-at-Large Darlene Baer. Selling of Raffle tickets at shows and quilt guilds is progressing but slowly. There are lots of tickets to sell. We need more venues and more volunteers.
