We have six people signed up to bring a main dish, eight people signed up to bring a salad, six


people are bringing desserts, and five people are bringing drinks and miscellaneous items. We will have coffee available. Please bring your own plate, cup and silverware.

We want to thank everyone for

helping Charity this year. For a small group, we can be very proud of the amount of donations. The total value of our donations was approximately \$9,700.00. Our donations went to the Layette Program at First United Methodist Church, Haven, Orchard Children's Services, Royal Oak Assisted Living, and Mid-Michigan Honor Flight. It seems like a lot. The donations to Haven have markedly dropped in the past couple of years. We went from 75+ gift bags to 34. We are considering not donating to Haven next year. Feel free to let me or Jean know your viewpoint on this.

We want to keep the Layette donations. The nice thing about this one is if you do not want to make something, you can buy it.

I recently delivered the Honor Flight quilts. When I was first approached about this, my goal was to make 30 quilts. I am very happy to tell you that I gave them 40 quilts. Mid-Michigan Honor Flight take WWII, Korean, and Viet Nam Vets to Washington DC. Upon their return, the vets are given their quilts. What they do is ask the WWII and Korean Vets to disembark first and give them their quilts. Then they ask the Viet Nam Vets to exit last. They are awarded a guilt and a 50-year pin. For those of us who remember this war also remember that these soldiers came back unappreciated. The reason the Vietnam Vets were asked to leave the plane last is to give them special recognition.

Would you be willing to do 50 quilts for Mid-Michigan Honor Flight next year? We are looking into having a sewing session on Saturday September 21 with the intent to work on the Honor Flight quilts.


