She appliqued over quilts with symmetrical onlays of fabric and embellishments. On YouTube there are a couple of videos of an exhibition of her quilts from 2013 at the Texas AQS show with Alex Anderson and Mrs. Lehman's sisters. They name several groups of the quilts in the show for periods of Mrs. Lehman's life.

The next bookclub meeting will be Monday, January 11, at 7:00 p.m. Anyone who would like to participate joins via ZOOM. We would like to discuss the techniques and inspirations of Ricky Tims. If you got to meet him or take a class from him, please share your memories. # QUILT SUPPLIES AVAILABLE AT THE DOLLAR STORES

#### Tools:

Scissors, cookie cutters (for applique shapes), garden gloves, thin flexible cutting b oards (used a sapplique templates), painter tape, lint roller, pot holder (used as a mini iron cloth), tooth picks, make up brushes (clean out lint), tweezers, sand paper fine gauge (applique) pool noodles (rolling quilts), spray starch, rubber shelf liner (hold foot pedal in place), craft and glue stick, safety pins, binder clips, adhesive hooks, paper clips.

#### Organization:

Shower caddy (thread holder), jars (buttons), hardware organizers, napkin holders (for rulers), badge holder (clip small scissors) storage boxes, zip lock bags, elastic hair bands (wrap around bobbins),

#### Design:

Crayons, graph paper, colored pencils, bandanas, buttons, notebooks, beads, yarn, ribbon, flannel table cloths or fleece baby blanket (for design walls)

# CAMEO Guild Meetings Minutes December 17, 2020 Zoom Meeting at 7 pm

**President Sharon Cratsenburg** called the meeting to order at 7.10pm. Twenty four members participated at various times.

The November Minutes were approved and placed on file.

Laurie Johnson reported that we have 45 members which includes 6 associate members.

**Jean Schlegelmann.** January meeting, "Introduce members to your favorite quilting tool or notion" Tell or demonstrate how you use it and why you like it. Sign up with Jean in advance and if you have any photos of the tool or things you have made with it email them to Henya Rachmiel.

Jean wondered if Members would be interested in a seasonal Block of the Month for 12 months. There would be a monthly theme and people would interpret in their own way and show on zoom each month.

Also, if they would be interested in creating a Cameo calendar, each months photo displaying a finished quilt, the calendars could then be sold as a fund raiser. Laurie volunteered to organize photos to prepare for printing.

**Jackie Considine** presented the Treasurers Report. It was approved and filed. The budget will be voted on at the January meeting, every segment has a reduced budget. Question, how much the raffle quilts raised. There is a separate budget for Quilt Show, the raffle total will be put in the minutes.

**Sharon Cratsenburg.** Quilt Show is still booked for Spring but no vendors have been approached. Time would be short, discussed postponing until Fall, Sharon will see what dates the hall would have available. Question how we will be able to sell raffle tickets and whether we should have one quilt raffled and not two. Spring retreat is still in limbo.

Need to check with Linda whether Clawson United Methodist Church will still be collecting for their layettes.

**Jan Recinos.** Reported on Cameo Quiltmaker's Book Club. Zoom meeting discussion of the works of Libby Lehman, six members participated. The next meeting will be January 11 where the works of Ricky Tims will be discussed.

**Henya Rachmiel** presented a slide show of Mug-rugs that had been made. It seemed quite successful and she proposed that we do something similar for Valentine's Day. She then showed the few items that had been sent in for Show and Tell

Short discussion on how to handle prizes for Slip of Keyboard. All winners from last month's Bingo had received their gift cards in the mail.

Jan Recinos led a demonstration making a no-sew ornament as taken from the video by Jennifer Bosworth of Shabby Fabrics.

Meeting adjourned at 8.25pm.
