

Charity Linda Wallace



You probably noticed that you received two different membership renewal forms. On the first form, "Charity Day Committee" had been eliminated. Upon my request, it was put back on the renewal form. In the past few years, I have realized that guild members are not aware that these are two separate committees.

Charity Committee – The Charity Committee researches and recommends Charitable organizations to receive our donations. We make kits for members to work on either at home or on Charity Day. At each meeting, the Charity table is open for all members who want to take a kit home. We bring in items purchased for Haven or the Layette program and also quilt tops or completed quilts. We then deliver to the organization.

Charity Day Committee – The Saturday after the February meeting is Charity Day. The Charity Day Committee is responsible for the set-up and planning for Charity Day. This includes arriving early to assemble tables, making sure electrical cords are out, ironing station set-up, and cutting stations. They also collectively provide a luncheon for the members who come to work for Charity. While the Charity Chairperson is in attendance to ensure that there are enough kits to keep everyone busy, the Charity Day Committee members handle the logistics of making the day run smoothly.

Charity is very important to our guild. The work we do and donations we make to the various charitable organizations are reported to the IRS. That is what keeps our Non-Profit status. A couple of years ago, Carol Herzberg spent close to a year cutting fabric for children's pillowcases. On Charity Day we made over 60 pillowcases and the rest were taken home to finish and returned. At the end of the year, we gave Smiles for Ryan 120 pillowcases. This gave us a tax credit of \$1,200 just from one of four organizations to which we made donations.

I want to thank the Charity Committee members who stepped up to help on Charity Day 2023. If it were not for you, we would not have had another successful day. I do appreciate all the support I receive from my committee. Thank You!
